

Over the years Cows and Fish has monitored riparian health at approximately 50 locations related to riparian projects on agricultural land in the County and engaged with more than 600 community members in this area through presentations, field days, and on-site visits. It has been a challenge to keep in touch with everyone, but by gathering

funding from a variety of sources, including the Government of Canada's Environmental Damages Fund, and with the support of local partners, like Lac Ste. Anne County, we are reaching out to reconnect, identify riparian health changes, and share our expertise for additional management changes.

The day begins with a free lunch, followed by information on riparian basics – learn exactly what the word

riparian means and identify the riparian areas on your property. We'll explore management strategies for healthy riparian areas in agricultural settings, look at local and provincial examples, and get a quick tutorial on how to use Google Earth to help you achieve your management goals. Partner organizations working in the area will be there to showcase more programs available to producers.

EDSON RCMP GENERAL INVESTIGATION SECTION LAY ARSON CHARGES FOLLOWING LENGTHY INVESTIGATION

Edson, Alta. – The Edson RCMP General Investigation Section (GIS) has been actively investigating the following suspicious fires: Edson Chrysler Dodge Jeep on Dec. 9, 2019; vehicle fire in Edson on Dec. 9, 2019; KW Pet Store in Whitecourt, Alta., on Dec. 26, 2019; Edson Honda on Dec. 30, 2019; and the Petro Canada in Niton Junction, Alta., on Feb. 23, 2020.

- Break and enter commit theft over \$5,000 (Edson Honda)
- Obstruction of justice Berube is also charged with the following:
- Arson disregard for human life (Petro Canada)
- Break and enter commit indictable offence (Petro Canada)

The name of the youth will not be released pursuant to provisions of the Youth Criminal Justice Act.

Following judicial hearings, both Berube and the youth were remanded into custody to speak to bail and are scheduled to attend court at Edson Provincial Court on March 17, 2020.

On Dec. 26, 2019, the KW Pet Store break and enter resulted in the theft of a four-month-old male Chihuahua dog from the premises. The Edson RCMP are looking for the assistance of the public in locating this dog.



Encounters with Canada (EWC) is a unique opportunity for teens aged 14 to 17 to meet other young Canadians. Students spend a week in Ottawa, sight-seeing, learning and participating in special activities such as checking out future career options, discovering our country, and expanding their horizons. Each

week is dedicated to a particular theme that includes Arts & Culture, Business & Entrepreneurship, Medicine & Health, Global Affairs, Sport & Fitness, Science & Technology, Politics and Governance to name a few. EWC has been providing this adventure to Canada's teen for over 37 years and to date, more than 113,000 have participated.

Over the years, OJSH has sponsored many students so they could take advantage of this amazing opportunity. This year, Grade 12 student Rowyn Mustus travelled to Ottawa in early February to take part in EWC's Sport & Fitness week.

At Rowyn's first day at EWC, participants did a fun but challenging physical course. Each day after that, there was a different fitness activity to challenge the students. Participants were able to tour many of Ottawa's important sites. Rowyn and his companions visited the House of Commons and were able to view the Senate. They went to Rideau Hall - where the Governor Generals resides - saw the Rideau Canal and the National War Memorial. The teens visited the locker room of Ottawa's CFL team, the Redblacks, in TD Place Stadium at Lansdowne. Rowyn said the best thing for him on their many walking tours was the Canada Science & Technology Museum where visitors learn about Canadian science, technology, and innovation through interactive exhibitions.

Rowyn and the other students stayed at the Terry Fox Centre near downtown Ottawa. This is where EWC is centered. There are dorms, cafeteria, dining areas, an internet cafe, lounges, recreational areas and meeting rooms -- all on over 2.5 acres of land. 



SIGNS TRANSMISSION FLUID IS LOW

Vehicles require all sorts of maintenance to operate safely and efficiently. Contrary to popular belief, motorists need not be amateur mechanics to keep their vehicles running strong.

Major vehicle repairs are best left to the professionals, but drivers can learn to identify the causes of relatively minor issues that, if left untreated, can cause significant damage. For example, vehicles may exhibit certain signs of that indicate their transmission fluid needs replenishing. In many of the following instances, drivers may only need to top off the transmission fluid in their vehicles. However, if issues persist, schedule an appointment with a mechanic

- Overheated transmission: Smoke billowing from a car is a sight no driver wants to see. But as bad as it may look, smoke coming from a car may only indicate the transmission is overheating due to lack of fluid. Smoke also can be indicative of a host of other problems, so if transmission fluid levels are not low, consult a mechanic. Loss of power and a burning smell also may indicate low transmission fluid levels
- Erratic shifting: Drivers can notice how their vehicles shift whether the cars or trucks have automatic or manual transmissions. Transmission fluid may be low if shifts appear to be delayed or faster than

normal or if the vehicle appears to be slamming into a new gear. The automotive service provider Aamco notes that shifting issues related to transmission fluid may indicate the presence of a leak. If the issue disappears after refilling transmission fluid but then reappears shortly thereafter, consult a mechanic.

Pausing when engaging gears: A two- to three-second pause when shifting into drive and reverse is another indicator that transmission fluid levels are low. The automotive experts at Firestone note that manual transmissions require fluid to keep gears lubricated, while automatic transmissions rely on fluid to create the hydraulic

pressure necessary to power movement within the transmission. When fluid levels are low, shifting from park to drive or reverse can take longer than it should.

· Slipping transmission: Vehicles that are not staying in gear also may be in need of transmission fluid. However, a slipping transmission also may indicate significant damage to the transmission has already occurred, so this issue should be brought to the attention of a mechanic.

Low transmission fluid levels can contribute to various symptoms. Keeping an eye on fluid levels and recognizing low fluid symptoms can keep cars running smoothly.
