WATER SAMPLING ON WABAMUN LAKE

Submitted by Wabamun Watershed Management Council

On August 13, 2019, volunteers from the Wabamun Watershed Management Council (WWMC) will assist the Alberta Lake Management Society (ALMS) in taking water samples from several locations around Wabamun Lake. This will be the third such sampling done on the lake this summer in an

effort to establish a baseline of information about Wabamun's water quality. This information will be used to compare with later studies in an effort to understand how the lake is changing over time as a result of climate change, development, etc.

The sampling will begin at 9:00 a.m. on August 13. WWMC is providing ALMS with a boat and assistants. Further boats can be provided to assist news media wishing images on the lake if

A MESSAGE FROM MLA MARK SMITH: A BUSY SUMMER

It has been a busy summer, I've been meeting with constituents and trying to ensure that the Government of Alberta is actually working for the people of Alberta in the Drayton Valley-Devon constituency.

On August 7, 2019 the Minister of Agriculture and myself met

providing feedback for the Farm Freedom and Safety Act that will be tabled in the Legislature in the fall. Approximately 60+ people attended the consultation providing feedback on how to best address farm safety and OHS legislation etc. that were creating problems for farmers as a result of the passage of Bill 6 by the previous government. It was a productive morning and I think most people that attended were happy to meet the Minister and see that his farming background brings a great deal of common sense to the issues that farmers are facing.

Recently, the Ministry of Health announced that they are beginning a review of Alberta Health Services. The goal is simple: to strengthen the health system and

with farmers from across the con-

stituency as we worked through

deliver better access and better results overall. With the government fast approaching a \$60 Billion dollar debt and having campaigned on fiscal responsibility this review will include:

- · An examination of AHS' structure and organization.
- Evaluation of AHS programs, services and policies to identify potential areas to reduce costs and improve performance.
- Identification of opportunities to make AHS operation more responsive to the front-lines and Albertans.
- · Compare Alberta to other provinces and their best practices.

It is hoped that this review will find efficiencies to save money and it is the intention of the government that these savings will be reinvested into the health care system. You can become involved

Ernst and Young have been hired to gather the perspectives of front line workers and this too will be built into the report. The final report will be sent to the government by Dec. 31, 2019 and the results will be shared in early 2020.

REVITALIZING MUNICIPALITIES ACROSS ALBERTA

Submitted by Government of Alberta

The Municipal Government (Property Tax Incentives) Amendment Act would revitalize municipalities by empowering them to offer stronger property tax incentives to business and industry.

If passed, Bill 7 would allow municipalities to provide property tax incentives for up to 15 years, down from the year-to-year incentives they were allowed to provide previously.

"This legislation would empower municipalities to attract investment, create jobs and realize their full economic potential. Municipalities deserve the freedom and opportunity to make the choices that fit them best. I look forward to seeing this legislation bolster investment and economic development across our great province." - Kaycee Madu, Minister of Municipal Affairs

Under the proposed legislation, municipalities could decide how and if they want to implement property tax incentives – as local leaders are best suited to assess the economic needs of their communities.

"We are pleased the province is giving municipalities the ability to be creative in attracting new investments, and that they recognize there is a role for municipalities to play in creating a favourable environment for business and industry. Such incentives are tools that can lay the foundation to create jobs and contribute to the long-term growth and prosperity of communities across Alberta." - Rod Frank, mayor, Strathcona County

The proposed bill supports government efforts to reduce red tape and uses an outcome-based approach to ensure regulatory processes are necessary, effective, efficient and proportional to the outcomes they are trying to

achieve.

"As a developer of commercial, industrial and residential land, I know how important it is for municipalities to offer a business-friendly environment. This new legislation provides some much-needed flexibility for municipalities to be able to work with business to encourage growth that will benefit the entire community." - Patrick Shaver, president, Avillia Developments

- Municipalities could provide property tax incentives for up to 15 years.
- This would give Alberta a competitive advantage over jurisdictions across Canada and the United States
- Saskatchewan allows property tax incentives for up to five years; B.C. allows them for up to 10.
- Texas enables local tax incentives for up to 10 years.
- Louisiana offers five-year incentives with an option to renew for an additional five years.

A FEW NOTES ABOUT LAKEWELL 4-H MULTI CLUB

Alberta 4-H has been around since 1917 and Lakewell 4-H Multi, the longstanding local club, was dormant for some time until re-activated in 2016 with the help and support of the Darwell Ag Society.

Members are between the ages of 9-20 and we also welcome younger folks – Cleavers are aged 6-8; I think of them as like little brothers and sisters, learning from their siblings but not really being responsible for all the chores. 4-H offers the chance to learn Leadership, Community, Friendship, Communication, Responsibility and Commitment but we also try to put as much fun in there as we can. The 4-H Mission is to develop youth as self-reliant, contributing individuals with marketable skills.

There are five requirements for members to complete their year - they must participate in a Communications Activity as well as a Community Service activity, complete a Project by handing in a Record Book, attend 70% of all club activities and attend the year end Achievement Day. Pretty simple, right? And 4-H offers so much! Members will have the opportunity to attend camps, to apply for Awards and Scholarships, to win trips and perhaps go on exchanges with another club in a different part of the country. And putting 4-H experience on a resume is a great way to get the interviewer's attention!

