EXPIRED: ALBERTA REMOVES LICENCE PLATE STICKERS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government first required registration expiry dates to be visible on Alberta licence plates in 1974. Due to advances in technology, stickers marking the month and year of registration, as well as stickers for fleet vehicles and permanent trailers, will no longer be issued in 2021.

In fall 2021, Alberta will transition to high-definition reflective licence plates. The reflective plates are more easily scanned by automated licence plate readers, which will assist law enforcement agencies using that technology to validate licence plate registration at roadside.

Reflective plates will be issued on a go-forward basis after the current stock of painted licence plates runs out in the fall.

"Registry agents support this next step to modernizing the delivery of registry services. We applaud Minister Glubish for taking the initiative to make changes that will benefit Albertans and cut red tape." - Rikki McBride, chief executive officer, Association of Alberta Registry Agents

Alberta drivers and vehicle owners will still be responsible for renewing their registration on time, and will still require a valid certificate of vehicle registration. Albertans can sign up to receive an electronic renewal notice through a registry agent, the Alberta Motor Association, or My-Alberta eServices.

Quick facts

- There are more than 5.5 million vehicles registered in Alberta.
- The government current-

ly spends about \$1.2 million per year to print, ship and store expiry stickers for licence plates.

- Stickers will still be required for farm vehicles and prorated commercial vehicles participating in the International Registration Plan
- Vehicle registrations expire at midnight on the last day of an assigned month, based on surname or company name.
- One-year online vehicle registration renewals are available for passenger vehicles and motorcycles.
- Canadian jurisdictions that have eliminated the use of expiry stickers on licence plates are:
- Quebec (1992)
- Saskatchewan (2012)
- Northwest Territories (2014)
- Manitoba (2016)

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

December 8, 2020

2021 Interim Budget -Council adopted the 2021 Interim Budget to be effective January 1, 2021. The to-tal budget is \$113,399,624 and includes no increase in the municipal portion of the property tax rate. No new county programs were added to the 2021 budget and capital costs were significantly reduced compared to previous years. This interim budget consists of operations \$43,724,355; capital projects \$12,100,061; requisitions \$28,577,969; contribution to reserves \$8,064,115; contribution to local governments \$4,663,741; amortization \$16,269,383.

FCSS Year in Review – Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) continued to provide preventative social services to county residents during the pandemic, including regular social services, referrals, and information services. The results and success of their programs and services had many successful impacts on the community. Their in-person and online methods helped residents of all ages continue to be part of the community and ensure residents were aware of the available resources and services offered through FCSS.

Ag Services Year in Review – Although Agricultural Services had several setbacks brought on by the pandemic, including not hiring temporary summer staff, the department continued to provide core services required under provincial legislation. Some ag extension programs were cancelled, but several transitioned to virtual events that were very

successful and had a high participation rate.

Gravel Supply Contracts – The gravel supply for two 3-year (2021-2023) county contracts were awarded to A. Gering Ranching Ltd. These were the Williamson Gravel Supply Contract for the total amount of \$893,000 and the Rosevear Gravel Supply Contract for \$1,598,000.

Broadband Funding Application – Council approved an application partnership with Nova/Rock, 3CIS, and Morad Communications to apply Application Bid for the Rapid Response Stream, Universal Broadband Fund to support extended coverage in Yellowhead County.

Tax Write-Offs – Council approved the write-off of 5 accounts-receivables for a total of \$7,934.87 and uncollectable taxes in the amount of \$71.21.

Grazing Lease Approved

 Council approved a fiveyear lease for Pt of Block W, Plan 1035AR.

Wildwood & District Agricultural Society Lease – Yellowhead County approved a five-year lease to the Wildwood & District Agricultural Society for the portion of closed road, locally known as Fifth Avenue, which lies within Plan 902-1054.

Project Management Contract – Council, acting in partnership with the Town of Edson, awarded the Yellowhead County/ Edson Recreation Facility Project Management contract to Turnbull Construction Project Managers with a maximum cost of \$750,000.

The next scheduled regular Council meetings are January 12 & 26, 2021 at 9:30 AM. The next scheduled Governance & Priorities meeting is January 19, 2021.

MP SOROKA QUESTIONS THE MINISTER OF ENVIRONMENT ON THE LIBERAL FUEL STANDARD

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead stood in the House today and asked the Minister of Environment the following:

"Mr. Speaker, the Liberal fuel standard will increase the cost of fuel by 4 cents per litre. This increase in cost will have disproportionate effect on Canadians living in rural areas, like so many of my constituents. Rural Canadians don't have the same transportation options as those in urban centres.

