INVENTORY REDUCTION SALE OF WILDWOOD HISTORY BOOKS

The Chip Lake Historical Society recently faced a crisis.

In 1987 the Chip Lake Historical Society created a Wildwood history book. It took until this year to sell out that volume one.

In 2005 we created a sequel. At time of publishing we obviously had to decide

on quantities to publish. If we bought 1000 books, each book would cost in the range of \$65. If we bought 2000 books the price reduced to \$35. So we chose the second option and chose to sell the books for \$50. Buying such a large quantity meant we glutted the market and have nearly 1000 books left in storage. That's over 100 boxes! For the past 14 years our vol-

umes have been in a small storage room in the Wildwood Community Hall. We have been slowly selling a few volumes, slowly dwindling those in storage. We are solvent and all books sales now are profit some of which we have been donating to community projects. We recently gave the Cadets \$1000 for a trip they were planning.

LEARN TO PROTECT YOUR RURAL PROPERTY

Join Yellowhead County on November 28, 2019 in Evansburg to find out about rural crime prevention solutions that will help you protect the things that matter most.

(November 20, 2019 - Edson, AB) Do you live in a secluded, rural area? You may not be immune to potential break-ins, property damage and theft, but you can take steps to help reduce the chances of being a victim of rural crime.

If you live on an acreage, farm, or any out-of-theway rural area, there are steps you can take to protect your home, possessions, and property. Join presenters Cor De Wit from Alberta Rural Crime Watch Association and Evansburg RCMP Staff Sergeant Brian Topham for a 2-hour information session and presentation on crime reduction tips and safety strategies for your property.

At the session, you'll learn tips based on Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED) concepts and other measures to help prevent theft of your property. The CPT-ED concept uses the idea of good property maintenance and techniques to act as a deterrent to rural crime. It also increases the perceived likelihood of detection and apprehension of potential thieves coming on to your property. These safeguards and other practical solutions will help you assess potential security risks and take action to prevent theft and other crime on your

property.

In addition to physical deterrents that will help keep you and property safe from criminal actions, you'll also learn concepts to reduce potential criminal activity when posting on social media that could assist a criminal in targeting your property.

The session is being pre-Yellowhead sented by County in partnership with the Alberta Rural Crime Watch Association and the RCMP and takes place on November 28, 2019, at 7:00 PM at the Evansburg Legion Hall. You will also have an opportunity to ask questions about how to best safeguard your property.

All has gone well, although slowly. Now we are expected to find another storage location. And that is a real problem for us as we don't have any idea where we might move. We need a place that is secure, dry and large enough to house 100 boxes. We have been selling our books for \$50, but in an effort to reduce inventory the books are now on sale for \$30.

Up to now we have had books for sale at a number of locations in Wildwood and Evansburg. Each time a book was sold, the vendor gave the money to our society. And then we donated money to our community. So we devised a plan to have the money go directly to our community. We gave a box of 8 books to 17 businesses and organizations in Wildwood and Evansburg with the expectation each could sell the books for \$30 each and keep the money for themselves. So all around our community you will see fluorescent pink signs announcing history books for sale. That is our way of reducing inventory and saying thank you to our community that so graciously supported us when we created the books in 2005.

On Sunday, November 17, YCFD crews responded to an early-morning collision on Highway 16. What was expected to be a singular accident turned out to be a multi-vehicle collision. This icy stretch of highway suddenly became fertile ground for a pile up–which even lead some vehicles to catch

ablaze.

YCFD crews arrived and assumed the standard procedure; the fire vehicle was pulled over behind the crash with lights flashing.

The crew disembarked and got to work on assisting with the emergency. It wouldn't be long before their own vehicle would be struck from behind by a passing vehicle.

Luckily, the crew was far

enough away from the vehicle and were unharmed. But the incident has left those members—and the whole of YCFD—shaken.

