# ALBERTA RCMP EXPLAINS HOW TO REDUCE RISKS ON THE WATER

Submitted by Alberta RCMP

Edmonton - Every year as summer sets in and more Albertans take to our provincial rivers and lakes, there is an unfortunate increase of water-related accidents and fatalities. It is important to understand the risks associated with water activities and take necessary precautions so



that we can safely enjoy our waterways.

Between January 2016 and July 2020, there were 67 drowning fatalities in Alberta. Seventy-five percent of the individuals who drowned were over the age of 21, and 70% of the incidents occurred on a lake or river. From January 2020 to date, there has been a total of five fatalities due to drowning.

To reduce the risks of drowning and promote water-safety, RCMP asks Albertans to remember the following:

- Children must be supervised by an adult while swimming.
- Children and inexperienced swimmers should always wear a lifejacket when in the water.

- Check both water and weather conditions before heading out on a lake or river. Weather can change and quickly become dangerous.
- Ensure there are enough lifejackets or Personal Floatation Devices for every person on a watercraft.
- Ensure boats have a safety kit and cell phone on board in case of emergencies.
- Never operate a boat while under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- Avoid climbing rocks or cliffs near water for photo op purposes. A selfie should never compromise your safety.

By being properly prepared and implementing water-safety best practices, we can all do our part to prevent drowning fatalities.

## PARENTS' GUIDE: 2020-21 SCHOOL YEAR

Return to near normal daily in-school classes with health measures

#### Learning in the new school year

Students will return to school daily at the beginning of the new school year. There are health measures that everyone has to follow to reduce the risk of COVID-19 and help stay safe. While your school will develop a plan to meet the government's health recommendations, everyone will have a role to play.

#### PARENTS' ROLE IN KEEPING SCHOOLS SAFE

# Screen for symptoms every morning

Check every morning to see if your child has any of these symptoms. If yes, they must stay home:

- Fever, cough, shortness of breath/difficulty breathing, sore throat, chills, painful swallowing
- Runny nose/nasal congestion, feeling unwell/fatigued, nausea/vomiting/diarrhea, unexplained loss of appetite
- Loss of sense of taste or smell, muscle/joint aches, headache, Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye)

Use the <u>Self-Assessment tool</u> to check if your child should be tested for COVID-19.

# Stay home when sick or if in contact with someone who is sick

Students, parents or family members must not enter school if they:

- Feel sick or have symptoms of COVID-19
- Had close contact with someone who is ill with a cough and/or fever
- Have anyone in the household who has been in close contact in the last 14 days with someone who is being investigated or confirmed to have COVID-19
- Have traveled outside of Canada in the last 14 days
- Had close contact with someone who has travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days and who is ill

#### Keep a safe distance

Keep 2 metres between you and others when possible:

- . During drop-off and pick-up
- During interactions with a teacher, school staff or other parents and students

#### Pick up students promptly if they show symptoms at school

You will be asked to pick up your child from school immediately if they show symptoms. Please ensure the school has your most up-to-date contact information so they may reach you if your child needs to be picked up.

#### Taking your child to school

If your child normally takes the bus, consider taking them directly to school if your personal situation allows for it. This would help with physical distancing on the bus for students who do not have other options besides taking the bus.

#### WHAT STUDENTS NEED TO KNOW

#### Cohort

A cohort—or bubble—is a group of students and staff who remain together. The size of the cohort will depend on the physical space of the classroom.

The risk of COVID-19 is reduced by limiting exposure to others. Staying in a cohort also makes contact tracing easier and faster if there is a suspected case of COVID-19.

Talk to your child about some of the new health measures to help them prepare for the first day of school:

- Sanitize hands before entering school and classrooms
- Keep a distance between others and follow marks in hallways
- · Do not share food or personal items
- · Cover coughs and sneezes
- · Tell staff if feeling sick at school

- Lunch and recess time may change to allow for more physical distancing
- Students may be asked to stay in their own cohort to decrease contact with others
- Students who take the bus will have to sit in the same seat every day.

