


YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

December 10, 2019 Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework Agreement (ICF) with Brazeau County – Council gave second and third reading to Bylaw 18.19, regarding an ICF with Brazeau County. The Municipal Government Act requires neighboring municipalities to jointly draft such agreements. For more details about this joint ICF, visit the Yellowhead County website and click the CivicWeb link.

Emergency Management Bylaw – The Emergency Management Act (EMA) provides the legislative framework for local and provincial management of emergencies and disasters. It outlines the roles and responsibilities of all government entities and local authorities in the event of an emergency. On November 29, the Alberta Emergency Management Agency re-

viewed the county's emergency bylaw (Bylaw 10.19), advising that it would not meet EMA requirements when they come into force on January 1, and provided a bylaw template for the county to consider. Administration has used said template to meet the needs of this regulation. Upon administration's recommendation, council gave this bylaw (Bylaw 21.19) third reading.

Land Use Bylaw Amendment – Council gave second and third reading to Bylaw 16.19, amending Land Use Bylaw 16.13 for Plan 982 5016, Block 1, Lot 11, (Part of SW 3-54-17-W5M) from Rural District to Country Residential District and Country Residential Minor Industrial District.

Adoption of the 2020 Interim Budget - County council moved to adopt the 2020 Interim Budget. Governance and Priorities Committee meetings were held on November 19, 21, and 28, during which time council discussed the development of an interim budget. At this time, the Interim Budget sees no tax increase or addition of user fees. The total 2020 Interim Budget is \$168,338,757. The budget consists of the following:

• Capital projects: \$67,456,826

• Operations: \$44,936,269

• Requisitions: \$28,159,732

• Contributions to local government: \$11,120,180

• Contributions to reserves: \$1,257,230

• Amortization (non-cash): \$15,408,520

As the 2019 year comes to a close here are a few important updates to consider as the fall session ends and as we close out what has been a very busy 2019.

On Wednesday night, Dec 4th, the final three government bills on the order paper were passed, bringing the fall sitting of the Legislature to a close. Some interesting numbers were delivered via a news conference the following Thursday, Government House Leader Jason Nixon reported that seven months into the UCP's mandate, the government has delivered on 43 per cent of campaign commitments, an incredible total of 16 government bills were passed during the eight week fall sitting. 375 commitments were made in the UCP platform and, to date, 162 are met or underway. Only 12 per cent of the way through a 4-year mandate

in government and the UCP are on track to reverse many of the backwards and cumbersome policies implemented by the NDP.

The following is a closer look at some recent accomplishments of our government over the last month.

PISA Grades Alberta's Education System

On December 3, the Program for International Student Assessment (PISA) released its results for 2018. While we welcome Alberta's climb in global rankings, our science and reading scores declined from 2015, and math scores saw no change.

We realize that we cannot rely on global rankings when individual test scores are not improving. That is why we will continue to move forward on strengthening our education system so we can see increases in scores, in addition to climbing global ranks, in future years

Progress on Pipelines I am happy to report that on November 3, construction finally began on the Trans Mountain expansion project just outside of Edmonton. While construction is far from complete, this is a milestone worth celebrating. This past week also saw a portion of Enbridge's Line 3 become operational. Along with other enhancements to the Enbridge Mainline system, Line 3 will increase Alberta's takeaway capacity by roughly 100,000 barrels of oil per day.

I am happy to report on the progress that is being made to get pipelines built and Alberta's resources to market. Albertans can rest assured that our government will continue to stand up for our world-class energy sector and the jobs it creates for our province.

Premier Kenney Fights for Alberta at the Council of the Federation

Recently Premier Kenney traveled to Toronto to meet with Canada's 12 other Premiers. Premier Kenney voiced the need to modify the Fiscal Stabilization Program to make it more responsive to economic downturns in resource markets. All Premiers agreed that this must be done. The Premiers also called for the removal of the per capita equalization cap that prevents Alberta from receiving full payments following sudden declines in revenue. This would add a \$1.7-billion retroactive payment going back to 2015-16. Overall, the meeting was a positive step in our fight for a fair deal for Albertans.

These are some of the political highlights as the 2019 year winds up. It started with Albertans looking forward to a spring election and the opportunity to change the direction of the government of this province that we love. The citizens of Alberta entrusted the United Conservative Party with a majority government to enact their campaign promise of jobs, pipelines and the economy and the year is ending with the government working hard to fulfill its cam-paign promises. So as we all move in to the 2020 New Year I want to wish you and yours a Happy New Year with all of the promise that a new year brings.




