DRAYTON VALLEY RCMP PAROLEE CHECK LEADS TO FURTHER CHARGES

Drayton Valley, Alta.-On June 8, 2021, members of the Drayton Valley RCMP attended a local address in Drayton Valley looking for a male on an outstanding Canada-Wide arrest warrant for parole violation.

The wanted male was arrested and after further investigation, police located a quantity of illegal drugs. Police executed a search warrant at the residence and located further evidence of drug trafficking.

Mark Louis Pratt (48) from the Red Deer area was arrested for his outstanding warrant and is facing new charges:

- · Possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking - Co-
- · Possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking -Methamphetamine

- · Possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking -Psilocybin (Magic Mushrooms)
- Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose
- Possession of a weapon contrary to prohibition or-

Following a judicial hearing, Pratt was remanded into custody and is scheduled to appear in Drayton Valley Provincial Court on July 6, 2021.

EDSON MAINLINE EXPANSION PROJECT APPROVED WITH 25 CONDITIONS

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to advise that Natural Resources Canada has announced approval of the NOVA Gas Transmission Ltd. (NGTL) Edson Mainline Expansion Project with 25 conditions. This decision was based on facts, science, Indig-

enous knowledge, the public interest and careful consideration of the concerns of potentially impacted Indigenous communities.

In addition to the 24 conditions recommended by the Commission of the Canada Energy Regulator (CER), the Government of Canada has

added a new condition in direct response to concerns raised by Indigenous groups. The proponent is required to provide funding to Indigenous groups to support their active participation in the ongoing regulatory process and to report on its engagement with Indigenous groups. In total, the proponent must comply with 25 binding conditions related to safety, environmental and wildlife protection, and protection of Indigenous rights and interests. With the implementation of NGTL's environmental protection procedures, mitigation measures and conditions, the project is unlikely to cause adverse environmental effects.

This \$509-million project will create up to 1,470 jobs during construction and contribute approximately \$285 million to Alberta's GDP.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO GRADE CROSSINGS REGULATIONS

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to advise that

Transport Canada has announced the publication of proposed amendments to Grade Crossings Regulations in the Canada Gazette, Part I, for a 30-day public comment period.

The proposed amendments establish new compliance deadlines to meet the requirements of the Regulations based on the various levels of risks posed by grade crossings. This includes:

- a one-year extension for existing public grade crossings which present a higher risk;
- a three-year extension for all remaining public and all private grade crossings; and

• an exclusion from the construction and maintenance requirements for very low-risk grade crossings (such as field-to-field crossings with minimal train traffic).

These proposed amendments will ensure that the Grade Crossings Regulations are more effective in focusing the efforts of

railway companies, public road authorities and private crossing owners on grade crossings that present the greatest risks to community safety.

AHS Expanding Dialysis Care at Drayton Valley Hospital

"I'm grateful our local care teams have found a way to expand dialysis services in the community," says Mark Smith, MLA for Drayton Valley-Devon. "It's good to know more local residents who require multiple dialysis treatments every week can undergo the procedure right here in Drayton Valley rather than needing to travel outside the community."

The unit's new hours of operation will be 6 a.m. to 6:15 p.m. Monday to Saturday. As a result, all patients who have been on the waitlist to receive dialysis treatment in Drayton Valley will be able to do so without travel to a nearby site.

For patients such as Pat Koronko, the expansion is welcome news.

"The problem with driving

farther for dialysis is that after your appointment, you're exhausted," says Koronko, a 64-year-old resident of Buck Lake, who has dialysis three days a week in Drayton Valley. "The first thing I do when I get home is lay down and sleep. It's hard on you. I'm glad there are now four more patients coming in who won't have to travel to Rocky Mountain House or Red Deer or Edmonton."

Hemodialysis is the process of cleansing the blood of toxins and excess fluid when normal kidney function is reduced. A patient's blood is filtered through a dialyzer and returned to the body. Treatment, which can take four hours, is often required three times a week.

"We are continually monitoring and assessing the needs of dialysis patients across Alberta, including in the Drayton Valley area, and we understand the importance of receiving care and treatment as close to home and to loved ones as possible," says Janice Stewart, Chief Zone Officer, AHS Central Zone. "We are pleased to be opening these additional spaces in Drayton Valley and providing enhanced care and comfort for our patients.

Alberta Kidney Care -North is also expanding dialysis services in Wetaskiwin at the Wetaskiwin Hospital and Care Centre next month in order to provide care for nine additional patients.

There are currently more than 1,200 patients on hemodialysis within Alberta Kidney Care - North, a geographical area that includes central and northern Alberta. An aging population, rising diabetes rates leading to renal failure, and patients living longer on dialysis due to medical advancements are

all factors contributing to increased demand for dialysis.

Drumheller, Olds, Stettler, Vegreville and Lloydminster are other communities within AHS Central Zone that offer dialysis.

Home dialysis is also an option for patients who qualify for the service and Alberta Kidney Care works closely with patients to raise awareness about this care option.








GYPSD Transportation Services FAQ and Information Guide

What Transportation Services are Offered through GYPSD?

