MP SOROKA CO-HOSTS VIRTUAL TOWN HALL ON FIREARMS BAN

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, would like to thank everyone who responded to his post on Facebook and participated in the virtual town hall he co-hosted with Dane

Lloyd, MP on the government's firearms ban.

Many constituents raised concerns over the new gun regulations, which in many cases arbitrarily ban certain firearms and noted that this does little to combat illegal guns, most of which are smuggled in from the US.

MP Soroka stated, "Many police chiefs are coming out and saying that this ban is not going to do anything to combat gun crime. Unfortunately, the Liberals don't want to listen to anyone whose views don't fit their narrative."

RCMP ARREST FEMALE AS A RESULT OF A SUSPICIOUS VEHICLE REPORT

ALBERTA RCMP CONDUCTS LONG WEEKEND ENFORCEMENT OPERATIONS

Alberta roads typically experience an influx of drivers during long weekends. Due to the ongoing pandemic, this year was different than all others.

Throughout Canada Road Safety Week (May 12-18), Alberta RCMP focused enforcement operations on

speeding, distracted and impaired driving.

Between May 15-18, 2020, there were three fatal and 19 non-fatal injury motor vehicle collisions in Alberta RCMP jurisdictions. Alberta RCMP Traffic Services issued over 1,700 speeding tickets and over 50 distracted driving tickets.

The RCMP reminds all road users, drivers, riders,

passengers and pedestrians alike, that traffic safety is a shared responsibility.

District Priority 1: Student Learning

- Registration is open for GYPSD Summer School 2020! Parkland Composite High School Principal Mark Maris will lead this year's virtual learning initiative.

- GYPSD has encouraged the use of Grade 3 Student Learning Assessments (SLAs).

- The digital tests, currently optional, are administered

at the beginning of the school year in Grade 3.

- They assess outcomes related to literacy and numeracy in language arts and mathematics in Alberta's current Grade 2 provincial programs of study.

- The assessments identify students' strengths and identify areas for improvement and targeted supports.

- Alberta Education has indicated that SLAs for the 2020 21 school year will be mandatory, but details on how and when

have not yet been provided.

- The final day for instruction has been set for June 19, 2020.

- High schools throughout GYPSD are identifying safe and innovative ways to celebrate their Grade 12s. Scroll through the Division's Facebook page for pictures of the Division's graduates.

District Priority 2: Teaching and Leadership Excellence

- On May 26 and May 27, Superintendent Lewis led the Senior Team, the Division's Assis-

tant Principals, Principals and consultants through engaging and reflective professional development.

- Professional Learning for 2020 21: all Division leaders and the Board of Trustees will be participating in a book study Dare to Lead by renowned leadership researcher Dr. Brené Brown.

- Superintendent Lewis attended a conversation as a CASS representative at the University of Alberta to discuss the impact of the pandemic on university students in the province and possible re entry and online program access.

- The Trustees bid farewell to exiting Deputy Superintendent Karen Shipka, thanked her for her service to the Division, and wished her the best in her new leadership role as Superintendent for Rocky Mountain District in BC.

- Superintendent Lewis praised the efforts of Division staff beyond their classroom instructional duties. She applauded the countless hours GYPSD educators have contributed to support extracurricular clubs and experiences, coaching, and providing innovative celebrations for the Division's learners.

District Priority 3: Community Engagement

- Participation and representation of GYPSD at the Public School Boards' Association of Alberta (PSBAA) and the Alberta School Board's Association (ASBA) Spring General Meetings.

- Approved motion to raise Transportation Fees by 5% for 2020 21 school year.

- Approved motion to update Board Policy 17 Appendix A.

- Shared concern that Bill 15, the Choice in Education Act removes Alberta's Public School Boards from providing input into the creation of new Charter Schools.

- Facility improvement projects, approved thru an advancement of capital funds from Alberta Education to stimulate the economy, at Harry Collinge High School in Hinton, Parkland Composite High School in Edson, and Summitview School in Grande Cache.

The project began in the planning and design stage. The students determined the appropriate size of the project given its intended hanging location and the appropriate length: width ratio. They then calculated the amount of material required to construct the project. After that they began designing the overall shape of the flag, calculating the appropriate frequency and wavelength to make the project aesthetically pleasing. While the students are unable to physically participate in the construction process, it is still being constructed using the procedures they have created. From the ripping and cutting of lumber to the creation of a stencil to the lamination of the cut wood. For any issues that have arisen, the students used their problemsolving

skills to address the issues to get the project back on track. While the students are unable to physically participate in the construction process, the flag is still being constructed using the procedures they have created. The eventual plan is to paint the GT logo on this flag to be displayed in their school.

GT students are very inspired to share their new learning experiences. One student created a video to share his adventures in building his own tree house. Along with physical work, this creative student has been patiently measuring and problem solving while also polishing up his motor skills!

GOLFER'S GUIDE

HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR DAY ON THE COURSE

(NC) Most great golf games are filled with sun, competition and camaraderie, but you can enhance the experience with a few tips that have less to do with your swing, and a lot to do with your 18-hole enjoyment:

Dress for success: The right golf apparel can be as important as the clubs you carry. Check the weather in advance to make sure you'll be as comfortable as possible during play. Determine if you're dressing to impress or to elevate your game. Light, non-restrictive clothing will allow you to swing freely and keep you comfortable and cool in the heat, or warm if the temperature drops. If you're a guest, always check out the dress code at the club you'll be visiting to ensure you comply with the rules.