Your child may feel nervous about what school will be like. While there will be changes, the key school experience will be the same as before—they will learn in class with their teacher and see friends.

# BLUE-GREEN ALGAE (CYANOBACTERIA) BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR MATCHAYAW (DEVIL'S) LAKE

#### Submitted by Alberta Health Services

A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Matchayaw (Devil's) Lake. Visitors to this lake, as well as residents living near the shores, are advised to take the following precautions: • Avoid all contact with bluegreen algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

• Do not swim or wade, or allow your pets to swim or wade in any areas where blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) is visible.

• Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets. • Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Matchayaw (Devil's) Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae can be bluegreen, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae or who ingest water containing blue-green algae may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

are at risk of these symptoms.
Exposure to the blue-green algae may be fatal to pets.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Matchayaw (Devil's) Lake, until further notice. Please note that areas of Matchayaw (Devil's) Lake in which the blue-green algae bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this blue-green algae Health Advisory is in place.

# TRUDEAU PROROGUES PARLIAMENT AMID WE SCANDAL

Justin Trudeau and the Liberal government are wrapped up in a scandal once again; this time they needed to prorogue Parliament. Prime Minister Justin Trudeau is under investigation by the Conflict of Interest and Ethics Commissioner for the third time since 2015. First, he was under investigation for illegally accepting a vacation to the Aga Khan's private island in 2016. Last year he was under investigation for the SNC Lavalin scandal. Now, Trudeau is dealing with his latest ethical lapse, the WE scandal Back in April, Trudeau announced the Canada Student

Service Grant (CSSG). This was one of many programs the government had announced to help Canadians get through the COVID-19 pandemic. The stated objective of the program was to deliver financial compensation to students volunteering over the summer. These funds would have helped many youths finance their education upon returning to school in the fall. Instead, the money for this program ended up in the hands of Trudeau's friends at WE Charity. The government repeatedly claimed that WE was the only organization ca-pable of running this program despite the fact that WE Charity had no experience running a program of this size ever before. When the \$900,000,000 contract was awarded it did not even go to WE Charity, it was sent to a shell corporation setup by WE with no financial history.

In July, WE Charity backed out of the deal after Conservatives discovered that Trudeau did not recuse himself from the decision to award WE this contract. Additionally, it was discovered that Trudeau's family had received \$500,000 in compensation from WE since he had been elected Prime Minister. Conservatives have been using the tools at our disposal and working hard to get answers for Canadians. Since the news initially broke, the Finance Committee and the Ethics Committee have been tirelessly attempt-

ing to get to the bottom of all of this. Conservatives have made huge headway on this fact-finding mission. In fact, within 24 hours of MP Pierre Poilievre receiving 5000 pages of redacted documents regarding the WE scandal, Minister of Finance Bill Morneau resigned, and Trudeau asked the Governor General to prorogue parliament.

What does it really mean to prorogue Parliament? Many people have reached out asking questions as to what this means and why Trudeau can prorogue Parliament without holding a vote on it. The answer is that a sitting Prime

speech will be delivered on September 23rd and following that there will be a vote of no confidence and if passed, would trigger an election.

If Trudeau wanted to introduce a throne speech and test the confidence of the House, he could have simply allowed these important committees to continue their work and then prorogue Parliament in the days before his proposed date for a Speech from the Throne (September 23rd). Instead he chose to shut down the Opposition's last avenue for accountability so that he can avoid the tough questions.

