## CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE FOR WHITECOURT

### Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

JUNE 11, 2020

Earlier this week, the Alberta Government announced details of its Stage 2 relaunch strategy. The Town of Whitecourt is finalizing details of the local Stage 2 relaunch based on this information.

"Now that the Province has released details on what can be reopened during Stage 2, the municipality is working to implement required safety protocols and previsions as part of the opening, as well as reviewing staffing and resource requirements" stated Doug Tymchyshyn, Director of Emergency Management. "The reopening for certain facilities, including the Allan & Jean Millar Centre, is quite complex and there is a lot of background work that needs to be done before we can open

the doors – from the rehiring of staff to refilling the pools at the aquatic centre."

Dates for re-opening facilities have been determined, and more specific information will be released to the community early next week on hours of operation and physical distancing protocols for use.

On Monday, June 22 the following facilities and amenities will reopen to the public:

- · Allan & Jean Millar Centre,
- · Pembina Fitness Centre,
- Alberta Newsprint Company Squash and Raquetball Court.
- JR's Pressure Service Field-house,
- · Rotary Running Track,
- · Childmind Services,
- Splash Park at Rotary Park.

Memberships at the Allan & Jean Millar Centre will be re-enacted on Sunday, July 5. Members can visit the Pembina Fitness Centre and book JR's Pressure Services Fieldhouse for no charge between June 22 and July 4. Non-members will be required to pay regular admission fee to visit the Pembina Fitness Centre, and JR's Pressure Services Fieldhouse.

The SemCAMS Midstream Aquatic Centre at the Allan & Jean Millar Centre will reopen on Sunday, July 5.

The Whitecourt River Slides at Rotary Park will remain closed until further notice as operations cannot meet current physical distancing requirements mandated by the Province.

### Purchase of Onoway Regional Medical Clinic Building Plaza

It is noteworthy that the development of a sustainable clinic and medical facility within the County borders is also supported by the six municipal partners (the Town of Onoway; Lac Ste. Anne County; and the Summer Villages of Ross Haven, West Cove, Silver Sands and Val Quentin).

Effective January 1, 2020 the County arranged to se-

cure a lease of the Clinic for 5 years. The Lease provides for an option to purchase the lands, including any buildings and improvements for a 36 month period from January 1, 2020. The County has the opportunity to exercise the option to purchase. The acquisition of the lands, buildings and improvements will result in a long term stable and sustainable solution for a home for the expanded Clinic and

provide a platform for the County to house health care services and support within the County borders.

The strategy of acquiring the lands, buildings and improvements will ensure that LSAC will not be subject to changing conditions in the market or the expiry of a lease term.

Ownership will contribute to a stable and secure platform to support a long term solution that will be of interest to heath care professionals. In addition, ownership assures the County gets the benefits of the expansion of the capacity of the Clinic and to drive the development of a Primary Care Network to bring the services of nurses, dietitians, therapists and other specialized medical resources along with the addition of Physician(s) to serve the community.

### POLICE PRESENCE IN BLUE RIDGE AREA IN WOODLANDS COUNTY

Update #2

High Prairie, Alta. – On June 14, 2020, High Prairie RCMP received a report of a sighting of a male believed to be Bradley Duff during the night / early morning hours in the vicinity of Range Road 185 and Township Road 742 in Big Lakes County, Alta. This location is 3 km's southwest of Triangle Hall, located 20 kms west of High Prairie on Highway 2, or 25kms south of Mclennan, Alta., on Highway 2.

Duff is believed to have been wearing all dark or black clothing and a red bandana covering his face and was in the process of removing items from a white Dodge truck parked off the roadway. The same white Dodge truck was later reported to Emergency Services by a passerby to be on fire on June 15, 2020, at 12:30 a.m.

Further investigation determined the Dodge truck had been stolen out of White-court, Alta., and Bradley Duff was the last person known to have been seen driving it.

High Prairie RCMP Detachment has deployed multiple police resources to the area, including RCMP Police Dog Services Unit to conduct a search for Duff.

RCMP are asking that the public please avoid the area and refrain from posting photos and/or video on social media.

An update will be provided when available.