Mr. Speaker, will this government make concessions for rural residents to even the playing field or will they continue gouging rural Canadians?"

The Minister's response:

"Mr. Speaker using cleaner fuels in our buildings, vehicles and industries is one of the biggest steps we can take to reduce emissions in this country. The clean fuel standard will cut pollution by up to 30 million tonnes in 2030, which is equivalent to taking seven million cars off the roads. It is going to create enormous opportunities for farmers and compa-

nies producing renewable fuels, hydrogen, and biofuels. It will encourage investments in energy efficiency that will help Canadians save money. It will assist with the faster deployment of electric vehicles. It is something that will drive innovation in this country, business opportunity and environmental sustainability."

On December 8, 2020, Council approved the 2021 interim budget for Yellowhead County. The interim budget was developed with a very conservative approach to keep operational and capital costs as low as possible. These measures are to ensure there is no increase to the municipal portion of the property tax

Capital projects, which typically form a large part of the county budget, have been kept to a minimum and reduced significantly when compared to previous years.

"We plan on operating on a reduced operational and capital budget for 2021 to reflect the current economy in our municipality and province. With the foresight of current and past councils, we have already done considerable planning and building of vital infrastructure that will keep our county moving forward into 2021 and beyond," says Yellowhead County Mayor Jim Eglinski. "We're confident in the current situation of our municipal infrastructure and of our county at this

In addition to these cost saving measures, other strategies have been included in the 2021 interim budget. These include no new increases to municipal fees and no cost-of-living increase for staff in 2021.

Out of the \$12,100,061 funding for capital projects, over half (\$6,780,912) will come from grants to help fund various projects for Protective Services, Infrastructure Services, and Community Services.

Because this budget will have a reduction of new capital projects, it better reflects the current economic situation affecting local industry, businesses, farms and Yellowhead County households.

ALBERTA'S GOVERNMENT HAS ANNOUNCED ITS COVID-19 VACCINE IMMUNIZATION PLAN AND TIMELINE

Premier Jason Kenney has appointed Deputy Minister of Municipal Affairs and former Commander of the Canadian Army, General (ret'd) Paul Wynnyk, to lead Alberta's COVID-19 Vaccine Task Force, which will direct the distribution of Covid 19 vaccines across the province. For those constituents that grew up in the Breton area they may remember Paul as he spent many of his formative years in Breton.

From his time serving in the Canadian Forces, General Wynnyk brings a wealth of experience that will be invaluable in addressing the challenges of this project.

After graduating from the Royal Military College of Canada, General Wynnyk was commissioned into the Canadian Military Engineers. There, he became commanding officer of the 1 Combat Engineer Regiment in Edmonton and later commander of the 1 Area Support Group.

When Canada was at war, Wynnyk served as Assistant Commanding General at the Combined Security Transition Command-Afghanistan. It was in this daunting role that Wynnyk oversaw the development of both the Afghan Ministry of Defense and the Afghan Army itself.

In his current role with Municipal Affairs, Wynnyk successfully spearheaded the Provincial Operations Centre's effort to procure and distribute masks, gowns, gloves and face shields amid a global rush for Personal Protective Equipment.

Smooth and rapid vaccine distribution will not only be essential to our economic recov-

ery, but it will also be a matter of life or death for many Albertans. Under the leadership of General Wynnyk, Albertans can be confident that the government is up to the challenge.

Alberta anticipates receiving enough doses of vaccine to immunize up to 435,000 of the most at-risk Albertans between January and March 2021.

Alberta's government will not make any vaccines mandatory. While some may believe this is controversial, we do not live in a country where government can inject anybody against their free will. However, it is important that as many Albertans as possible get vaccinated, and vaccinations will be provided free of charge.

Immunization will be phased process. Albertans vaccinated in Phase 1 will include long-term care and designated supported living residents and staff in those facilities, on-reserve First Nations individu-

als over age 65, seniors aged 75 and older, and health-care workers who are needed to ensure health care capacity and who are most likely to transmit COVID-19.

Phase 2 is expected to begin by April 2021 and will again be targeted to prioritized populations. Phase 3 will involve rolling out vaccinations to the general Alberta population, anticipated to start by fall 2021.

COVID-19 has changed all our lives, but this vaccine is evidence that there is light at the end of the tunnel. Alberta is ready and we will accomplish this critical task.






