

MOVE OVER AND STOP FOR **EMERGENCY RESPONDERS**

Submitted by Parkland **RCMP**

Parkland RCMP would like to remind the public of the importance of pulling over and stopping for flashing emergency lights and sirens. The Alberta Traffic Safety Act states: when an emergency vehicle (ambulance, fire, police or peace officers) is approaching you from any direction and is sounding a siren, you must yield the right-of-way.

If you hear a siren or see flashing emergency lights:

- Clear the intersection.
- If you are driving on a road with one or two lanes, pull over on the right side of the road.
- Remember to use your signal.
- If you are driving on a road with three or more lanes, clear the intersection and move your vehicle to the nearest side of the road.
- · If you are in the centre lane, pull your vehicle over to the right side of the road, come to a complete stop and wait for the emergency vehicle to pass you.

- Move right or left to the nearest curb on 1-way streets.
- · Emergency vehicles have the right-of-way and take precedence over all other traffic. Keep to the side of the street until they have safely passed and watch closely for additional emergency vehicles approaching from behind.
- · Don't enter an intersection until the emergency vehicle is completely through it, even if you have a green light.

The only exception to this rule is when a peace officer gives you other directions.

• Remember, you must not follow within 150 m of any emergency vehicle that has its siren or lights operating

• Be considerate of other drivers that have pulled over in front of you.

• If you are passing an emergency vehicle parked on the side of the road, remember, any road with a posted speed limit as 80 km/h or upwards means you must slow down to 60 km/h, whereas a road with a posted speed limit of 79 km/h or lower requires you to slow down to 40 km/h.

• Failing to slow down puts emergency workers, including tow truck drivers and other motorists at risk of serious injury or even death.

If you fail to slow down for emergency vehicles or

tow trucks parked road side with emergency lights flashing, fines for speeding are double. If you fail to yield to emergency vehicles with emergency lights and sirens engaged, you could receive a fine and demerits.

By remembering these rules of the road, you will help emergency responders get to the scene as quickly as possible and keep emergency personnel safe who are assisting road side.

TECHNOLOGY AND DIVERSIFICATION IN DRAYTON VALLEY-DEVON

Can you believe we made it all the way into 2020 already? I hope everyone had the opportunity to rest up this holiday season and enjoy the wonderful new year's celebrations.

As the holidays come to an end, I want to discuss a topic that I have found myself continuously championing over the last few years; technological advancements and resource production in the constituency of Drayton Valley-Devon.

As an MLA in a resource rich constituency, I am asked time and time again what our government is doing to diversify the provincial economy and create future jobs. My answer and the solution to many questions regarding our resource industries is the application of

technology.

As we know, Alberta is home to a world class oil and gas sector and as a result, host to some of the most rapidly developing technological industries and products in the world. Throughout the history of our province, we have seen highly advanced technology continue to grow and adjust in step with the needs of our economy and resources. In just the past 15 years we have witnessed a 25% reduction in carbon produced in Fort McMurray as Alberta engineers continue to make advances in the area of carbon capture. A new development by Safe Seal 360, a company based out of Drayton Valley, has created a valve that self-greases and has a fail-safe leak stopper for use in pipeline production. A second company, Cerulean Carbon Corp., has created a product that could completely change the way we respond to an oil spill.

This product is called HY-DRO-C6H6 and is a combination of Synthetic Rubber and other ingredients that form a powder that absorbs oil. These components are essentially non-toxic, making them a safer and more affordable product for use in nature. Currently, it can cost multiple millions of dollars and an extended amount of time to clean up an oil spill. I visited an oil spill clean-up this past summer which cost over 3 million dollars for a relatively small spill that was discovered shortly after a pipe ruptured. This new technology, could have been applied to spill I visited and absorbed and eliminated the oil spill and its affects almost immediately. The long chain hydrocarbon molecules that make up Hydro-C surround and then encapsulate the undesired oil, making complete removal efficient and effective,

even in water.

While many argue that we must immediately shut down natural resource production across our country to prevent damage to ecosystems and climate, I would contest that the changes needed to address many environmental concerns are already very much available or in development. New technologies and advancing science are demonstrating to us every single day that there are often modern solutions for the modern problems we face today.

We produce in Alberta world class engineers out of the University of Alberta, who continue to apply their world class engineering skils and knowledge to the problems faced in our 21st Century Alberta economy. Alberta is currently home to hundreds of new and emerging technologies that will only help to advance our economic place in the world. So as we proceed into a new decade this knowledge reassures me that we can and should have hope in the economic future of Alberta.

YCFD MEMBERS HONOURED WITH LIFESAVING AWARD

On Sunday, November 17,

YCFD crews responded to an early morning collision on Highway 16. In the process of tending to their duties, the emergency responders and several civilians would see their safety threatened by yet another crash.

Lt. Curtis Robinson and Fire Fighter (FF) James (Jim) Akers were tending to a Motor Vehicle Collision (MVC) on an extremely icy section of Highway 16 when an out-of-control tractor trailer veered off the highway and struck a Ledcor pickup-truck as well as a firetruck. The tractor trailer flipped and landed on the Ledcor pickup truck, which then burst into flames.

Thanks to the quick reaction of Lt. Robinson and FF Akers, the civilian driver of the original MVC and a Ledcor employee were able to get out of the out-of-control tractor's way. Lt. Robinson, along with an RCMP member, then retrieved the tractor's driver as the trailer was ablaze.

Lt. Robinson and FF Akers directed all individuals to move to a safe area off of the icy highway. Once more units arrived on scene, Lt. Robinson and FF Akers proceeded to assist in the efforts to control and extinguish the Ledcor pick-up truck and tractor trailer fire.

For their courageous efforts under duress, both men were awarded the Lifesaving Award. This award is presented to fire-fighters for performing acts in the line of duty, through prompt and alert action and at great personal risk, which specifically result in saving a human life.

implemented within their networks by December 19, 2019. The implementation of this system will mean that calls that do not come from a number that can be dialled or exceed 15 digits will be blocked before reaching the subscriber.
