### ARREST MADE FOR ATM THEFTS

Submitted by Eastern Alberta District General Investigation Section

Gunn, Alta. - During the afternoon of Nov. 30, 2020, at approximately 11:30 a.m., the Eastern Alberta District General Investigation Section (EADGIS) with assistance from the RCMP Emergency Response Team (ERT) and RCMP Air Services, attempted to apprehend an individual wanted on numerous outstanding warrants.

The individual was followed to a rural area near Barrhead where he evaded capture after fleeing in a motor vehicle.

On Dec. 1, 2020 at approximately 1:20 p.m., EADGIS with the assistance of ERT and the Central Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit, collaborated in the arrest of the same male pursued the previous night.

Darwyn Ronald Beaudry

(38) of no fixed address was arrested in Gunn, Alta., after exiting a vehicle and fleeing on foot.

EADGIS became involved in attempting to locate Beaudry after a lengthy year long investigation into ATM thefts around the province of Alberta spanning from September 2019 to Nov. 17, 2020. Beaudry was identified as a suspect in multiple investigations and is alleged to have committed a number of crimes which resulted in significant property damage in the towns of Legal, and Slave Lake. The ATM thefts were from a credit union and gas station. He is also alleged to have committed a break and enter into the No Frills Pharmacy in Vegreville, Alta., which occurred on Nov. 20, 2019.

Beaudry is facing 23 charges from multiple RCMP detachments. Some of the charges include:

- Participation in a criminal organization
- Flight from police
- Resisting arrest
- Disguise with intent (x3)
- Break and enter/theft (x5)

He was remanded into custody after a judicial hearing and is set to appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court on Dec. 9, 2020.

"These ATM investigations have now resulted in over 100 charges and continue," says Corporal Robert Burgess, EADGIS. "We continue to follow up on calls received with additional information and more arrests are anticipated."

EADGIS continue to investigate the ATM thefts that occurred in the towns noted and are asking anyone with information regarding these thefts to contact them at 780-645-8870. If you wish to remain anonymous, you can contact Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477 (TIPS).



# A MESSAGE FROM MLA MARK SMITH

Albertans are facing a critical situation with rising rates of COVID-19 and a quadrupling of outbreaks in continuing care facilities. This health emergency is putting the lives of our most vulnerable and our seniors at risk.

These are our parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles, friends, and mentors. They're the people who built Alberta and we must do everything we can to keep them safe while minimizing damage to our broader social health.

There are more than 13,000 active cases of COVID-19 in Alberta. If we do not slow the sharp rise in both hospitalizations and ICU admissions, COVID-19 will threaten our ability to deliver health services that Albertans rely on.

This is why our government recently announced targeted measures to protect the lives and livelihoods of Albertans. New restrictions and increased enforcement will reduce spread in targeted communities, protect hospitals, keep schools and businesses open as much as possible, and protect vulnerable Albertans.

This pandemic poses the greatest challenge our province has faced in more than a generation. Every decision we make in responding to it impacts the lives of our friends and neighbours. As a result, Alberta's government has resisted calls for a blanket lockdown of our society because of the profound damage it would cause, especially for the poor and vulnerable who would be the most affected.

A provincial lockdown would throw hundreds of thousands of Albertans out of work, deepen the mental health and addiction crisis, and pose a potential violation of Albertans' constitutionally-protected rights and freedoms.

Our approach stands in stark contrast to the economically devastating measures that the NDP is demanding. When asked during an interview with Danielle Smith if all restaurants and bars should be closed, the NDP leader responded saying "yes".

Alberta's restaurant sector is one of the largest sources of employment in the province, particularly for women and new Canadians. Alberta's government does not support the unscientific and unconstitutional demands of Rachel Notley's NDP to shut down this entire economic sector.

Instead, we focused on targeted measures aimed at places where the data clearly shows COVID-19 was spreading. With adherence to public health guidelines, many services Albertans love and enjoy, including retail, movie theatres, and restaurants, will remain open.



# TOUGH, SWIFT PENALTIES FOR IMPAIRED DRIVERS

# Submitted by Government of Alberta

Starting Dec. 1, police will be able to administer stricter impaired driving penalties on the road, while most first-time impaired driving charges will be handled quicker outside of court through SafeRoads Alberta. Impaired drivers could face larger fines and lose their vehicles for up to 30 days.