GYPSD strives to offer a range of services that are fair and equitable. Board Policy 17 is aligned with the province's Education Act and the Student Transportation Regulation. Services are available for:

- Eligible: Students who live more than 2.4 km away from their designated school
- Ineligible: Students who live less than 2.4 km away from their designated school
- · School of Choice: Students who chose to attend a school other than their designated school
- Transportation Out of District: Students who chose to attend a different school jurisdiction
- Alternate Second Seat: Students who require a reserved second seat on a different bus to an alternate address

What Transportation Services are School Jurisdictions Funded to Provide?

Alberta Education Transportation Funding is for:

- Students residing more than 2.4 km away from their designated school
- Students with special needs who require specialized transportation

Under the School Transportation Regulation, school divisions are not required to transport students beyond their designated school.

How Do I Determine my Child's Designated School?

Please visit the Division's website at www.gypsd.ca under For Parents/Student Transportation and enter your home address on the link What is My Designated School?

Why does Transportation Services Charge Fees for Some Services?

Fees are established to support transportation services for the jurisdiction's families who request them and to ensure classroom dollars are not being used to address transportation service funding gaps.

User fees are charged to parents of students who access transportation services as a way to recover the unfunded costs. GYPSD service fees are amongst the lowest in the province.

How is Eligibility for Transportation Determined?

- · Alberta Education provides funding to eligible riders only.
- . The distance of 2.4 kms for busing to the student's designated school is set by Alberta Education.
- The government sets eligibility based on the student's primary residence address and distance from home to designated school.

Do I Need to Register for the Bus?

NEW for the 2021/2022 School Year: All **new** and **returning** students requiring transportation services must register. Registration is now open.

How Do I Register for the Bus?

Registration for transportation services is at www.gypsd.ca under For Parents/Student Transportation. Only eligible riders are guaranteed a seat each year. All other riders are subject to seat availability.

A MESSAGE FROM MLA MARK SMITH

Alberta's United Conservative government just wrapped up another busy session of the Legislature, during which we passed many bills and motions important to Albertans. I wanted to take this opportunity to share some of those accomplishments with you.

To ensure we are enhancing public safety across the province, we passed Bill 61: the Vital Statistics Amendment Act. This bill will ban dangerous offenders from being able to change their names and hide in our communities (similar to legislation we passed last session banning sex offenders from doing the same thing). By closing this loophole, we are taking steps to protect Albertans, particularly children, from dangerous people.

We also passed Bill 18: the Corrections (Alberta Parole Board) Amendment Act, to create an Alberta Parole Board that will provide a fairer, faster and more responsible justice system and end the 'revolving door' that sees repeat offenders, particularly in rural areas, regularly come in and out of our communities. This follows a recommendation from the Fair Deal Panel, which was tasked with consulting Albertans on strategies to secure a fair deal in the Canadian federation and advance our province's vital interests.

We passed Bill 52: the Recall Act, to give Albertans a way to remove elected officials they feel are not upholding their responsibilities, and Bill 51: the Citizen Initiative Act, to give Albertans a more direct role in the democratic system by enabling eligible voters to propose legislative, policy or constitutional action on issues that affect them.

And we passed Bill 211: the Municipal Government (Firearms) Amendment Act to act as a firewall against federal legislation that could have given municipalities the ability to create their own firearms laws - potentially leading to a confusing patchwork of firearms laws across the province. The vast majority of Alberta gun owners are responsible, trained and licenced. These folks are not the problem. This legislation will make it so firearms legislation is under the sole jurisdiction of the province.

Our government is done playing nice with politicians from other provinces who seek to block our energy products from getting to market. That's why we passed Bill 72: the Preserving Canada's Economic Prosperity Act. This legislation gives our province the authority, if necessary, to restrict the export of crude oil and natural gas from Alberta. This has also come to be known as the 'turn off the taps' bill.

Albertans should get to decide who represents our province in the Senate. That is why we reinstated Bill 13: the Alberta Senate Election Act. Albertans by and large want and deserve to have a say on who represents them in the Senate. We are going to give them that opportunity in October. We also passed a motion asking Prime MinisterTrudeau to delay filling two vacant Senate seats in Alberta until Albertans have had their democratic say in the fall. This was a prime opportunity for the Legislature to stand united, but the NDP voted against the motion. We also passed a motion establishing the question for the Equalization referendum this fall. The Notley NDP - who say they're "agnostic" on Equalization - voted against this motion as well.

We also established the Select Special Committee on Real Property Rights. This committee will be engaging Albertans across the province soon and submitting a report of recommended changes to the Alberta Legislature. Among other questions, the committee will be seeking to determine whether the legal remedies available to a real property owner who is deprived of the use of their real property are adequate. Whether the real property rights should be expanded, or in the case of an individual, constitutionally protected. And whether the law of adverse possession should be abolished.

These are just some of the highlights of this past session, but so many more good things are happening, including the full reopening of our economy as we get to the end of the COVID-19 pandem-

It has been a long haul for Albertans but as the price for oil rises the economic forecasts show our province leading Canada in economic and job growth this year and next. The government continues to work hard to rebuild and diversify the Albert economy. We continue to see investment in new areas of the economy with the recent announcement of a \$1.3 billion dollar hydrogen project that is going to provide 2,500 jobs and help to make Alberta one of the dominant international players in the hydrogen industry. Alberta is coming back stronger than ever.
