








And watch for the dining room table that was brought to Onoway by the Beaupré family pre-1912 on a Red River cart. Can you imagine hauling this piece of furniture across the country on a horse-drawn cart?! How important it must have been!

Onoway Museum is open Monday through Friday from 10:00 to 3:00. Put a visit on your to-do list (and remember to wear a mask). A visit opens the doors to many memories and stories to share between generations.

# SUPPORTING THE TRANSITION OF CANADA'S ECONOMY TO A LOW-CARBON FUTURE

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise that on June 9th the Minister of Innovation, Science and Industry, the Premier of Alberta, and the Mayor of Edmonton, announced their governments are working closely with Air Products Canada Ltd. to advance clean energy in Canada and jointly pursue a transformative \$1.3 billion net-zero hydrogen production investment. The clean hydrogen facility would be operational by 2024, a first-mover anchor to secure Canada's early foothold in the global hydrogen market, pending further discussions and a final scope decision from the company.


The Government of Canada and Invest Alberta have each signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the company on potentially supporting the expansion of its hydrogen network and the transition to clean energy. This would involve the company building a new world-scale facility in the Edmonton region to produce clean hydrogen. This project would enable Air Products Canada Ltd. to produce hydrogen-fuelled electricity and provide liquid hydrogen for the growing transportation market, as well as other key industrial sectors.


The policy allows eligible customers who purchased a non-refundable ticket before

## **Open for Summer Lottery for First Doses**

#### Continued from Page 1

"This lottery will help us cross that 70 per cent threshold so we can reopen and stay open. Albertans have already responded in such a big way to our vaccine program and we've been able to lift many health restrictions because of their efforts. We just need one final push so we can lift them all and get back to normal. If you've been waiting to book or you've been looking for a reason to get the shot, here it is." - Jason Kenney, Premier

More than 68.5 per cent of eligible Albertans have received their first dose, including 19.2 per cent who are fully vaccinated with two doses.

As of June 12, there are

64,535 appointments booked over the next seven days for first doses. Currently, Alberta is projected to hit the 70 per cent milestone and start the two-week countdown to Stage 3 of Alberta's Open for Summer Plan on June 18.

"The arrival and uptake of the COVID-19 vaccines in our province have accomplished extraordinary things. It's only fitting that we respond in kind with a once-in-a-lifetime event in Alberta. This lottery is an investment in Albertans and our province's economic future. I am confident that we will see that final upswing in vaccinations to take us across that finish line to widespread immunity." - Tyler Shandro, Minister of Health



- Any Albertan 18 or older who received vaccines out of province is also eligible, provided they have submitted proof of vaccination to AHS and meet all other eligibility criteria.

Mr. Frederick had this to say about his retirement:



As part of the Province's Open for Summer Plan, the following come into effective as of June 10:

- Outdoor social gatherings of up to 20 people is permitted with distancing (indoor social gatherings still not permitted);
- · Indoor recreation, entertainment and other settings (recreation centres, arenas, casinos, cinemas, theatres, museums, galleries, libraries, etc.) can open at 1/3 of fire code occupancy;
- · Gyms and fitness studios can open for solo and drop-in activities and indoor fitness classes with 3-metre distanc-
- · Funeral services can be held with up to 20 people, indoors and outdoors (receptions permitted outdoors only);
- · Wedding ceremonies can be held with up to 20 people, indoors and outdoors (receptions permitted outdoors only);
- Places of worship can hold in-person services for 1/3 of fire code occupancy;
- Personal and wellness ser-

vices can resume walk-in service;

- · Post-secondary schools can resume in-person learn-
- Restaurants can open both indoor and outdoor with 6 people per table maximum;
- · Retail occupancy rates increase to 1/3 of fire code occupancy (must maintain ability to distance);
- activities (day Youth camps, overnight camps, play centres) can resume with restrictions;
- Youth and adult sports can resume with no restrictions, indoors and outdoors;
- · Outdoor public gatherings (concerts/festivals) can be held with up to 150 people;
- Outdoor fixed seating facilities (grandstands) can operate at 1/3 seated capacity;
- The work from home order is lifted but still recommend-







## ADJUSTING GOLF SWING GETS EASIER

Golfers rejoice! Those dreaded slices or hooks could become a thing of the distant past thanks to adjustable clubs and drivers. In addition to helping improve accuracy, adjustable clubs also lighten the load in your golf bag.

With a few twists of a wrench or even turning the shaft of the driver itself, golfers can adjust the face angle, loft and lie angle of the driver to hit the ball farther and straighter. Golfers can make small adjustments to create the right loft and improve distance without having to purchase a new club or visit a club fitter.

Many club manufacturers now offer adjustable drivers and other clubs. According to an informal poll on Golf.com, 34 percent of the 2,337 respondents owned an adjustable driver by the end of 2011. The ability to upgrade shafts has also become popular as golfers respond to what the pros are doing.

Adjustable golf clubs enable golfers to walk out onto the course with one driver and a few different shafts. With a couple of clicks from a wrench, a person can have an enable of clicks from a wrench,

tirely new driver. That cuts down on the equipment that needs to be carried and can fine tune a golfer's accuracy. These high-tech clubs are corresponding to changes being made to golf balls. Although golfers can now put adjustments into their own hands, it is still advisable to get a professional fitting regardless of which clubs are chosen. A certified club fitter can help a person sort through the myriad options available and make recommendations based on various factors, including the golf ball used.

Those who are not fans of adjustable drivers say that the adjustment mechanisms add weight to the drivers, which can compromise efficiency. However, that isn't stopping larger numbers of golf fans from taking adjustable drivers for a trial run in an effort to improve their game.




