

NATURAL GAS VISION & STRATEGY IS A KEY PART OF ALBERTA'S RECOVERY PLAN

In Alberta we understand the economic significance of our oil and gas sector as well as the responsibility our government has to promote and foster a robust industry within our province. This last year has been difficult for many reasons, Alberta's economy has taken a significant hit, our provincial government has lost as much as 20% of its expected revenue and Covid numbers continue to increase. Despite some of these setbacks, our govern-ment is putting into place an aggressive plan to grow and capitalize on emerging opportunities for clean hydrogen, petrochemical manufacturing, liquefied natural gas (LNG) and plastics recycling. The Natural Gas Vision and Strategy is a key part of Alberta's Recovery Plan and will help to diversify our economy further, and create tens of thousands of jobs.

Projected to pass coal as the second largest energy source in the world, natural gas has many uses and is one of the main components of hydrogen, a fuel source that produces only water and no carbon emissions. With its potential to become a major part of carbon reduction targets worldwide, international demand for natural gas has continued to increase over the years. As a leader in hydrogen production, Alberta has strong carbon capture and storage infrastructure in place and the potential to be one of the lowest cost hydrogen producers on the planet. Our robust infrastructure will also allow petrochemical producers to create valuable products while simultaneously lessening their environmental impacts, helping Alberta become an important global producer. Another one of our key strategy goals rests on gaining Asian and European market access through two to three additional large-scale LNG projects by 2030. The LNG Canada project currently under construction will provide enough energy to displace 20 to 40 coal-fired power plants in Asia, reducing global GHG emissions by 60 million to 90 million tonnes of carbon dioxide each year. Growing access to global markets will help create jobs and generate billions of dollars in revenues.

As a member of the Plastics Alliance of Alberta, our government is working to establish a "circular plastics economy", a concept that has gained acceptance within the plastics and recycling industries. This

means that plastic waste is continuously reused and repurposed into new products through enhanced recycling techniques and technologies. Alberta is well-positioned to implement a circular economy for plastics thanks to our petrochemical manufacturing industry, lower transportation costs and our enhanced recycling technologies.

Finally, our natural gas strategy will include significant investments in current infrastructure to allow greater industrial use of natural gas. A

number of power-generation facilities in the province are already looking to convert to natural gas as a fuel source, increasing demand for natural gas as industrial electricity demand also climbs.

As Albertans, we already know we produce some of the most ethically sourced oil and gas in the world, now it's time for our province to lead the charge in safe and reliable energy as we continue to meet a growing global demand for clean and sustainable natural gas.





CEBA NOW OPEN TO BUSINESSES USING PERSONAL BANK ACCOUNTS

Legions are in need of financial assistance. When will the government help legions and our veterans?"



MP SOROKA'S STATEMENT IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS ON SUNCOR ENERGY LAYOFFS

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, rose in the House of Commons to address the job losses in the oil and gas sector following Suncor energy announcing it would be laying off 15% of it's staff as a result of hardships in the energy sector.

MP Soroka stated "Mr. Speaker, I rise today regarding the layoffs recently announced at Suncor Energy. A total of 15% of Suncor's

workforce will be laid off in the coming weeks. This comes directly as a result of the government's anti-energy policies. Instead of exporting our oil, the government is exporting our jobs.

Two weeks ago, the government delivered the throne speech. The only thing mentioned about oil and gas in the throne speech is how they will play a role in getting to net zero emis-

sions. I believe the Liberals' plan to get to net zero is to eliminate oil and gas in Canada. This is not a sound way to build back the economy while there is still a huge need for oil, gas and all the by-products it produces.

While the government does not support Canadian producers, it thinks nothing of bringing oil in from foreign countries, such as the United States, and instead support Donald Trump in making America great again. The Suncor layoffs are the most recent example.

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Submitted by Yellowhead County

October 27, 2020

Deputy Mayor Elected – Wade Williams was voted by Council to represent Yellowhead County as the Deputy-Mayor for one term ending on October 26, 2021.

