RCMP LAY CHARGES ON TWO INDIVIDUALS FOR ASSAULTS ON POLICE AND MULTIPLE COUNTS OF MISCHIEF

On April 11, 2020, at 7 a.m., Mayerthorpe RCMP responded to a complaint where a suspect had been identified as having committed an attempted break

and enter to a residence and mischief to several vehicles in the area of 46 avenue and 49 street in Mayerthorpe.

Mayerthorpe RCMP located the suspect a short time later and he was exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19. During his arrest, the male

suspect purposely coughed into an officer's face. Mayerthorpe RCMP transported the suspect to hospital to be examined for a pre-existing injury, not related to his arrest, that police deemed in need of medical attention.

ALBERTA RCMP OFFICERS THREATENED WITH COVID-19 CONTAMINATION

Edmonton – Members of the Alberta RCMP have reported being threatened in the context of the current COVID-19 pandemic. In the past several days, RCMP officers have reported being threatened to be coughed on by members of the public who claim to be COVID-19 positive.

"The threat to transmit the COVID-19 virus is a threat to the wellbeing and health of our members which is a criminal offence," said Assistant Commissioner John Ferguson, Alberta RCMP's Officer-in-Charge of Criminal Operations. "To actually carry out these threats would be an Assault on a Peace Officer."

Currently, there is only one recorded incident

that has led to charges in Wetaskiwin, Alta. That individual was charged with assault on a police officer and failure to comply with the Public Health Act.

We want Albertans to know that their provincial police force is fully operational, and continues to ensure the safety and security of Albertans.

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE FOR WHITECOURT

APRIL 7, 2020

The Town of Whitecourt continues to monitor the COVID-19 pandemic across Alberta, and has been adjusting operations to meet the changing needs of our community.

Help Prevent The Spread The Town of Whitecourt encourages people in our community to comply with all of the Public Health Orders that have been put into effect in Alberta. Additionally, residents are encouraged to stay home if possible, and to practise physical distancing. If you need to leave your home, keep at least 6 feet from others when going out for groceries, medical trips and other essential needs. It is important that all Albertans thoroughly wash their hands often, and avoid touching their face, nose or mouth with unwashed hands.

Religious Holidays Many Albertans are planning to celebrate upcoming religious holidays such as Easter, Passover and Ramadan. The Town of Whitecourt reminds residents that mass gathering restrictions recently implemented by the Province during this public health emergency continue to be in effect and include faith based gatherings. Residents are encouraged to follow physical distancing practices throughout the holiday season.

Wearing of Non-Medical Masks

As noted in press conferences conducted by the Government of Canada and Alberta on April 6, 2020, wearing a nonmedical mask, such as a homemade cloth mask, has not been proven to protect the person wearing it. However, it may be helpful in protecting others around you. The most important steps you can take to prevent the spread of infection are:

- consistent adherence to good hygiene such as proper hand washing,
- following all public health orders,
- staying home whenever possible and practicing physical distancing when you need to go out.

Non-medical masks:

- should only be used in addition to other protective steps to help prevent the spread such as (washing hands frequently for at least 20 seconds, practicing physically distancing, staying at home),
- include cloth or homemade masks,
- are not proven to protect the person wearing it, but may help protect others,

ALBERTA RCMP WARN CITIZENS OF SPIKE IN COVID-19 SCAMS

Since the beginning of the month, there has been a spike in COVID-19 related scams in Canada. The most common reports are fraudulent merchandise sales and phishing emails.

The fraudulent merchandise sales frequently involve the sale and/or giveaway of health-related products such as facemasks and COVID-19 tests. There are also "free" products being advertised where the victim must pay a fake shipping fee.

The phishing emails impersonate agencies such as the Red Cross, the World Health Organization, the Ministry of Health, Public Health Canada, the Canada Revenue Agency, and more. Typically, individuals are contacted through email or SMS

and provided a link which prompts them to fill out personal and banking information. In some cases, the link contains suspected malware.

