DRAYTON VALLEY RCMP SEIZE DRUGS AND CHARGE MALE FOR TRAFFICKING

On November 24, 2020, Drayton Valley RCMP were at a residence in Drayton Valley conducting an investigation on an unrelated matter when members observed drugs in plain view. Drayton Valley RCMP along with the assistance of the Drayton Valley RCMP General Investigation Section (GIS) obtained a search warrant.

On November 24, 2020, Drayton Valley RCMP and the GIS unit executed a search warrant on the residence. During the search, police located and seized a considerably large quantity of fentanyl, methamphetamine, cocaine and various drug trafficking paraphernalia

CRA OPENS APPLICATIONS FOR THE CANADA EMERGENCY RENT SUBSIDY

Submitted by Gerald Soroka, MP for Yellowhead

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead is pleased to advise that qualifying organizations can apply directly for the new Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy (CERS) through the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) without the need to claim the assistance through their land-

lords. Applicants can claim the subsidy retroactively for the period that began on September 27 and ended on October 24, 2020. Applications for the second CERS period (October 25 to November 21, 2020) will open on November 30.

Organizations can include rent and other eligible amounts already paid in respect of a claim period as well as amounts that are

payable for the claim period when submitting their CERS applications. Amounts that are not paid at the time of the application will have to be paid no later than 60 days after payment of the subsidy.

CRA will collect applications over the coming days and, on November 30, process applications received to date.

MELT CHANGES

Submitted by MLA Mark Smith | Drayton Valley – Devon Constituency

Alberta is an exporting province, but today it is harder to hire truckers to get our goods to market. Alberta is expected to have a shortage of 3,600 commercial truck drivers by 2023. Without the freight industry to feed our cities and supply the world with our natural resources and manufactured products, our economy will suffer.

We've been listening closely to our farmers, foresters, roughnecks, and freight truckers. They've told us that cost is the biggest barrier to hiring Albertans to good-paying trucking jobs. The Mandatory Entry Level Training (MELT) required to get a Class 1 commercial license is necessary to keep

Albertans safe on the road. However the average cost of \$8,900 in Alberta for the 113 hour course is also prohibitive for many.

That's why Alberta's government is making big changes to boost Alberta trucking jobs.

We're funding the Driving Back to Work grant program to make MELT more affordable. The grant will cover 90% of the training costs for 300 unemployed Albertans.

We want to make sure that applicants for the grant are ready, willing, and able to participate. By having applicants still responsible for a portion of the required costs, we will ensure those who receive the funding are committed to this training.

We've also launched the Experience and Equivalency program to reduce the time it takes for Class 3 drivers to upgrade to a Class 1 license. Class 3 drivers with a minimum of two years of experience will have the opportunity to take a 40-hour Class 1 training upgrade instead of the full 113-hour Class 1 MELT. This recognizes the skills many Class 3 drivers have, particularly in our agriculture industry.

Neither of these changes affect the high training and safety standards set out by MELT in order to keep Alberta's roads safe. All applicants will still be required to pass the Class 1 MELT knowledge and road test to obtain their Class 1 commercial license.

By improving access to trucking jobs, Albertans can get back to work. We will remain focused on Alberta's economic recovery.

UNWRAPPING RED TAPE ON CHRISTMAS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Eliminating the fee will save Albertans almost \$100,000 and make it easier for individuals to get their own Christmas trees and firewood from Alberta's 87 million acres of forested land.

"I hope Albertans take the time to go out with their families to find the perfect Christmas tree this year. Alberta has so much to offer and we're blessed to live in the most free and open place in the world." - Devin Dreeshen, Minister of Agriculture and Forestry

Through the Personal Use Forest Products Permit, Albertans will receive a map of where they can go to access their trees. Permits can be obtained online. For a confirmation email that includes a digital version of the permit, Albertans must click "view" after completing all steps. If you have any questions, reach out to one of Alberta's forest area offices.

"The Christmas tree is an important symbol of hope and joy this coming Christmas season. By cutting red tape and adopting a best practice, we're giving a little light to Albertans whose tradition includes retrieving their own trees." - Grant Hunter, Associate Minister of Red Tape Reduction

A Personal Use Forest Products Permit is valid for 30 days. During that 30-day period, the permit holder may harvest up to:

- three Christmas trees
- five cubic metres of fire-wood
- five cubic metres of roundwood, often used for fence posts and rails
- 20 tree transplants

Five cubic metres represents about three level

truckloads.

Background

Getting a permit before harvesting Crown timber is still the law. Permits help preserve our forests for generations to come by keeping track of the number of trees being harvested, outlining rules to be followed and ensuring that public harvesting is done safely. The Personal Use Forest Products Permit is for small-scale

personal use only. Any timber harvested with this permit is not for resale.

Harvesting without a permit or selling Crown timber are contraventions under Forests Act Section 10 and Timber Management Regulation Section 68. The penalty ranges from a minimum of \$50 to several thousand dollars based on the amount of timber harvested. If the volume of timber is signif-

icant, the Crown is authorized by the Forests Act to seize all of the harvested volume and could pursue prosecution.

Quick facts

- There were 8,116 provincial permits sold for Christmas trees in 2018 and 8,353 permits sold in 2019.
- Another approximately 10,000 permits per year are sold for other approved uses such as firewood.



Mask Bylaw – Council voted to postpone a vote on the Face Covering Bylaw until after the provincial government's announcement scheduled for 4:30 pm on

November 24, 2020.

Hamlet Waste Collection – GFL Environmental was awarded a 3-year contract (2021-2023) for residential garbage collection in Wildwood and Evansburg. GFL will be introducing mechanical bin curbside pickup in the hamlets with bins

supplied by GFL. The contract amount is \$9.75/house each month in 2021; \$10.53 for 2022; and \$11.37 in 2023. Residents will receive new bins and details prior to the start of the new system.

Municipal Emergency Plan Adopted – Yellowhead County Council adopted the Municipal Emergency Plan (MEP), which guides municipal response and management in Yellowhead County during an emergency. The MEP covers staff's roles and responsibilities, outside agencies and their functions, the procedure for declaring a State of Local Emergency and other actions required in an emergency.


2020 Tax Write-Off – Council approved the write-off of \$877,582.44 in unpaid taxes from the energy industry. This amount is the combined taxes from several companies that have gone through receivership or declared bankruptcy and can no longer be collected by the county.

As a result of this investigation, Logan Merle Bruner (33) of Drayton Valley has been charged with the following offences:

- Possession for the purpose of trafficking fentanyl
- Possession for the purpose of trafficking methamphetamine
- Possession for the purpose of trafficking cocaine

Following a judicial hearing, Bruner was released from custody and is scheduled to appear in Drayton Valley Provincial Court on December 15, 2020.

"Drayton Valley RCMP remain committed to prioritizing drug trafficking investigations," says Cpl. Ryan Hoetmer, NCO i/c Drayton Valley GIS Unit. "Drug trafficking is a serious offence that typically creates a large number spin off offences related to the addiction associated with these drugs, including property crime, violence and theft."






