## BARRHEAD RCMP REPORT: AUGUST 1- 7, 2019

August 1 through August 7

A 39 year old Barrhead County male Is facing several charges including Assault, Mischief and Fail to Comply following a domestic violence call on August 3. Members responded to a third party complaint that the suspect was at the residence in breach of previous conditions. Upon speaking with the male's spouse it was determined that charges were appropriate. This is the fifth time this male has been charged under similar circumstances. First appearance has been set for August 13.

A 26 year ale Sturgeon County male was charged following a traffic stop on August 5. Police made a Mandatory Alcohol Screening demand upon the driver who failed to comply. The male is now facing a suspension of his driver's licence, his vehicle has been impounded and he will be attending court for criminal charges on September 10.

Three vehicles were either stolen or damaged during an attempted theft this week. A black 2005 GMC bearing Alberta licence ECM054 was stolen from a dealer's lot in Barrhead on August 1. On August 5 a brown 2014 Dodge Ram, Alberta licence SAK039, was stolen from a residence in Barrhead and on August 7 the ignition on a 2005 Ford F350 was found to have been tampered with at another dealership in Barrhead.

Theft complaints this week included a lock pried off a shed In Barrhead on August 6, nothing was stolen. Another shed was entered in Barrhead on August 2. Again, nothing was stolen however the ignition switches on two snowmobiles were damaged. These culprits left behind a scooter and a ball cap. Finally, on August 3 fuel was stolen from machinery and gas cans at a yard In the Tiger Lily area.

On August 8 members from Eastern Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit arrived in the area and began making inquiries for two Tiger Lily area males wanted for a number of offences. Inquiries eventually led the team to a property south of Stony Plain where one of the males was located and arrested following a brief foot chase. Several vehicles on the property were checked and one was determined to have been stolen, new charges are pending. Members from Parkland and Barrhead Detachments were on scene to assist

Spruce Grove, Alta. – Two break and enters occurred during the early morning hours of Saturday, Aug. 11, 2019. The first one occurred at Brookwood School at 1:44 a.m. when members responded to an alarm. Suspects gained entry to the school by damaging the door and then vandalized a classroom. RCMP members searched the school; the suspects were not located.

At 4:07 a.m., RCMP responded to a second commercial alarm at a business in the vicinity of Brookwood School. Surveillance footage showed three male youths inside the business. When RCMP arrived, the youth were no longer at the location. RCMP Police Dog Services





## ALBERTANS URGED TO BE AS SAFE AS POSSIBLE ON ATVS

EDMONTON – Summer weather brings people out to explore the backcountry, and Alberta Health Services (AHS) reminds Albertans to make all-terrain vehicle (ATV) safety a priority this week and every week.

ATVs pose significant risk to all users and particularly children under 16 years of age, who likely do not have the strength, skills or judgment needed to operate an ATV. Over a one-year period ending April 1, 2019, 78 children were seen in Alberta's two pediatric emergency departments due to ATV-related injuries; 31 required hospital admission and one died.

To protect children under 16 years of age, parents and caregivers are advised to ensure children do not drive or ride on an ATV. This includes ATVs marketed as 'child-sized.' Albertans 16 years of age and older are urged to take the following precautions to ensure their ATV excursions are as safe as possible:

• Get trained: Before you hit the trails, get formal hands-on training from a recognized/trained ATV instructor. Don't be shy about refreshing your training seasonally.

• Wear the gear: Always wear a helmet. CSA-compliant helmets must be worn by ATV users when riding on public land but a helmet worn every ride can save your life. From 2002 to 2013, 41 per cent of ATV-rider deaths in Alberta were due to head injuries. In 77 per cent of these head injury deaths, the ATV riders were not wearing a helmet. In addition to a helmet, always wear a jacket, long pants, goggles, boots and gloves.

• Look first: Be sure you're aware of the weather forecast, fire outlook/potential, and any hazards (geographical, animal or human) or risks that the trail(s) could pose. Ensure your ATV is equipped with an appropriate head lamp.

• Buckle up: Be sure you're fastened in properly and that all gear and equipment (including your ATV restraints) are in proper working condition before you hit the trails.

• Drive sober: Don't drink alcohol or do drugs before or while operating an ATV; 55 per cent of those who died in ATV crashes between 2002 and 2013 tested positive for alcohol.

