Confirmed COVID-19 cases are increasing in our community and across the province. Recognizing how COVID-19 is impacting Whitecourt and our region, community members are asked to remain vigilant in mitigating the risk of getting sick or spreading COVID-19.

How you can help

People must continue to practice physical distancing to limit the spread of COVID-19 and reduce the risk of getting sick. To protect yourself and others:

• Keep at least 2-metres distance from people outside your household or cohort group. Maintaining a cohort is extremely important as it keeps the same people together, rather than mixing and mingling, which helps reduce a person's chance of getting sick. Alberta's Chief Medical Officer recently recommended that a person should limit themselves to no more than 3 cohorts (i.e. personal, work, sports, school, etc.).

• Wear a mask in public when distancing is not possible.

• Follow Alberta's guidelines for gatherings and keep family visits, friend gatherings and group outings small within your designated cohorts.

• Practice good hygiene by washing or sanitizing your hand often, and avoid touching your face.

• Stay home if you are feeling sick.

Whitecourt's continued monitoring and response to the COVID-19 pandemic

The Town of Whitecourt Emergency Coordination Centre, which has been active since March 2020, continues to monitor the COVID-19 pandemic across Alberta. Whitecourt has a continuity plan in place to ensure essential services, such as water service and road maintenance, continue in our community uninterrupted.

In consideration of rising case numbers, a Temporary Mandatory Face Coverings Bylaw will be forwarded to Council for review and consideration. Similar to other municipalities, it is proposed that should the Province move Whitecourt to a "watch" status, it would be mandatory for members of the public to wear face coverings in indoor public places. A "watch" status requires two indicators: at least 10 active cases and more than 50 active cases per 100,000. The proposed bylaw is scheduled to be reviewed and deliberated at the Regular Meeting of Council on Monday, November 9 at 7:00 p.m.

slated to end March 2021 Under the authority of the *Pest Control Products Act*, Health Canada is cancelling the registration of all strychnine products used to control Richardson ground squirrels. To comply with the re-evaluation decision, the phase-out of 2% Liquid Strychnine Concentrate is subject to the following timeline:

- Sale by <u>Registrant</u> ends March 4, 2021
- Sale by <u>Retailer</u> ends March 4, 2022
- The last date of permitted use is March 4, 2023



ADDRESS WINDSHIELD DAMAGE PROMPTLY

Windshields are designed to protect drivers and their vehicles from wind and other natural elements while the cars are in motion.

Windshields are made

from tempered glass, which is processed by controlled thermal or chemical treatments to increase its strength compared to normal glass. While relatively strong for a pieces of



glass, windshields are not impervious to damage. All it takes is a single rock or piece of road debris to be kicked up from the roadway and hit the windshield to cause a problem.

Every day, motorists encounter pebbles or other small missiles that bounce up from the road and come in contact with their windshields. Many deflect with no problem, but under high speeds, debris can cause chips, dings, and even cracks in the windshield.

Cracks easily spread from road vibration and heat and can compromise the integrity of the windshield. If your car's windshield is cracked and it shatters during a collision, you and your passengers are at great risk of injury. In addition, police officers can write tickets if windshields appear to be unsafe. So it's in drivers' best interests to repair damaged windshields promptly.

Drivers may be able to repair small dings themselves with a do-it-yourself windshield kit available at automotive retailers. If a crack is less than six to 12 inches long, it can probably be repaired as well. However, more significant damage will require that the entire windshield be replaced.





SIGNS HEADLIGHTS MAY NEED TO BE REPLACED

Automobiles require a little TLC to stay on the road and operate efficiently. When vehicle maintenance is ignored, vehicles operate less efficiently and, in many instances, less safely as well.

Jerking and stalling is a telltale sign of engine trouble, but some vehicle problems are more subtle. One such problem is fading headlights. Fading headlights can pose a significant threat to drivers and their passengers as well as fellow motorists. According to the National Safety Council, drivers do only one-quarter of their driving at night. However, the NSC notes that 50 percent of traffic deaths occur at night. Such figures highlight the potential dangers of nighttime driving, which only becomes more dangerous if headlights are not operating at optimal capacity.

Since drivers do most of their driving during the daytime, it's easy to overlook headlight performance. However, it's important that drivers learn to recognize the signs that headlights need to be replaced.

Dimming

Dimming headlights do not necessarily require replacement. In some instances dimming headlights are a byproduct of a dirty car. The buildup of dirt and grime can reduce light output even when the headlights are otherwise fine. If your car is dirty, take it to the car wash and make sure the headlights are scrubbed clean of dirt and grime. Then drive at night to see if the light output of your headlights is still dim. If so, the headlight bulbs may need to be replaced.

Flickering

Flickering headlights can indicate anything from worn out headlight bulbs to a weak car battery to loose connections. Flickering is one of the more dangerous headlight issues, as it can lead to headlights suddenly going dark while drivers are on the road at night. If headlights are flickering, take the car to a mechanic as soon as possible to have the issue resolved.

One light out

When one headlight goes dark, chances are the other is not far behind. Automotive experts recommend replacing headlight bulbs in pairs, even if only one bulb has gone dark, because this ensures equal light output.

Headlight maintenance tends to be overlooked. But recognizing the signs of fading headlights can help drivers avoid accidents and vastly improve the safety of nighttime driving.