Minister reserves the right to request that the Governor General prorogue the House of Commons. Trudeau requested a prorogation and his handpicked Governor General Julie Payette complied. Proroguing the House of Commons effectively resets it to a post-election state without having an election. This means there is now no business on the docket and no committees formed. Already, during the COVID Committee, our ability to hold the Liberals to account was limited. Now, it is non-existent. A new throne

- 2. Research permits. Most home renovation projects need to be approved by the local municipality. Go to the permit office and find out the requirements. - 3. Change up the appearance. Look at the type of hardware you have around



# GET AHEAD OF CHIMNEY REPAIR THIS SEASON

Woodburning fireplaces or fuel stoves can add warmth and ambiance to a home. These appliances are particularly coveted in the cooler months when people spend more time indoors. Maintenance is necessary in order for fireplaces and stoves to function safely, and that upkeep must include paying close attention to the functionality of the chimney.

Chimneys are designed to last for decades. Cracks and spalling in brick chimneys are common concerns that can cause significant damage if left unchecked.

Chimney maintenance involves more than cleaning the flue. Rather than running the risk of costly repairs, which can cost several thousand dollars, homeowners can take

some simple steps to keep their chimneys in tip-top shape. Certain components of chimney maintenance are doit-yourself tasks, while others may be better left to the professionals.

• Start from the inside and ensure that dampers are working properly. When using fireplaces and other appliances, dampers need to be open to allow smoke to vent outside; otherwise, smoke will be trapped in the home and could lead to carbon monoxide buildup. Dampers need to be fixed or replaced if they are not operational. Replacement fireplace dampers should be snug and not have any gaps, states Vertical Chimney Care.

• Conduct a visual inspection of the chimney to check for any cracks or spalling.

Spalling is the wearing away of masonry due to water, weather and time. If enough of the material erodes, that erosion can adversely affect the structural integrity of the chimney. Some repairs can be made by patching up cracks or replacing missing bricks. Chimney tuckpointing is the process of repairing mortar.

• Think about waterproofing the chimney to prevent damage. A water sealant applied to the outside of the chimney can prevent moisture from breaking down the masonry.

• Inspect and replace the chimney cap if it is worn out. A chimney cap is a contraption that sits atop the chimney to allow the smoke to vent while also preventing critters and water from going inside the flue, helping to extend the flue

life. The chimney cap attaches to the flue liner, so outside dimensions should be taken to ensure the cap is the right size for the chimney.

• Have the chimney swept. Sweeping helps remove the soot and debris that clings to the inside of the flue, known as creosote. The amount of time the fireplace is used will determine how often the chimney must be cleaned. Generally speaking, the chimney liner needs to be cleaned if it has 1/8-inch or more of soot

Regular inspection and maintenance can help keep a chimney working safely for decades. For those who do not like working at such an elevation, leave exterior chimney repair to a certified professional.

# SIGNS YOUR GUTTERS ARE IN NEED OF REPAIR

Fall is a great time to tackle projects around the house. The weather each fall allows homeowners to make improvements to their homes' exteriors without worrying about extreme heat or cold, while interior projects like painting are made easier because homeowners can open the windows to allow for proper ventilation.

Fall also marks a great time to prepare for upcoming projects that can make winter work that much easier. For example, fall is a great time to take stock of your gutters so you can address any issues before leaves begin to fall or the first snowstorm touches down. Compromised gutters can contribute to water issues in basements and adversely affect a home's foundation if not addressed immediately, so it behooves home-

owners to learn the signs that gutters are in need of repair or replacement.

• Gutters hanging off the home: Gutters were once installed predominantly with spikes. However, many industry professionals now install gutters with hanger brackets. Why the change? Spikes loosen over time, leading to the gutters hanging off the home. That can contribute to serious issues if left untreated. Gutters hanging off the home need not necessarily be replaced, but rather secured to the home, ideally with hanger brackets instead of spikes. Brackets hook into the front of the gutter and are then screwed into the fascia of a home. A professional who specializes in gutter repair can perform this task relatively quickly, and it's

an inexpensive yet highly effective solution.

 Gutter separation: Gutters that are no longer fastened together can leak and contribute to issues that affect the home's foundation, siding and appearance. Clogs and the accumulation of debris can cause gut-ters to separate because they are not designed to hold too much weight. Replacement of separated gutters may or may not be necessary depending on how big the problem is and the condition of the existing gutters. If replacement is not necessary, separated gutters may be remedied by securing the joints, another relatively simple and inexpensive fix.