RCMP Quarterly Updates - Representatives from the Hinton, Edson, and Evansburg RCMP detachments gave updates on recent crime statistics, emergency preparedness, and policing priorities for their areas. They stated the importance of residents to diligently report suspicious persons and vehicles and crimes as this will show trends that help local RCMP to focus on problem areas. A newly introduced Alberta RCMP online reporting service allows users to report non-emergency crimes under \$5,000.

Voting Stations Bylaw – Voting Station Bylaw 19.20 will allow for more than one voting station per division in the upcoming Yellowhead County municipal election on October 18, 2021. This bylaw will allow for more voting location options for residents living in rural areas.

County Road Allowance Request – Council denied a property owner's request to permit him to work within a road allowance located on the north end of RR171, adjacent to his property.

Culvert Replacement – Council approved administration to proceed with the design, permitting and tendering to replace a culvert on the Elk River Road. The culvert, which is approximately 3.2 metres in diameter and 35 metres long and is on a road used primarily by the oil and gas industry, was one of five sites damaged

earlier this year by a severe weather event. The replacement of the culvert is estimated at \$700,000.


ARB Training for Council – Additional members of Council will receive training that will make them eligible to sit on the Assessment Review Board (ARB). The board's purpose is to review complaints or appeals against the assessed value of

their property. The board is comprised of two members of the public and one member of Council.

County Library Board Appointments – Sheena Melin and Debbie Ceelen were appointed as members-at-large to the Yellowhead County Library Board from November 1, 2020, to October 31, 2023. The Yellowhead County Library Board

(mandated by the Alberta Libraries Act) creates bylaws and policies that shape the services provided by the local libraries in Yellowhead County.

The next scheduled regular Council meetings are November 10 & 24, 2020, at 9:30 AM. The next scheduled Governance & Priorities meeting is November 17, 2020



NOVEMBER IS FAMILY VIOLENCE PREVENTION MONTH

Keeping yourself and your loved ones safe during Family Violence and Prevention Month is as important as any other time of year. Remember, if you or a family member are in immediate danger call 911.

Often people are stressed from the added responsibilities of living in today's world. The COVID-19 pandemic has increased the pressures on families. Family dynamics can cause emotional and financial burdens. Increased expenses, job changes or loss can lead to arguments

and undue economic pressures. More time spent in close quarters with family and friends may lead to additional stress. Isolation pays a huge factor in family anxiety. Often people react to problems with increased use of alcohol and drugs; sometimes this can lead to acts of violence. Remem-

ber, acts of intimate partner violence are not your fault.

Should this happen to you, remember there is help available. Talk to a family member, friend or someone who you trust. Speaking out will help. Plan for your safety! Should you leave in a hurry, take only the necessities with you (ID, medication, bank card, money and other important documents). Have transportation available. Help your children understand what is happening by explaining to them what is going on. Pack a bag with a change of clothing and a special toy for your child. Keep your mobile phone accessible and charged, turn off your GPS or any "find my phone" apps. Stop all contact with your abusive partner and send a clear message that you want the abusive relationship to end.

If you decide to stay, your safety and that of your children's is imperative. Learn how to protect yourself from future harm and document any incidents. Call 911 should you or your family be in danger.

The staff at the Yellowhead Emergency Shelter will answer any questions you may have and help you plan for your safety. Someone is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, including all holidays. WEEKLY SUMMARY: OCTOBER 17-23

Dear friends and neighbours, Oil isn't just the driver of Alberta's economy, it's the largest single subsector of Canada's national economy. During previous times of economic uncertainty, it has been Alberta's oil sector that kept our economy afloat and guided us through the storm. While the roots of our economic challenges in 2020 differ greatly from what we faced in 2008, the fact remains that a strong Canada requires a prosperous Alberta.