Choose your company carefully: Your playing partners can have a lot to do with how you play and how you socialize on the golf course. If you're out with friends, you can relax and enjoy the day knowing what to expect. But if it's a game with your boss or clients, always make sure to test the waters. Will they play by the rules or is it just a relaxed day? Are your clients

there to play golf or do business? Understanding the landscape on the first tee will alleviate any awkward moments later on.

Create friendly competition: Sure, there's already a scorecard, but you can add more competitive fun to your game by creating a little friendly rivalry. For example, try a little Bingo Bango Bongo - a points based game that awards a total score based on three kinds of achievement: Bingo - first person on the

green gets a point; Bango - the player whose ball is closest to the pin when all balls are on the green gets a point, Bongo - the player who is first to hole out gets a point. Add up the points and the person with the highest total for the round wins.

Walk it off : Make a small 'healthy' tweak to your game by walking vs. taking a cart. When you choose to walk rather than drive 18 holes, you'll cover approximately six kilometres and burn around

1,500 - 2,000 calories. Golfers that ride carts will burn only about 1,100 - 1,300 calories.

Say cheers and enjoy: The 19th hole remains one of the best holes on the course. Cap off a great day by enjoying a light meal or a light beer such as Molson Canadian 67, which is brewed to 67 calories per 341ml bottle and 3% ABV. This crisp, refreshing beer can be paired nicely with a protein boost of chicken or fish.

NON-MEDICAL MASKS AVAILABLE TO ALBERTANS

Albertans can now access 20 million free, non-medical face masks to help prevent the spread of COVID-19

People can visit one of almost 600 A&W, McDonald's Canada, or Tim Hortons drive-thrus in the province to receive four non-medical masks. Masks are free and no purchase is necessary.

"We're proud to be the first province in Canada to support residents with free masks for use in situations where physical distancing may not be possible. Albertans are encouraged to pick up masks for family members and friends, especially those who may not be able to get to a drive-thru, to reduce traffic. Masks are being distributed on the honour system, and people are asked to respect the limit of one package of four masks per Albertan to ensure everyone who wants masks can get them.

Masks have also been provided to many municipalities, First Nations communities, Metis Settlements, and local agencies. This includes rural and remote communities that do not have access to a partner restaurant drive-thru and are developing their own distribution plans.

Quick facts

- About 95 per cent of Albertans live within 10 kilometres of these drive-thrus.
- Mask use is not mandatory; they are an option for situations where maintaining a

distance of two metres is not possible.

• This program is intended to supplement an individual's efforts to acquire non-medical masks. Albertans who wish to use non-medical masks are encouraged to purchase their own supply from local retailers in addition to using those provided by government.

• Masks are being provided to seniors facilities and organizations that support vulnerable populations for distribution to their residents, clients and program members. These masks are not available to the general public.

• The cities of Edmonton and Calgary have each been supplied 500,000 masks, and will be responsible for distributing them mainly through their transit operations.

• Planning is underway to supply masks to places of worship across Alberta.

• Plans to distribute another 20 million masks are being developed.

• Instructions for proper care and use of non-medical masks are available at alberta.ca/masks.

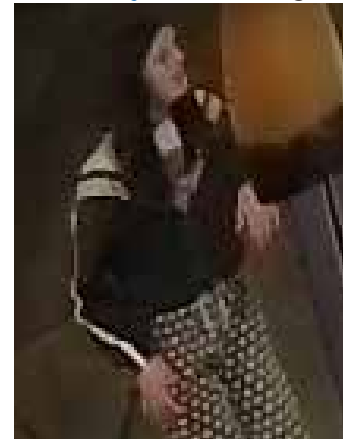
On May 28, 2020 at some-time around midnight, a business located on South Park Drive in Stony Plain had a window broken by three suspects. The sus-

APPLICATION PERIOD OPEN FOR AAFC YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND SKILLS PROGRAM

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, would like to inform constituents of the Youth Employment and Skills Program to provide new

positions for youth in the agriculture sector.

The program will provide employers up to 50 per cent of the cost of hiring a Canadian youth up to \$14,000. Indigenous applicants and those applicants hiring a youth facing barriers are

eligible for funding of up to 80 per cent of their costs.

Eligible applicants include producers, agri-businesses, industry associations, provincial and territorial governments, Indigenous organizations and research facilities. Employers can

apply for this funding retroactive to April 1, 2020, with projects to be completed by March 31, 2021.

Students are encouraged to share pictures or videos of each challenge to the teachers which are then shared on their Facebook page. Inspired by the Jeff Brown's book "Flat Stanley", each kindergarten student received a flat version of their teacher in the mail to help with school work.

Westhaven posts daily learning activities and family-provided pictures on their Facebook page showcasing great student work from almost all grade levels. Madame Maude's Grade 1 French Immersion class shared pictures of each student holding rainbow drawings to brighten the day and send out words of encouragement. *Ca va bien aller!* Everything will be fine!

Literacy work and reading at home together was a focus during Education Week and next is their annual Talent Show with students encouraged to send in videos or pictures performing their talent to their teacher or to Principal McGowan.