Other scams that occur involve individuals being advised of fake positive test results, donation campaigns, door-to-door decontamination services, and self-assessment surveys.

Here are some tips to remember if you are contacted:

- Never give out personal or financial details if you didn't initiate the call.
- If you didn't initiate the contact, you don't know who you're talking to.
- Don't click on suspicious links or attachments.
- Install anti-virus software.
- Be skeptical of emails even if they look legitimate.
- Check the "from" address by hovering over the name.
- · Check the Canadian An-

ti-Fraud website for a list of reported scams.

If you have been the vic-

tim of a fraud, report it to your local police service and to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre online at: www.antifraudcentre.ca. You should also contact your bank and credit card company if you believe your personal or financial information has been compromised.

Relief Measures

In efforts to support residents and businesses of Whitecourt, Town Council will be proceeding with the following relief measures:

• Property Tax Deadline

- The 2020 Property Tax deadline will be extended to August 31, 2020. It is anticipated that tax notices will be sent out in May per the normal schedule, but property

owners will have an additional two months to make payment. This deadline extension matches the education tax deadline extension recently announced by the Government of Alberta. A bylaw amendment will be forwarded to the next Regular Meeting of Council for formal approval.

• Utility Payment and Penalty Deferral - Payments and penalties for utility accounts will be deferred for a 90-day period to June 30, 2020. Service disconnections will also be deferred for the same time period. Further details on this relief measure will be published once a bylaw amendment has been approved by Whitecourt Town Council.

While at the hospital, a female visited the suspect; however, became disruptive and had to be escorted out of the hospital, at which time she purposely coughed on one of the RCMP officers. A short time later, hospital staff reported the female was breaking into vehicles in the hospital parking

lot. Mayerthorpe RCMP arrested the female and she resisted arrest. Once the suspect female was secured in the police vehicle, she caused extensive damage to the inside of the police vehicle. At the time of this incident, the female suspect was observed to be exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19.

James Topley (20) of Lac Ste-Anne, Alta.:

- Assault on police officer
- Mischief under \$5,000 (x4)

Following a judicial hearing, Topley was remanded into custody to appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court to speak to bail on April 15, 2020.

The following charges have been laid against Charlotte Gileen Mills (35) of Barrhead County, Alta.:

- Assault on police officer (x2)
- Resist arrest
- Mischief under \$5,000
- Mischief over \$5,000

Following a judicial hearing, Mills was released on \$2,000 cash bail and a number of release conditions including house arrest. She is scheduled to appear in Mayerthorpe Provincial Court on June 25, 2020.

SITUATION UPDATE: **COVID-19 PANDEMIC IN ALBERTA**

There are now 823 confirmed recovered cases of COVID-19 in the province. With 82 new cases reported, the total number of cases in Alberta is 1,651. Four Albertans have died since the last report, bringing the total deaths in the province to 44.

- 1,046 cases in the Calgary zone
- 395 cases in the Edmonton zone
- 103 cases in the North zone

- Of these cases, there are currently 44 people in hospital, 14 of whom have been admitted to intensive care units (ICU).
- 237 cases are suspected of being community ac-
- · Two of the latest deaths were residents of the McKenzie Towne continuing care facility in Calgary zone, bringing the total number of deaths at this facility to 20. Two were residents at Manoir du Lac in North zone. bringing the total number of deaths at this facility to
- · With these recent deaths. a total of 30 people have died in the Calgary zone. Seven people have died in the Edmonton zone, six people have died in the



North zone, and one person has died in the Central zone.

- Stronger outbreak measures have been put in place at continuing care facilities. To date, 183 cases have been confirmed at these facilities.
- There have been 74,709 people tested for COVID-19 and a total of 77,316 tests

performed by the lab. There were 2,038 tests completed in the last 24 hours.

- Effective April 15, continuing care workers will be required to wear masks at all times when providing direct patient care or working in patient care areas.
- Starting April 16, workers

in long-term care and designated supportive living sites will only be allowed to work at one location. This requirement must be fully implemented no later than April 23.
