During the search of these residences police seized what is believed to be 72 grams of Fentanyl, 124 grams of Methamphetamine, 8 grams of Cocaine, Psilocybin (Mushrooms), Lysergic Acid Diethylamide (LSD) And Pepper Spray.

Stephen Craig Spurrell (37) and Jamie Anne Befus (23), both of Drayton Valley have been jointly charged with:

Possession of a controlled

substance for the purpose of trafficking (X3)

- Possession of a controlled substance (X2)
- Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose
- Possession of proceeds of crime

Following judicial hearings, both Spurrell and Befus were released from custody and are scheduled to appear in Drayton Valley Provincial Court on June 15, 2021.

"The opioid crisis in Alberta continues with Alberta com-

munities seeing a record number of fatal fentanyl overdoses in the first couple of months of 2021 alone," says Cpl. Ryan Hoetmer, NCOi/c of Drayton Valley RCMP GIS. "Drayton Valley is not immune to this crisis and as police, we see the destruction that fentanyl addiction has on our community. We as a police force are dedicated to taking enforcement action against anyone who chooses to profit off the sale of this deadly product."

# A MESSAGE FROM MLA MARK SMITH

#### Submitted by MLA Mark Smith | Drayton Valley – Devon Constituency

When the COVID-19 pandemic started over a year ago, no one knew what the future held. Looking at some of the headlines from a year ago, we were less than optimistic. In the Guardian on May 22, 2020, one headline read: "Why we might not get a coronavirus vaccine." On May 7, 2020, the news channel CNBC reported: "guaranteeing the safety and efficacy of a COVID-19 vaccine, and ramping up production and distribution, will most likely push the time frame to the end of 2021, says Dale Fisher, chair of the World Health Organization's Global Outbreak Alert and Response Network."

But thanks to the tireless efforts of innovative medical experts, we are now rolling out vaccines to protect Albertans. We have been able to distribute these vaccines en masse and distribution started at the end of 2020, a year earlier than our previous best estimates.

As of today, Alberta's government has administered more than two million vaccines. This is good news, and I am encouraged that these numbers will be far higher by the time this article is published.

Over the past year, Alberta has confirmed a total of 211,836 COVID-19 cases (as of May 10, 2021), with

184,719 people recovering (May 10, 2021). As daunting as that total case numbers may be, the total recovery means that 87.2 per cent of total cases have recovered at this point.

Alberta's vaccine rollout prioritized protecting seniors and our most vulnerable. This strategy has worked overall as 76 per cent of seniors aged 75 and older are fully immunized. We began our rollout targeting health-care workers, respiratory therapists and staff in long-term care homes. We planned to protect those who can help our most vulnerable before quickly transitioning to first-responders and seniors aged 75 and up.

As a result, on May 10, 2021, some visiting restric-

tions in congregate living facilities across Alberta were eased. This means that each resident can identify up to four designated family or support people as visitors. Supporting our seniors is important and I am happy that we can ease these restrictions and I am looking forward to the near future when we can ease restrictions more substantially.

Additionally, we are seeing record enrollment in our vaccine program now that we have opened up appointments for everyone age 12 and older. Our province opened vaccines to young people faster than any other province, all while protecting seniors and our most vulnerable. This is something we can all be proud of.

We have come so far over the past year, and while the sacrifices we have had to make have been hard, we are light-years beyond where we thought we would be in early 2020. Alberta's vaccine rollout has been highly effective in protecting our most vulnerable and is now available to nearly every Albertan that wants a vaccine. We have consistently been in the top ranks for vaccinations administered since they became available last December. We are almost at the end of this and I am encouraged to see how far we have come and that soon the sacrifices we have had to make in order to protect the vulnerable and our health care capacity will soon be behind us.

# PALLIATIVE CARE SUPPORT EXPANDED

Beginning June 1, the government-sponsored Palliative Coverage program will cover the costs associated with pre-filling syringes, making it easier for people receiving palliative care and their caregivers to administer important medications, such as pain medica-

tion, and reducing costs for Albertans in palliative care.

"Albertans in palliative care often face intense, unrelenting pain and other symptoms over the course of their illness. Eliminating the cost of pre-filling syringes with medication is a significant way in which we can support these Albertans during this difficult time." - Tyler Shandro, Minister of

Health

The Palliative Coverage program provides supplementary health benefits to Albertans in palliative care who choose to stay in their home or a hospice. The program covers the cost of eligible prescription drugs, diabetic supplies and ambulance services. When this change comes into effect, the program will also cover

the cost of syringes for injectable medication and the pharmacy's cost for filling the syringes.

In 2019-2020, 5,200 Albertans received supplementary health benefits through the Palliative Coverage program. Almost 2,000 of these Albertans used injectable medications for pain management. On average, a patient receiving palliative care may require 10 to 12 syringes of pain medication each day.

"This program expands palliative care services for Albertans with life-limiting illnesses so they can receive the treatment they need in the places they call home. Appropriate and timely palliative and end-of-life care is essential and we are moving in the right direction to support palliative care patients with dignity and comfort." - Dan Williams, MLA for Peace River

- Alberta's government has committed \$20 million over four years for improving palliative care and caregiver support.
- Effective March 1, 2020, prescription drug co-payments were eliminated for Albertans receiving their medications through the Palliative Coverage program.



# Lawn & Garden

### HOW ERGONOMIC TOOLS CAN HELP GARDENERS

Gardening is a rewarding activity that has been found to provide a host of benefits beyond ensuring readily available access to fresh fruits, vegetables and awe-inspiring blooms.

How ergonomic tools differ from traditional gardening tools Ergonomic gardening tools are designed to ensure that using them has as little effect on the body as possible. Ergonomic tools align with how a person naturally moves his or her body, which can reduce the likelihood that gardeners will suffer any strains or sprains while gardening or experience any aches and pains after a day spent tending to their landscapes.

Choosing the right tools

The West Virginia University Center for Excellence in Disabilities notes that gardeners will know they have chosen the right ergonomic gardening tool for the job when they do not have to adapt the tool. Ergonomic tools should match gardeners' heights, fit their grip and feel comfortable when in use.

Specific benefits of ergonomic tools

Ergonomic gardening tools are designed in a way that can reduce stress on the body while performing various tasks. Gardeners know that aches and pains can add up after a day spent kneeling in the garden, raking soil and carrying supplies from a shed or garage around the property. But the WVUCED notes that ergonomic tools do more than just reduce gardeners' risk of injury.

Ergonomic tools increase efficiency. Wasted motions are less likely when using ergonomic tools. That can improve efficiency in the garden, allowing gardeners to get more done in the same amount of time. And because ergonomic tools are designed to work with the body, gardeners likely won't need to take breaks due to aches and pains, which also makes it easier to be more efficient when working in the garden.

· Ergonomic tools increase gardeners' capabilities. The WVUCED notes that principles behind ergonomics keep gardeners using the tools in natural positions. That means gardeners won't lose power to bending and twisting, enabling them to do more in the garden than they might be able to do when using non-ergonomic tools.

Gardening is a rewarding and beneficial activity. The right ergonomic tools for the job can enhance those benefits and make gardening even more enjoyable.