The public are warned not to approach Duff as he is believed to be possibly armed and dangerous. Duff continues to have warrants for his arrest. If anyone has information about Bradley Duff's whereabouts, please contact Whitecourt RCMP at 780-779-5900 or your local police. Background:

On June 9, 2020, at 5:49 a.m., Whitecourt RCMP received a complaint of a vehicle in the ditch with a passenger unconscious with Emergency Services on scene. When the male became conscious, he fled into a forested area.

Whitecourt RCMP's investigation revealed that the vehicle was stolen out of Edmonton in April 2020. Items in the vehicle and a description of the suspect who fled the scene led RCMP to believe that the suspect is Bradley Duff (35) of no fixed address. Duff is currently on outstanding warrants on other matters.

This gave students and opportunity to display their abilities in their particular domain. Zakk Goertzen was the OJSH representative in the Welding category.

Zakk is a teachable, humble, hardworking and motivated student. He is a true leader! This was evident when, earlier in the school year, Zach led the OJSH welding team to compete at the CLAC sponsored Wicked welding competition. Not only was Zach the elder statesman on the team. but was also the creator and designer of the giant spider metal sculpture that the team built.

Typically, the Skills Alberta competition is an in person competition in many different trades. This year, as Covid19 stole the possibility having a large group of people competing, so a modified event was held. Zakk talked about this change. "Not everyone has access to welders at home, so for the welding branch of the competition Skills Canada needed to figure out a way to test our skills without us actually welding. They decided to give us an exam. For the first part of



the exam we were given a blueprint to analyze, we answered one mark questions based off of our interpretation of the blueprint. For the second part we were asked to draw three different weave patterns on a blank

piece of paper."

When Zakk started training at the beginning of the semester, he came into the shop in his pare time everyday to practice his hands on skills, but we hadn't spent a lot of time on blueprint reading. He worked hard and improved immensely. Training after Covid 19 hit was very different. Zakk had to adjust his training "To win gold, I really had to study up. My uncle is a welding teacher so I was



able to have a crash course with him before I took the exam. When I took the exam I was able to answer the blueprinting questions with confidence.

We're so proud of Zakk and all of the effort that he has put in to training and learning the welding trade. He is a good student and an even better person who deserves this award! Zakk summed it up well "I did the studying, I used strategy, I tried my hardest and it paid off. I knew Skills Canada worked very hard to make this happen, and I wasn't going to take that for grant-

### ADJUSTING GOLF SWING GETS EASIER

Golfers rejoice! Those dreaded slices or hooks could become a thing of the distant past thanks to adjustable clubs and drivers. In addition to helping improve accuracy, adjustable clubs also lighten the load in your golf bag.

With a few twists of a wrench or even turning the shaft of the driver itself, golfers can adjust the face angle, loft and lie angle of the driver to hit the ball farther and straighter. Golfers can make small adjustments to create the right loft and improve distance without having to purchase a new club or visit a club fitter.

Many club manufacturers now offer adjustable drivers and other clubs. According to an informal poll on Golf.com, 34 percent of the 2,337 respondents owned an adjustable driver by the end of 2011. The ability to upgrade shafts has also become popular as golfers respond to what the pros are doing.

Adjustable golf clubs enable golfers to walk out onto the course with one driver and a few different shafts. With a couple of clicks from a wrench, a person can have an en-

tirely new driver. That cuts down on the equipment that needs to be carried and can fine tune a golfer's accuracy. These high-tech clubs are corresponding to changes being made to golf balls. Engineers have reduced the spin on golf balls to help the balls travel farther. To do so, golf experts advise that the ball needs to be hit higher into the air. Adjustable drivers can give players the edge they need to produce the right height and trajectory.

According to data from


golf club manufacturer TaylorMade, 70 percent of consumers who use the company's adjustable drivers adjust their club at least once to get the desired shot. Afterward, 10 to 15 percent of adjustable driver users report further adjustments as they become comfortable with the fea-

Although golfers can now put adjustments into their own hands, it is still advisable to get a professional fitting regardless of which clubs are chosen. A certified club fitter can help a person sort through the myriad options available and make recommendations based on various factors, including the golf ball used.

Those who are not fans of adjustable drivers say that the adjustment mechanisms add weight to the drivers, which can compromise efficiency. However, that isn't stopping larger numbers of golf fans from taking adjustable drivers for a trial run in an effort to improve their game.