• Peeling exterior paint: Paint that appears to be peeling off of your home may indicate that water is seeping over the edge of the gutter closest to your home. When that happens, water is coming down the side of the house, causing the paint to peel. In such instances, replacing the gutters is often necessary.

Basement flooding:
Not all signs of deteriorating
gutters are outside a home.
Many a homeowner has been
flummoxed by flooding in their
basements, and such flooding
can be caused by aging, ineffective gutters. That's because
deteriorating gutters sometimes allow water to leak near
the foundation of a home, contributing to basement flooding.

Fall is an ideal time to inspect gutters and have any issues fixed before leaves begin to fall or harsh winter weather arrives



- 5. Reverse hand positions and repeat.



## RCMP LAUNCHES ONLINE CRIME REPORTING ACROSS THE PROVINCE

The Alberta RCMP officially rolled out a new, province-wide online crime reporting initiative. The online crime reporting tool allows Albertans to report select property crimes online. This project has been initiated to ensure the public is able to report select crime types in whatever way is most convenient or accessible to them. A goal for the Alberta RCMP is to make sure all crime is reported, no matter how small. This provides the most accurate crime data and allows our resources to be deployed appropriately in the areas that need it most.

Citizens will be able to report the following crimes online:

- · Damage/mischief to property under \$5,000
- · Theft of bicycle under \$5,000
- Theft under \$5,000
- Theft from vehicle under \$5.000

Lost property

Incidents must also satisfy the following conditions to be reported online:

- No witnesses or suspects
- Item(s) lost or stolen must cost less than \$5,000
- Vandalized property will cost less than \$5,000 to repair
- · There are no items involving personal identity, firearms, licence plates or decals

All crimes reported online will be followed up with a phone call from a police officer in "K" Division's Call Back Unit (CBU) within five business days. The CBU was created to ensure all non-urgent calls for service are investigated efficiently and effectively. "The Alberta RCMP is always looking for new opportunities to modernize and streamline our services for all Albertans - no matter where they live in the province," says Deputy Commissioner Curtis Zablocki, Commanding Officer of Alberta RCMP. "Online crime reporting is accessible and convenient, and will help

us capture more intelligence when it comes to property crime occurring in all of the communities we serve. Offering a contactless service is also vital in these times when physical distancing is so important."

This initiative has already been piloted in Airdrie, Banff, Cold Lake, Grande Prairie, Red Deer and Strathcona County from June 1, 2020 to present. The link to report a crime online can be found here: https:// ocre-sielc.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/alberta

We encourage the public to report crime online, when possible. Reporting less serious crime online helps emergency call takers and frontline members focus their time on high-priority calls. # EXPANDING COVID-19 TESTING FOR ASYMPTOMATIC ALBERTANS

## Submitted by Government of Alberta

More than 50 Shoppers Drug Mart and Loblaw pharmacies in Real Canadian Superstore locations are already offering asymptomatic testing, and by September 1, 2020 all 234 of the company's pharmacies in Alberta (including pharmacies at Independent Foods, Extra Foods, City Market, and No Frills) will offer asymptomatic COVID-19 testing.

This is in addition to provincewide testing offered via AHS assessment centres and about 75 other community pharmacies that already offer tests. Additional community pharmacies are encouraged to register voluntarily to offer asymptomatic testing.

To date, more than 837,649 COVID-19 tests have been completed across the province.

"Since the beginning of this pandemic, Alberta has been a

leader in testing. We have consistently had the most open testing approach in Canada, and I am pleased to partner with Shoppers Drug Mart to further strengthen our capacity." - Tyler Shandro, Minister of Health

"Testing is a powerful tool that helps us limit the spread of COVID-19 and protect people from infection. Expanded testing capacity will support additional testing opportunities for all Albertans, including school teachers and staff. This will provide a baseline for school re-entry and enhance access throughout the school year." - Dr. Deena Hinshaw, Chief Medical Officer of Health

To support school re-entry, Albertans without symptoms are asked to delay testing until after the 2020-21 school year starts on Sept.1.

