MP SOROKA CALLS FOR MORE SUPPORT FOR AGRICULTURE AND THE TOWN OF JASPER

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, and Deputy Shadow Minister for Natural Resources (Forestry and Mining) was in Ottawa to take part in the sitting of Parliament on April 29. While in the House he questioned the government on its response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Jasper National Park and the Town of Jasper are both heavily reliant on tourism, which has been shut down due to COVID-19. Each year they pay land rent for municipal purposes such as roads, parks and cemeteries, however this year they cannot afford to do so due to lost revenues.

MP Soroka asked if the

Deputy Prime Minister will "help the towns of Jasper and Banff, the only two municipalities in Canada that pay land rent to the federal government? Will the government eliminate the land rent for this year?" Ms. Freeland failed to indicate whether the government would be offering this relief or not.

FAMILIES TO RECEIVE INCREASED SUPPORT THROUGH THE CANADA CHILD BENEFIT

Families are feeling the social and economic impacts of COVID-19 in their everyday lives. Parents are concerned about putting food on the table, and trying to find creative ways to educate and entertain their kids. The Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau, today highlighted that families receiving the Canada Child Benefit (CCB) will get \$300 extra per child in May to help them deal with the added pressures of COVID-19.

Eligible families will automatically receive this onetime increase as part of their scheduled CCB payment in May. Those who already receive the CCB do not need to re-apply for this onetime increase. This increase will deliver almost \$2 billion in extra support across the country to help families with the high cost of taking care of their kids during this challenging period.

This is just one of the many measures the Government of Canada has put in place to help families weather this crisis. In addition to this one-time CCB increase, we have provided individuals and families with low and modest incomes with a special top-up payment through the Goods and Services Tax credit. This measure gave, on average, close to \$400 for single in-



dividuals and close to \$600 for couples, injecting \$5.5 billion into the Canadian economy. We have also extended the tax filing deadline for individuals to June 1,2020.

The government will continue to monitor and respond to the health, social, and economic impacts of COVID-19. We stand ready to take additional actions as needed to support all Canadians, including families and children, and stabilize the economy.

• The CCB is a monthly payment made to eligible families to help with the cost of raising children under 18 years of age.

• The CCB has had a positive impact on families' incomes, and has played a key role in reducing child poverty. Since it was introduced, the benefit has put more money in the pockets of about 9 out of 10 Canadian families with children.

Soroka went on to question the Minister of Agriculture asking, "Is the government going to announce a program geared specifically to agriculture?" Canadian farmers are playing a vital role during this crisis, but they need help now.

"...We are working right now to see where the gaps are for the agriculture sector. We will come back with further measures as soon as we can," said Minister Bibeau.

Soroka also questioned the Minister regarding the Canadian Federation of Agriculture's agri-food emergency preparedness plan, concerns surrounding meat processing capacity, and the Minister's failure to implement industry proposed measures such as the set-aside program which has been on her desk for months.

The Liberal government announced major firearms policy changes in the middle of a global pandemic that does absolutely nothing to address the real problem – gun violence and illegal weapons in Canada. This is wrong. Members of Parliament should be allowed to debate policy changes and raise their constituents' concerns.

Conservatives have and will always support common-sense firearms policies that keep guns out of the hands of dangerous criminals. We are the only party calling for action to tackle the real issue -- illegal and smuggled guns. According to Peel Region police, 75% of seized illegal handguns are smuggled in from the U.S. This was also confirmed by Ottawa's police chief.

We want to ensure Canadians are safe and secure in their neighbourhoods, which is why during the last election, Conservatives campaigned on a plan for A Safer Canada. It included the creation of the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) Firearms Smuggling Task Force to work with law enforcement to crack down on smuggled guns. It also included making the possession of a smuggled firearm a criminal offence with a mandatory five-year sentence, as well as better information sharing to allow police forces to better-track illegal firearms.

2020 TAX NOTICES MAILED

County taxes are due and payable by June 30

Tuesday, May 12 marks the County's mail-out date for the 2020 property tax notices. This notice will consist of amounts for municipal taxes; education taxes; the new provincial policing requisition; the seniors housing requisition; and, if applicable, local improvement levies and special taxes.

To help ease the financial burden for ratepayers during COVID-19, the 2020 notices reflect tax relief measures including tax payment deadline extensions and deferral of penalties.

If you are able to pay your property taxes now, we encourage you to do so. This revenue helps the County provide the essential services that ratepayers rely upon.