I am pleased to share with you that Alberta's government will stop setting monthly oil production limits to allow producers to utilize available pipeline capacity and create jobs. While our government will extend the regulatory authority to curtail oil production through December 2021, we do not plan on resuming production limits at a time when sources of crude oil production remain offline as a result of COVID-19.

This measured approach maintains the stability and predictability vital for investor confidence and allows our government to respond swiftly if there is a risk of storage reaching maximum capacity while enabling industry to produce as the free market intended.

The completion of



long-awaited pipelines that we have fought tirelessly for – including Keystone XL, the Trans Mountain expansion and Enbridge Line 3 – will enhance Alberta's permanent ability to balance production and takeaway capacity, ensuring our resources are exported at full value.

Getting a driver's license is a significant milestone, critical to the lives and livelihoods of Albertans, and this shouldn't be challenged by limited road test availability. As a result of the NDP nationalizing road

tests in March 2019, half of Alberta's driver examiners left the system and wait times increased significantly. The damage was only compounded when COVID-19 resulted in even longer wait times and backlogs.

To provide Albertans with quicker access to road tests, our government has re-privatized driver exams for class 4, 5 and 6 licenses.

Returning to a privately-run model will restore a system which Albertans used for years with confidence. Albertans will be able to book passenger vehicle road tests directly with local registry agents or through a new online system starting Dec. 1 for tests to be conducted after Jan. 5, 2021. Registry agents will be able to hire or contract driver examiners directly.

MP SOROKA QUESTIONS THE GOVERNMENT ON BIG HORN MINE EXPANSION

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, rose in the House of Commons to ask the government when the Big Horn Mine in Hinton will finally receive approval to expand operations.

MP Soroka asked "Mr. Speaker, last December, the environment minister declined to order an impact assessment of the Bighorn mine outside of Hinton, saying that it would be dealt with by provincial approval. However, on July 30, ministerial discretion was used to designate the Vista mine expansion to be under federal review.

When will the government finally admit that it does not want any form of natural extraction in Canada?"

In Response, Mr. Peter Schiefke

(Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Environment and Climate Change), had this to say, "Mr. Speaker, my hon. colleague could not be further from the truth. The reality is that we have and continue to support our energy sector workers. Just during this pandemic, we invested over \$1.7 billion to help clean up abandoned oil wells. We have invested \$750 million to support the efforts in the oil sector to reduce

its greenhouse gas emissions. We have put in place measures to support the workers, and we will continue to do that.

We are going to continue to support all Canadians, regardless of what sector they are in. We are going to be there for Canadians.'



INDICATORS IT'S TIME TO CHANGE AIR FILTERS

Vehicle maintenance can protect drivers' investments and help their automobiles run efficiently. One area drivers should pay particular attention to is their vehicles' air filters. When operating at optimal capacity, an air filter improves fuel effi-

ciency while ensuring vehicles accelerate smoothly without taxing the engine. But when air filters are clogged, fuel efficiency is reduced and emissions are increased, a 1-2 punch that costs motorists money and hurts the planet at the same time. Drivers can check their owners' manuals to determine the recommended intervals to replace air filters, but the following are a handful of indicators that suggest it's time to change them.

Gas mileage: Unless you just purchased your vehicle, you likely know how many miles you can drive on a full tank of gas. If that gas mileage is suddenly slipping and you find yourself visiting the filling station more frequently, then it might be time to replace your air filter.

Engine light: Drivers may be alerted to engine issues when the "Check engine" lights up on the vehicle's dashboard. This light may come on to indicate a problem with the air filter, as clogged air filters reduce air flow to the engine, resulting in an imbalanced air-fuel mixture that adversely affects the engine.

Starting and idling problems: Vehicles sometimes don't start up as smoothly as they once did, and drivers may also notice vehicles are not idling smoothly. These symptoms may indicate misfiring spark plugs that are being polluted (and made less effective) by a dirty air filter that is reducing the flow of air to the

Acceleration difficulties: Automobiles that are operating at peak capacity accelerate quickly. But dirty, worn out air filters adversely affect acceleration. Drivers who notice that their cars are struggling to accelerate when stoplights turn green or on highways may need to replace their

vehicles' air filters.