SafeRoads Alberta, a new adjudication branch, will allow drivers to pay their fees online, request more time to pay their penalty, or dispute their Immediate Roadside Sanction or vehicle seizure.

In the most serious cases, including repeat offenders and impaired driving causing bodily harm or death, individuals will still receive criminal charges on top of the other penalties.

"MADD Canada welcomes the implementation of these new measures to address the impaired driving problem, and we thank the Government of Alberta for its leadership. These measures deliver strong, immediate penalties and sanctions to those individuals who continue to disregard the law and put lives in danger by driving impaired. They will reduce impaired driving and save lives." - Andrew Murie, chief executive officer, MADD Canada

"Impaired driving tragic consequences that devastate families communities. Alberta's new impaired driving framework delivers immediate penalties that match the seriousness of this crime and are proven to reduce impaired driving and make roads safer. What's most sobering, however, is that every case of impaired driving is completely preventable - we implore all Albertans to make a plan and separate substance use from driving." - Jeff Kasbrick, vice-president of government and stakeholder relations, AMA

Quick facts

- Under the new impaired driving laws, significant penalties will be handed out roadside, getting impaired drivers off the streets immediately. Stronger penalties for impaired driving include:
  - Fines of up to \$2,000
- Vehicle seizure up to 30 days
- New mandatory education programs for repeat offenders
- Mandatory ignition interlock for repeat offenders
- New zero-tolerance consequences for novice drivers and commercial drivers will also be introduced.
- The Alberta Transportation Safety Board will finish hearing cases submitted before Dec. 1 and is expected to wrap up operations by March 31, 2021.

# JOINT SECONDER ON BILL C-205 TO AMEND THE HEALTH OF ANIMALS ACT



OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead is pleased to advise that he is a joint seconder on Conservative MP John Barlow's Private Members' Bill, C-205, 'An Act to amend the Health of Animals Act (Biosecurity on Farms).' This Bill will make it an offence under the Health of Animals Act to enter, without lawful authority or excuse, a place in which animals are kept if doing so could result in the exposure of the animals to a disease or toxic substance.

The Act currently provides for the control of diseases and toxic substances that may affect animals or may be transmitted by animals to persons. However, the obligations and prohibitions apply in respect of the owner of the animals. Currently, there is nothing which addresses trespassers. This legislation aims to change that situation.

This Bill will not, in any way. limit an individual's right to peacefully protest on public property. However, it will increase the penalties for groups and organizations who encourage individuals to threaten the biosecurity of animals and workers.

Bill C-205 is scheduled for debate in the House on November 26th.





# HOMICIDE SUSPECT ARRESTED

ger (31) of Spruce Grove was arrested without incident and charged with second degree murder. He was remanded into custody and has been returned to B.C.

cies. Crime transcends borders and by working together with partner agencies and sharing information, police continue to keep their communities safe.

Parkland Drug Unit concluded a drug investigation in Spruce Grove / Stony Plain. Members of the Parkland RCMP Drug Unit with the assistance of the Parkland Serious Crimes Unit obtained and executed warrants at various locations in Spruce Grove. Items related to drug trafficking were located during the searches including:

- 50 g of cocaine
- 59 g of methamphetamine
- 400 ml of GHB
- Paraphernalia related to drug trafficking
- A firearm with 95 rounds of ammunition
- A large amount of Canadian currency

Jacob Roach (31) and Chanelle Vandal-Lauman (25) of Spruce Grove, Alta. and Brandon Regamey (24) of Leduc, Alta. were arrested for numerous charges.

The three suspects were charged with Unlawful possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking (x3).

Additionally Brandon Regamey and Channelle Vandal-Lauman are charged with:

- Occupy a motor vehicle knowing it contained a firearm
- Possess a loaded prohibited firearm without authorization

Brandon Regamey has six more charges of possess a firearm while prohibited and six charges of fail to comply with probation order.

Channelle Vandal-Lauman has six additional charges of fail to comply with release or-

All three are scheduled to appear in Stony Plain Provincial

Court on Dec. 16, 2020.

On Nov. 2, 2020 Parkland RCMP issued a media release regarding the investigation of an armed robbery in the area

of Prescott Boulevard. Jacob Roach and Brandan Regamey were jointly charged in that investigation as well with offences related to aggravated assault and robbery with firearm.

No further details will be released as the matters are now
before the courts.