In the interest of public safety during COVID-19, please note that paying your taxes in person at the County administration office is not an option. Ratepayers can continue to use the envelope depository by the main office entrance, or can submit cheques via regular post. Other options include online banking, telephone banking, or in person at your local financial institution where this service is provided

Penalties on current taxes (not including the Tax Prepayment Plan) will be applied at 6% on September 1, 2020. On November 1, 2020, penalties to current arrears will be applied at 9%, and on January 1, 2021, a 9% penalty will be applied to the entire outstanding balance.

IMPORTANT MAILING ADDRESS REMINDER

Didn't get your tax notice in the mail? Better call the County!

The County sends important mail to ratepayers throughout the year.

Sometimes this correspondence goes astray due to an incorrect or outof-date mailing address on file with the County. As more and more households abandon their land lines, it becomes increasingly problematic for the County to maintain accurate contact information.

Those living in rural areas can have two addresses: a mailing address, and a municipal address (street address). Your municipal address is that blue sign at the end of the driveway. While a municipal address helps emergency responders or courier services find your property, it's not a valid mailing address.

If you haven't received your Tax & Assessment Notice this year, or if you wish to confirm that your current mailing address is on file, call the County office at 780.785.3411 or visit LSAC. ca/address.

The last few months have been "Unprecedented" to be sure. I, like many, look for wisdom from my mentors, my elders, and seniors when I personally am in uncharted territory. There is a vast amount of knowledge out there that you will not find on the internet search engines, nor on social media posts. There is an oral history that will unfortunately never be written down, and can only be accessed if we take the time to visit, ask questions, and listen.

I know for certain that I am not the smartest person in most of the rooms I'm in, and humbly look to others for their input and guidance, especially if they have "Been There and Done That". I can take their advice, apply my own knowledge, review the information at my disposal, and then make my informed decision. It is has kept me out of the glue on more than one occasion, and I greatly appreciate the people who have taken their time over the years to impart their knowledge and experience so, as one man put it, "You don't repeat my mistakes".

IMPROVE SOIL QUALITY FOR A BETTER LAWN

A lush, green lawn can vastly improve a home's curb appeal. Thick, healthy grass indicates that homeowners care enough about their properties to invest the time, effort and money to make them beautiful.

According to the landscaping tool company Troy-Bilt, soil fertility is the foundation of healthy lawns. In fact, the quality of the soil is essential whether one is growing acres of grass, potted plants or vegetable garden beds. No matter which type of soil a homeowner is working with, there are various ways to make it better.

Remove thatch

Thatch is a tightly knotted layer of leaves, grass roots, stems, and other debris that accumulates between the grass blades and the soil. Too much thatch can hinder the movement of water. air and nutrients into the soil. According to organic fertilizer company Organo-Lawn, thatch often occurs if the production of dead organic material in the lawn exceeds the ability of the microorganisms in the soil to break down that organic matter. A half-inch of thatch is normal. If thatch gets too thick, it will need to be removed. The home improvement resource DIY Network says dethatching can take place in the summer, fall and winter using a thatching rake.

Aerate

A lawn aerator will create holes in the soil. This can improve drainage and encourage worms and helpful microorganisms that require oxygen to thrive in the soil. The Briggs & Stratton Company says the best time to aerate a lawn is during the growing season when the grass can heal and fill in any holes, such as spring and fall. Aeration can help develop deeper grass roots for a healthier lawn.

Test and amend soil

A great lawn has loamy soil, which has a key ratio of clay, silt and sand. Silt is a granular material of a size between sand and clay that originates from quartz and feldspar. It is the most fertile of the three types of soil components. Sand does not retain water, but it helps to create spaces in the soil that permit air to circulate. Clav particles are small and bind together tightly, but clay is naturally nutrient-rich. The home improvement site

BobVila.com says loamy soil should have equal parts sand and silt and half as much clay.

If the lawn is not yet established, loamy soil can be created and then the grass seeds planted. For established soil, after removing thatch and aerating, top-dressing the lawn can help. This involves adding a thin layer of soil over the lawn. It can improve the soil without killing the existing turf. Ideally, it should be done in early fall or spring, as this gives the grass time to grow through three to four more mowings before severe heat or cold sets in.

Healthy soil is vital to a lush lawn. It takes a little work, but improving soil can create vibrant, healthy, green grass.