Dirty air filter: Perhaps the biggest indicator that an air filter needs to be replaced is the filter itself. If you cannot find the air filter on your own, consult your vehicle owner's manual to determine where it is. Once you find the air filter, examine it in broad daylight. Clean air filters are white, so if the filter has darkened, it may need to be replaced.



ADDRESS WINDSHIELD DAMAGE PROMPTLY

Windshields are designed to protect drivers and their vehicles from wind and other natural elements while the cars are in motion.

Windshields are made from tempered glass, which is processed by controlled thermal or chemical treatments to increase its strength compared to normal glass. While relatively strong for a pieces of glass, windshields are not impervious to damage. All it takes is a single rock or piece of road debris to be kicked up from the roadway and hit the windshield to cause a problem.

Every day, motorists encounter pebbles or other small missiles that bounce up from the road and come in contact with their windshields. Many deflect with no problem, but under high speeds, debris can cause chips, dings, and even cracks in the windshield.

Cracks easily spread from road vibration and heat and can compromise the integrity of the windshield. If your car's windshield is cracked and it shatters during a collision, you and your passengers are at great risk of injury. In addition, police officers can write tickets if windshields appear to be unsafe. So it's in drivers' best interests to repair damaged windshields promptly.

Drivers may be able to repair small dings themselves with a do-it-yourself windshield kit available at automotive retailers. If a crack is less than six to 12 inches long, it can probably be repaired as well. However, more significant damage will require that the entire windshield be replaced

CONNECT CARE WAVE 2 LAUNCHES TO SUPPORT HEALTHCARE FRONTLINES

On October 24, 2020, Alberta Health Services (AHS) launched Connect Care Wave 2 at several suburban locations in the Edmonton Zone.

Wave 2 includes acute care, long-term care, hospice, post-acute units and the related suburban pharmacies, diag-

nostic imaging and Alberta Precision Laboratory sites.

In addition to approximately 4,875 staff, and 1,100 physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and dentists, the following hospitals, sites and programs are part of the Wave 2 launch:

- Devon General Hospital;
- Fort Saskatchewan Community Hospital;

- Leduc Community Hospital;
- Redwater Health Centre (lab only);
- Strathcona Community Hospital (Sherwood Park);
- Sturgeon Community Hospital (St. Albert);
- WestView Health Centre (Stony Plain);
- North East Community Health Centre (Edmonton);

- Continuing Care Access;
- Palliative Community Consult Team:
- Northern Alberta Renal Program.

The launch of Wave 2 comes a year after the successful launch of Wave 1, which saw Connect Care implemented at the Walter C Mackenzie Campus, East Edmonton Health Centre, Pharmacy and Diagnostic Imaging sites in the Edmonton Zone, Alberta Precision Labs sites in Edmonton and the North Zone, DynaLIFE sites across Alberta, labs at the Cross Cancer Institute, and hundreds of ambulatory clinics in the Edmonton Zone.


The full Connect Care launch will be deliberate and cautious, with nine implementation waves in total, happening between late 2019 and 2023. Patients, physicians, nurses, other frontline staff and technical teams have been instrumental in building the system and preparing for the launch.

The wave approach means we are able to fix issues as they appear, allowing us to learn and adapt the system before we roll it out in other areas.

We already know Connect Care adds value. As the COVID-19 pandemic demands increased, Wave 1 sites and programs were able to use Connect Care to support COVID-19 care.

Connect Care was adapted to meet the needs of staff and patients, including adding information to the system for telephone and virtual visits to Connect Care, helping patients access virtual visits with their care providers, adding travel screening and COVID-19 diagnosis to patient charts, and other key elements to support the pandemic response.

"Ultimately, Connect Care will help us ensure high-quality care is being delivered in the same way no matter where you are in Alberta. It will let us record and share our patients' health information with them and their healthcare teams," said Dr. Belanger.