• Seek help: Before you head out on the trail, let others know where you're going and when they should expect you back. This helps your loved ones know when to call for help if you've been gone too long. Take a cellphone or working radio with you, as well as a first-aid kit.



## HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR DAY ON THE COURSE

(NC) Most great golf games are filled with sun, competition and camaraderie, but you can enhance the experience with a few tips that have less to do with your swing, and a lot to do with your 18-hole enjoyment:

Dress for success: The right golf apparel can be as important as the clubs you carry. Check the weather in advance to make sure you'll be as comfortable as possible during play. Determine if you're dressing to impress or to elevate your game. Light, non-restrictive clothing will allow you to swing freely and keep you comfortable and cool in the heat, or warm if the temperature drops. If you're a guest, always check out the dress code at the club you'll be visiting to ensure you comply with the rules.

Choose your company carefully: Your playing partners can have a lot to do with how you play and how you socialize on the golf course. If you're out with friends, you can relax and enjoy the day knowing what to expect. But if it's a game with your boss or clients, always make sure to test the waters. Will they play by the rules or is it just a relaxed day? Are your clients there to play golf or do business? Understanding the landscape on the first tee will alleviate any awkward moments later on.

Create friendly competition: Sure, there's already a scorecard, but you can add more competitive fun to your game by creating a little friendly rivalry. For example, try a little Bingo Bango Bongo - a points based game that awards a total score based on three kinds of achievement: Bingo – first person on the green gets a point; Bango – the player whose ball is closest to the pin when all balls are on the green gets a point, Bongo –the player who is first to hole out gets a point. Add up the points and the person with the highest total for the round wins.

Walk it off : Make a small 'healthy' tweak to your game by walking vs. taking a cart. When you choose to walk rather than drive 18 holes, you'll cover approximately six kilometres and burn around 1,500 - 2,000 calories. Golfers that ride carts will burn only about 1,100 - 1,300 calories.








OTTAWA, Aug. 15, 2019 / CNW/ - Farmers form the backbone of rural communities across Canada. They are integral to expanding our middle-class and strengthening our economy. The Government of Canada remains committed to growing Canada's agricultural sector by ensuring all farmers have the support they need to manage significant risks that threaten the viability of their farms.

Agriculture and Agri-Food Minister Marie-Claude Bibeau announced today that crop producers impacted by recent market disruptions may now be eligible for an additional six months to repay 2018 cash advances under the Advance Payments Program (APP).

The Stay of Default, which covers advances on grains, oilseeds and pulses, will provide additional flexibility to repay advances for farmers that may be facing lower prices, reduced marketing opportunities or a decrease in farm cash income. The decision comes following recent changes made by the Government of Canada to strengthen the APP by increasing the maximum loan limit for all farmers to \$1 million and the interest-free portion to \$500,000 for canola.

The six-month Stay of Default to March 31, 2020, will provide producers with more time to repay their 2018 outstanding advances. The Stay of Default was granted at the request of nine program administrators. The Government of Canada will also continue to pay interest on the interest-free portion of farmers' outstanding advances until March 31, 2020, for those commodities.

Producers who received a 2018 APP advance from any of the nine participating administrators could be eligible for the Stay of Default and are encouraged to contact their respective administrator for more details.

Participating administrators are

the Agri-Commodity Management Association, Alberta Sugar Beet Growers, Alberta Wheat Commission, BC Breeder and Feeder Association, Canadian Canola Growers Association, Manitoba Corn Growers Association Inc., Manitoba Livestock Cash Advance Inc., Producteurs de Grains du Québec and Western Cash Advance Program Inc.

Our government is working closely with our farmers to meet their needs and is taking many concrete steps to help them deal with the current market turmoil. This Stay of Default will give them more flexibility and the room to maneuver so they can better manage their liquidity. " - The Honourable Marie-Claude

Quick Facts

• The Advance Payments Program is a financial loan guarantee program that provides producers easy access to credit through cash advances. There was over 21,000 producers who participated in the program in 2018, and the average advance was approximately \$118,000.

• For the 2018 program year, 12,902 grains, oilseed and pulse producers took more than \$1.68 billion in advances, representing a 3% increase in the number of grains, oilseed and pulse producers taking advances under the program, and a 6% increase in the value of advances taken in 2017.

• As of July 31, there has been close to 1,100 new producers who have joined the program in 2019 and there has been approximately 360 producers who have returned to the program after not participating in the last three years.
