Ste. Anne County Reeve Joe Blakeman officially signed this historic document on December 13, 2019. In doing so, these community leaders strengthened the collaborative potential of both communities and facilitated coordination of future development and land use policy matters. "This pro-



gressive document provides for an integrated approach to planning policy for lands surrounding the Town of Mayerthorpe," stated Mayor Jabush. "Knowing what to expect when developing or investing within the IDP area provides landowners, investors, developers, and businesses with a measure of confidence in knowing what to expect." This IDP focuses on an area surrounding the Town and addresses future land use, servicing, environment, and growth in a way that respects the interests of both the Town and the County. "This IDP represents an opportunity for both communities to embark upon a new and mutually beneficial relationship," added Reeve Blakeman. 

Whitecourt, Alberta – Whitecourt RCMP recently executed a one-day project aimed at arresting wanted persons in the Whitecourt detachment area. The project has led to 23 warrants being executed against 13 individuals by local officers thus far.

As a result of a review of warrants held by the Whitecourt RCMP, and of those wanted by other law enforcement and residing in the Whitecourt area, Whitecourt RCMP began a project to bring those people back before the courts. On December 14, 2019 a one-day event of targeted enforcement led to the arrest of ten wanted individuals. The inquiries made by police led to an additional three persons turning themselves in at the Whitecourt Detachment.

"The attempts to locate others who are wanted continues," states Cst. Alex Ayres of the Whitecourt RCMP Detachment. "Bringing those people back before the courts continues to be a priority for the detachment."




