RCMP ATTEND SCENE OF MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION ON HIGHWAY 60

On August 14, 2020 at approximately 11:30 p.m., Parkland RCMP were called to a motor vehicle collision on Highway 60 at a railway crossing between Highways 16 and Highway 16A. CN

crews were attempting to repair damage to the track caused by a derailed train. A pickup truck heading northbound on Highway 60 from Highway 16A struck two crew members.

Parkland County Fire, Alberta Health Services Emergency Medical Ser-

vices and Parkland RCMP attended the scene. Two ground ambulances transported the two crew members to hospital. Both crew members have sustained serious injuries. Next of kin have been notified. The driver of the pickup truck remained on scene and re-

ported no injuries.

The motor vehicle collision and the train derailment are two separate incidents. Police were not required for the train derailment.

A further update will be provided when available.

PROPOSED PROVINCIAL CUTS WILL HARM LOCAL INDUSTRY & RESIDENTS

Rushed, closed-door provincial decision to devastate counties across Alberta.

Yellowhead County is urging residents to act over upcoming disastrous provincial regulations. The Government of Alberta is proposing a new method of assessing oil and gas industries. This will mean an arbitrary loss of tax revenues (as high as 20%) for counties across Alberta.

For Yellowhead County, this could mean a loss of tens of millions of dollars of revenue, which translates to a significant cutting of services to maintain a balanced budget. A decrease in core services could mean a future of:

- Unmaintained and abandoned road infrastructure;
- Dwindling snow removal and road maintenance efforts;
- Shuttering and aging-out of facilities;
- Loss of community social supports;
- A shriveling fire department;
- And many more yet unforeseen impacts.

Put bluntly: The provincial

government is condemning our hard-fought basic privileges— such as access to a safe and reliable road infrastructure, to regularly-maintained community hubs (halls, recreation hotspots, and other facilities), and to the protection of a county-wide fire department and protective service.

These services and more will suffer as a result of the choking of municipal budgets by provincial tax breaks to industry. Additionally, although the county will attempt to budget so that residential tax payers are not burdened, increased residential taxes and user fees will be inescapable. Now is the time for you to act in defense of your community and our county.

MISERICORDIA COMMUNITY HOSPITAL BEGINS PHASED REOPENING

Emergency Department and Labour and Delivery services open to walk-in patients

EDMONTON – The Misericordia Community Hospital will resume Emergency Department (ED) and labour and delivery services this afternoon and begin a phased reopening of scheduled ambulatory appointments and surgical procedures.

The Misericordia was temporarily closed to incoming

patients, including the ED, on July 8 as part of Alberta Health Services' COVID-19 response to the site's full facility outbreak. Existing patients within the hospital continued to receive the treatment, care and support they required, while labouring mothers and patients with scheduled day procedures were rebooked or cared for at other Edmonton Zone hospitals.

Since July 17, 2020, there have been no new COVID-19

cases linked to the Misericordia's outbreak. As of August 14, 2020 the Misericordia outbreak is now considered over and site restrictions have been lifted.

"Early in the outbreak at the Misericordia, we took significant measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and ensure the safety of patients, staff, physicians, and volunteers," says Dr. David Zygun, Medical Director, AHS Edmonton Zone.

"With an abundance of caution, and nearly a month without a new case linked to the initial outbreak, we are confident the site is ready to begin accepting incoming patients to a safe environment of care."

AHS and Covenant Health are grateful to EMS as well as staff and physicians at healthcare facilities, hospitals and in the community throughout the Edmonton Zone who worked tirelessly to accommodate an increase in patient flow due to the temporary closure of the Misericordia.

"The ability of our teams to adapt to the closure of a hospital in the Edmonton Zone is a testament to the depth of our capacity to care for Albertans during a pandemic," says Dr. Zygun. "The hard work and vigilance of our staff and physicians across the system have kept hospital transmission rates low and the environment safe for patients."

Medicine and other hospital inpatient units including the neonatal intensive care unit that continued to care for patients at the Misericordia during the temporary closure will also begin accepting incoming patients. Patients with postponed or upcoming appointments and surgeries will be contacted to reschedule appointments and procedures.

Covenant Health and Alberta Health Services want to assure Albertans that the facility is safe for new admissions.

"Our focus continues to be on the safety of our patients, staff, physicians and visitors in the facility," said Owen Heisler, Chief Medical Officer, Covenant Health. "We are extremely grateful for our hard-working and dedicated physicians and staff who cared for patients and each other during the outbreak, both at the Misericordia or through redeployment throughout the zone."

AHS and Covenant would like to express gratitude to patients and families for their support and patience throughout this temporary service suspension.

ALBERTA RCMP LAUNCHES ONLINE CRIME REPORTING ACROSS THE PROVINCE

The Alberta RCMP have officially rolled out a new, province-wide online crime reporting initiative. The online crime reporting tool allows Albertans to report select property crimes online. This project has been initiated to ensure the public is

able to report select crime types in whatever way is most convenient or accessible to them. A goal for the Alberta RCMP is to make sure all crime is reported, no matter how small. This provides the most accurate crime data and allows our resources to be deployed appropriately in the areas that need it most.

Citizens will be able to report the following crimes online:

- Damage/mischief to property under \$5,000
 - Theft of bicycle under \$5,000
 - Theft under \$5,000
 - Theft from vehicle under \$5,000
 - Lost property
- Incidents must also satisfy

the following conditions to be reported online:

- No witnesses or suspects
- Item(s) lost or stolen must cost less than \$5,000
- Vandalized property will cost less than \$5,000 to repair
- There are no items involving personal identity, firearms, licence plates or decals

All crimes reported online will be followed up with a phone call from a police officer in "K" Division's Call Back Unit (CBU) within five business days. The CBU was created to ensure all non-urgent calls for service are investigated efficiently and effectively. "The Alberta RCMP is always looking for new opportunities to modernize and streamline our services for all Albertans – no matter where they live in the province," says Deputy Commissioner Curtis Zabolocki, Commanding Officer of Alberta RCMP. "Online crime reporting is accessible and convenient, and will help us capture more intelligence when it comes to property crime occurring in all of the communities we serve. Offering a contactless service is also vital in these times when physical distancing is so important."

This initiative has already been piloted in Airdrie, Banff, Cold Lake, Grande Prairie, Red Deer and Strathcona County from June 1, 2020 to present. The link to report a crime online can be found here: <https://ocre-sielc.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/alberta>

We encourage the public to report crime online, when possible. Reporting less serious crime online helps emergency call takers and frontline members focus their time on high-priority calls. We take all reports of crime seriously and crime reported online will be treated the same as crime reported in any other way.
