20 MILLION MASKS TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO ALBERTANS

A&W, McDonald's Restaurants of Canada Ltd. and Tim Hortons are partnering with the Alberta government to distribute non-medical masks at no cost through their drive-th-

ru locations across the province, to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. Distribution will start in early June.

the non-medical masks to those who need them, such as people who depend on public transit.

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

May 26, 2020

Election Sign Bylaw – Council provided third reading to the Election Sign Bylaw 13.20. This bylaw is meant to enforce election sign removal. The bylaw comes in response to a great number of signs littered throughout the county after the last municipal election. The bylaw will penalize those who incorrectly fix or



erect a sign or do not remove their signs following an election. The penalty is a standard \$100 fine per sign.

Edson Waste Transfer Site Fee Implementation -County council approved using the Town of Edson's fee schedule for county users of the Edson Waste Transfer Site. County users of the Edson Waste Transfer site were historically exempt from user fees. However, it is evident that the system is being abused. County users of the facility will now be charged the minimum fee of \$5.00 per use. It is estimated that the county will save some \$60,000 in fees paid to the town.

Water Tank Installation Tender – Yellowhead County's Fire Department (YCFD) currently has 13 underground water tanks strategically located in non-hvdrant areas throughout the county. These tanks supply water when needed for fire operations. The tanks will also form part of the superior water-shuttle rating that YCFD is striving to achieve. If this rating is acquired, a substantial decrease in insurance rates could be seen by all residents and workers within Yellowhead County. Council accepted a tender from K-Rite Construction Ltd. (lowest bidder) to install two final water tanks at a cost of \$122,148.42.



POPULAR GOLF COURSES AROUND THE WORLD

The Masters Tournament is the first of golf's four major championships in the calendar year. Competitors tee off at the Augusta National Golf Club in Augusta, GA, in April 2020. Americans Tiger Woods and Patrick Reed are the two most recent Masters champions, and fans are already eager to see who earns the fabled green jacket this year.

Televised golf competitions often inspire people to hit the links. People with a passion for golf may want to check out some of the top courses in the world, as ranked by leading golf resources and experts.

- · Ballybunion: This Irish course was touted as "nothing less than the finest seaside course" by famed golf writer Herbert Warren Wind. The course hosted the 2000 Irish Open, but lack of other tournaments can be attributed to its remote, albeit beautiful, location
- · Cypress Point: This club sits at the foothills of the Santa Lucia Mountains at the tip of the Monterey Peninsula in California. Located in coastal dunes and on rocky coastlines, Cypress

Point is often noted for its dramatic holes along the Pacific Ocean.

- Pine Valley: Located in Pine Valley, NJ, this course, which is more than 100 years old, boasts some formidable hazards with sophisticated green expanses.
- St. Andrew's: This historic course in Scotland has hosted the Open Championship (once known as The British Open) a record 29 times. Historians believe golf originated in Scotland,

and people have been playing on this course since the 15th century. Massive greens, cavernous bunkers and a brilliant layout contribute to its distinguished history.

· Shinnecock Hills: This course in Southampton, NY, is a very old club built in the tradition of Scottish courses. This was likely the inaugural American golf course design, and the Shinnecock Hills Golf Club was one of the five found-


ing members of the United States Golf Association.

Seniors' Week 2020 will, in some ways, be different


than any other in the 34 years of this wonderful Alberta tradition.

Even if we can't all be together, let's make sure that all seniors feel valued by family, friends and Albertans.



MESSAGE TO MY CONSTITUENTS

Provinces are slowly easing health restrictions after being shut down for weeks. While we are not out of the woods yet, there is reason for cautious optimism here in Yellowhead and across the country.

However, the Trudeau government has been slow to react from the very beginning of this crisis, and their failures have cost Canadians.

They spent the cupboards bare in the good times and were unprepared when the pandemic hit. Their failure to close our borders allowed the virus to spread. Their inability to maintain Canada's national stockpile of personal protective equipment meant there weren't enough medical supplies when our doctors and nurses needed them most. Their failure to get federal COVID aid programs right the first time has allowed businesses and workers to fall through the

cracks

We cannot afford to have Liberal failures derail provincial efforts to get our country back on track. But that is precisely what federal programs are threatening to do.

For example, for those Canadians who want to work but who lost their jobs due to the pandemic, the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB) and the Canada Emergency Student Benefit (CESB) both prevent you from earning more than

\$1,000 per month. As businesses open and have shifts to fill, their employees will be penalized for returning to work under the Liberals' program. That's wrong.

Conservatives are calling on the Trudeau government to make programs like the CERB more generous and more flexible so that no one is worse off going back to work or picking up a shift.

Liberal failures must be fixed before it's too late.

Each event ran from 6:30 to 9:00 pm, and attendees heard from Board Chair Brenda Rosadiuk, the local trustee for that zone, Superintendent Lewis, and the community's school principals - who described their collaborative approach to using data, levering professional learning, and accessing Division services and resources to support the learning journey of all GYPSD students, junior kindergarten through to Grade

The evening events are one of the ways that the trustees connect with community members to discuss the Board's mission, vision, and priorities for Grande Yellowhead Public School Division. Yellowhead MP

Gerald Soroka and MLAs Long and Getson also attended the events for their areas.

In addition to an overview of school and Division budget allocations led by Superintendent Lewis, the event participants responded to four survey questions posed by the Board of Trustees:

- What does it mean to be an educated person in this community?
- What are the key skills our graduates require coming into the workforce?
- What are our blind spots? What are we not seeing?
- How will you/how are you, as a stakeholder, supporting public education in this community?

Responses to the questions were collected, collated, and reviewed for themes. Top answers for

Question 1 included Social Skills and Emotional Intelligence. Important skills identified in Question 2 for graduates were Emotional Intelligence and Communication.

The Board was pleased by the overwhelmingly positive feedback it received for Question 3 - to identify blind spots. Participants shared their appreciation for the effort schools make to support students in the rural context - particularly students with complex needs - and asked for more opportunities and avenues for parents to connect with teachers and the school, more social-emotional supports, and expanded cultural learning programs.

The top responses to Question 4 included advocating for the school and the Division, participating in community engagement events and volunteering in the school.

The Board of Trustees strives to connect with parents, community partners, staff, and students throughout the Division. Community Engagement is a Board Priority, and the events are an important avenue for the trustees to hear from the stakeholders and collect important feedback on key topics.