All Albertans are also reminded that continued adherence to public health measures

including physicial distancing, masking and hand hygiene
remain critical to the reduction of spread of COVID-19 in our province.

Asymptomatic testing

Asymptomatic Albertans are still encouraged to complete the AHS self-assessment tool to book a test, or contact a participating community pharmacy.

Each pharmacy adheres to strict protocols and has the specialized skills needed to protect patient safety. The pharmacy test is a throat swab, which is sent to Alberta Precision Labs for analysis.

Testing at pharmacies is particularly encouraged for all teachers and school staff.

Symptomatic testing

Any Albertan with symptoms of COVID-19 must book testing through AHS, via www.ahs. ca/covid.

Testing appointments for children with pre-existing medical conditions that have symptoms similar to COVID-19, such as allergies, must also be booked through AHS.

Quick facts

- Alberta has performed 837,649 tests on 677,754 Albertans.
- Strong testing data helps government and public health officials understand how our communities are affected by COVID-19 to make public health decisions.
- Only those who have no symptoms and no known exposure to COVID-19 can be tested at participating pharmacies.
- Anyone with COVID-19 symptoms or known exposure must complete the COVID-19 self-assessment or call Health Link 811.
- AHS will directly contact any Albertan who tests positive to discuss the results, begin contact tracing, and protect the public's health.

# MISERICORDIA COMMUNITY HOSPITAL BEGINS PHASED REOPENING

EDMONTON - The Misericordia Community Hospital will resume Emergency Department (ED) and labour and delivery services this afternoon and begin a phased reopening of scheduled ambulatory appointments and surgical procedures.

The Misericordia was temporarily closed to incoming patients, including the ED, on July 8 as part of Alberta Health Services' COVID-19 response to the site's full facility outbreak. Existing patients within the hospital continued to receive the treatment, care and support they required, while labouring mothers and patients with scheduled day procedures were rebooked or cared for at other Edmonton Zone hospitals.

Since July 17, 2020, there have been no new COVID-19 cases linked to the Misericordia's outbreak. As of August 14, 2020 the Misericordia outbreak is now considered over and site restrictions have been lifted.

"Early in the outbreak at the Misericordia, we took significant measures to prevent the spread of COVID\_19 and ensure the safety of patients, staff, physicians, and volunteers," says Dr. David Zygun, Medical Director, AHS Edmonton Zone.

"With an abundance of caution, and nearly a month without a new case linked to the initial outbreak, we are confident the site is ready to begin accepting incoming patients to a safe environment of care."

AHS and Covenant Health are grateful to EMS as well as staff and physicians at health-

care facilities, hospitals and in the community throughout the Edmonton Zone who worked tirelessly to accommodate an increase in patient flow due to the temporary closure of the Misericordia.

"The ability of our teams to adapt to the closure of a hospital in the Edmonton Zone is a testament to the depth of our capacity to care for Albertans during a pandemic," says Dr. Zygun. "The hard work and vigilance of our staff and physicians across the system have kept hospital transmission rates low and the environment safe for patients."

Medicine and other hospital inpatient units including the neonatal intensive care unit that continued to care for patients at the Misericordia during the temporary closure will also begin accepting incoming patients. Patients with

postponed or upcoming appointments and surgeries will be contacted to reschedule appointments and procedures.

Covenant Health and Alberta Health Services want to assure Albertans that the facility is safe for new admissions.

"Our focus continues to be on the safety of our patients, staff, physicians and visitors in the facility," said Owen Heisler, Chief Medical Officer, Covenant Health. "We are extremely grateful for our hard-working and dedicated physicians and staff who cared for patients and each other during the outbreak, both at the Misericordia or through redeployment throughout the zone."