The members and their parents take an active role in how their 4-H club evolves. Our meetings are run by both the parents and the members; in fact, the executive positions are held by members. Not only do the members have a say in how the individual projects look, they also have the opportunity to decide on things like community service, fundraising opportunities and fun days, amoung others.

Speaking of fun days: over the past three years, Lakewell members have gone to Camp Warwa and Camp YoWoChas for teambuilding days; we have been to Galaxyland, had a bowling party in Wabamun and a year-end party down by the Pembina River; there have been District Fun Days at East End Park In Whitecourt and the Curling

Rink in Mayerthorpe. Each year the Members, Cleavers, parents and leaders have the opportunity to attend the Regional Lifeskills Fair, where they can choose activities from a large diverse menu that ranges from making Wood Signs, to Line Dancing to Car mechanics and beyond.

And the projects – they are not just about animals! There are over 40 projects in the 4-H library including Foods, Sewing, Quilting, Woods, Vet Sciences, as well as the more

well-known ones such as Horse, Beef and Sheep. For the uncertain, there is a project called 'Exploring 4-H' which involves picking 6-8 project areas and exploring each one. This particular project is one I find intriguing and would like to see some members chose this year.





HOW TO HELP KIDS GET INTO GOLF

Golf is a game of skill that can take years, if not decades, to master. Many golfers find their time on the golf course both rewarding and relaxing, even on those days when the fairways seem impossible to find.

Though many players never swing a golf club until they reach adulthood, it's never too early to hit the links. Some of the world's most accomplished golfers, including four-time Masters champion Tiger Woods, began playing as toddlers, and many feel that getting an early start can lead to a more successful game down the road.

Getting kids into golf is a great way for parents to bond with their children while enjoying the great outdoors. Golf can also be used to teach kids humility, sportsmanship and the importance of hard work. Thanks to the often frustrating nature of golf, parents may find it somewhat challenging to instill a love of the game in their youngsters. But there are ways to introduce kids to this wonderful game that kids might just play for the rest of their lives.

• Focus on having fun. Few, if any, golfers at your local golf course on a given weekend could say with certainty that golf has never frustrated them. The challenge of golf may be its most appealing characteristic to older players, but young kids can be easily overwhelmed by the challenges golf presents. By focusing on having fun instead of perfecting

techniques, parents can get kids to look forward to their time on the links. The more fun kids have, the more likely they will be to embrace the game and its many challenges. Don't put pressure on youngsters as they develop their games, but encourage them through their struggles and reassure them that you faced the same obstacles when you started playing.

• Hire an instructor with experience teaching children. Instructors with experience teaching children will understand the basics of the game and how learning those basics provides a great foundation for future enjoyment and success on the course. Instructors who have

taught kids in the past also know that teaching youngsters the finer points of golf requires patience and encouragement. Ask a fellow parent or an employee at the club where you play to recommend an instructor for your child. And take advantage of any kids' courses your club offers.

• Purchase the correct equipment. Even the best golfers are bound to struggle when using the wrong equipment. While it might be unwise to invest in especially expensive equipment for youngsters likely to grow out of it in a few months' time, deals can be found on used kids' equipment. Used kids' equipment is typically

subjected to less wear and tear than used equipment for adults, as kids tend to play less often and fewer holes than adults when they do play. But make sure to find correctly sized equipment that kids feel comfortable using.

• Play some holes. Instructors may teach kids the differences between the types of clubs and how to swing and putt. But golf is most fun when players are out on the links going from hole to hole. Instruction is important, but don't forget to play a few holes with your child each week as well.

Golf is a challenging game, but it's one that can be enjoyed by athletes of all ages.







INTERNET SERVICES

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to inform constituents that the Competition Bureau's study of competition and consumer habits in Canada's high-speed Internet industry, found that many Canadians currently obtain their Internet services from traditional telephone and cable companies, and that

CRTC regulations that allow independent Internet providers to buy access to telecom companies' networks have created more choice for consumers. The Bureau also received comments from more than 42,000 Canadians through an online survey, and 20 written submissions from a variety of Internet service providers.

Of the 2,005 households surveyed:

90% report being gen-

erally satisfied with their current home Internet provider, while customers of independent providers are more likely to be very satisfied:

- 1 in 3 households that considered switching providers in the past two years actually made a switch; and
- 66% of households bundle their internet with at least one other service, but only 17% of those bundles include wireless phone services.

"More choice between providers will allow many Canadians, especially in rural areas of the Yellowhead, to choose a plan that meets their needs related to cost, network speeds and quality of service," concluded MP Eglinski.

NATIONAL STRATEGY FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise constituents that the Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness, the Honourable Ralph Goodale, announced the expansion of the National Strategy for the Protection of Children from Sexual Exploitation on the Internet.

These include:

- \$2.09M to intensify our engagement with digital industry leaders to help them maintain their focus, develop new tools online and support effective operating principles;
- \$4.9M to increase prevention activities, such as more research, public engagement, awareness and collaboration with partners;

• \$15.25M to enhance the capacity of Internet Child Exploitation Units in provincial and municipal police forces, and initiatives to inform and upgrade the work of prosecutors.

This funding will support Public Safety's (PS) efforts towards the four pillars of the National Strategy: raising awareness of this serious issue; reducing the stigma associated with reporting; increasing Canada's ability to pursue and prosecute offenders; and working together with industry to find new ways to combat the sexual exploitation of children online.

"All children deserve to feel safe, both online and offline,' concluded MP Eglinski.