"An incident like this can happen in a split-second, that's why it's important for drivers to consider how they are driving, and if it's appropriate to the conditions," commented YCFD Chief Albert Bahri, "Ultimately we want to stress to all drivers: Drive to arrive."

Over the last few months I've had the chance to make it out to a number of local events, meet with constituents, town councils, county councils, stakeholders, and through several of the committees and task force groups that I have been assigned. There has been resounding support for the changes that we have made in the short time since election, as well as for our approach for engagement with Albertans.

In our constituency, we have had Premier Kenney attend the annual Pilgrimage at Lac Ste Anne, the opening of the gas line at Keephills 3, as well as to spend some time shopping at the Carvel General Store. We had the Minister of Agriculture hold a round table consultation in Mayerthorpe; Minister of Service Alberta meet with four separate round tables at three towns, and last but not least our Minister of Justice and Solicitor General, host a town hall regarding rural crime in Calahoo.

I have heard on a number of occasions of how thankful our fellow constituents are for meaningful engagement from our government, and myself as the MLA. To that end, I'm doing all that I can to ensure that I'm working on the items that matter to our area.

In recent engagement, I have heard concerns over a few private members bills that have been tabled in the house for first reading. Bill 205 is in regards to "Opt Out" organ donation, rather than the current opt in model. The second is Bill 207, which is intended for the medical community to have reinforced constitutional rights for their conscionable objection.

As an MLA within the UCP Caucus, I have "Free Vote" and am fully endorsed and supported to vote in my own conscience and more importantly, in the conscience of my constituents. As such, I am reaching out to you to share your views with me. I did so recently at a town hall meeting in Alberta Beach and will

continue to do so at outreach events throughout the constituency in the next coming weeks. I want to ensure that your voice is heard and I represent you responsibly when it comes to any of the Bills that are of such a personal nature. I'll be looking forward to receiving invitations from local community groups so that I can attend your meetings and discuss these Bills with you. I do ask that you read the Bills in its entirety, and not just the sound bites that are out there, because you deserve the full

goods to make an informed decision. You can get a copy of these Bills at my constituency office or find them at https://www.assembly.ab.ca Bills and Amendments.

I hope that you are keeping well, and taking care of your friends, families, and neighbors. We are all in this together, and are going to need to keep an eye out for each other. I'd also ask that if you are having some challenging times, know that you are not alone, and talk to someone about some of those challenges. Often all we need to do is get it out, and accept a hand from a friend when we stumble on our journey through life. Guaranteed, you would have done the same for them, or have in the past.

on whether the province should continue to observe daylight saving time.

The government is launching an online survey to gather feedback about the observation of daylight saving time in Alberta.

"We know people have strong opinions about changing their clocks twice a year, and we want to hear them. As more Canadian provinces and territories and some American states are having discussions about this, it's important that we hear from Albertans." - Nate Glubish, Service Alberta Minister

Under the Daylight Saving Time Act, Albertans set their clocks forward one hour to observe daylight saving time from the second Sunday in March until the first Sunday of November. This puts the province in the same time zone as the Northwest Territories and Montana year-round.

"The practice of changing our clocks twice a year is largely done only in western Europe and North America. Earlier this year, the EU voted to abolish seasonal time changes by 2021. In North America, we're seeing provincial and state governments table and pass legislation to do the same. It's time for Alberta to have a serious conversation about this." - Nate Glubish, Service Alberta Minister

The online survey will be open until Tuesday, Dec. 10. Albertans can visit alberta.ca/daylight-saving-time-engagement.aspx to share their opinions.

Quick facts

• In October 2019, legislation was tabled in British Columbia to move to summer hours all year.

• Legislation has also passed in Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Nevada, Oregon, Tennessee and Washington to move to summer hours permanently. However, in the United States federal approval is required to enact the change.

• In March 2019, the European Union voted to end the seasonal time change by 2021.

• Saskatchewan, Arizona and Hawaii do not change their clocks twice a year.
