Whitecourt RCMP would like to caution anyone that online buy and sell accounts may be used to resell stolen goods such as these and caution should be exercised—especially in regards to the safe handling of food products and the sale of highly perishable items such as meat.

Meat that is sold for human consumption is regulated by Federal and Provincial agencies and any legitimate business would be able to provide records supporting compliance with regulations in Canada.

The Whitecourt RCMP are asking anyone who may have information regarding this incident or who may be responsible, to contact the Whitecourt RCMP at 780-779-5900, or your local police.

The three funding streams for IIPP grants are:

1) Travel Stream

3) Project Stream


Grants for IP-related projects that are more complex or comprehensive than Small-Scale Initiatives, requiring more resources and a longer

duration and can include a combination of activities, up to \$50,000. These grants can fund multiple activities needed to carry out a project, including, but not limited to, related travel, research, development of resource material, event planning, business planning, etc.

Applications must be received by September 8, 2021 by 11:59pm.

#### **COVID-19 UPDATE FOR WHITECOURT**

#### Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

Stage 3 of the Province's Open For Summer Plan starts on July 1. Alberta has hit the vaccination threshold set by the Province and all mandatory restrictions will be lifted, including the ban on indoor social gatherings. Isolation requirements for confirmed cases and protective measures in continuing care settings may remain. For more information please visit https://www.alberta.ca/enhanced-public-health-measures.aspx.

Masking may still be required in limited and specific settings, and the Government of Alberta will be sharing more details on this prior to the Stage 3 launch on July 1. The Town of Whitecourt Temporary Mask Covering Bylaw 1560 remains in effect, but will be discussed at the June 28, 2021 Regular Meeting of Council in light of the Province's announcement. Further information will be shared with the community as it is available.

Rotary Park's Whitecourt River Slides open July 1

With public health restrictions eased, the Whitecourt River Slides in Rotary Park will open for the 2021 summer season on Thursday, July 1. Operating guidelines remain the same as previous seasons:

• The facility will be open daily from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. (weather permitting) as long as an outside air temperature of 160C is reached. If the 160C is not reached by 2:00 p.m., the slides will not open.

• The slides will be closed occasionally on Wednesdays from approximately 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon for maintenance. The slides will be open on these days when maintenance work is complete.

• The air filling station to fill tubes and floaties is located on the south side of the concession building.

All other amenities at Rotary Park, including the Splash Park and playground, are already open for the season. Concession services are offered daily from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. (weather permitting).

Canada Day Fireworks will be moved to Graham Acres

With gathering restrictions lifted, the Canada Day fireworks will be moved to Graham Acres for public viewing. Originally the fireworks were scheduled to be set off from Eastlink Park and higher aerial fireworks were to be used. - Seating for fireworks will be available in the baseball fields and soccer practice field closest to the Golf Course entrance road.
- The Graham Acres parking lot will also be open for fireworks viewing.

# PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO GRADE CROSSINGS REGULATIONS

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to advise that

Transport Canada has announced the publication of proposed amendments to Grade Crossings Regulations in the Canada Gazette, Part I, for a 30-day public comment period.

The proposed amendments establish new compliance deadlines to meet the requirements of the Regulations based on the various levels of risks posed by grade crossings. This includes:

• a one-year extension for existing public grade crossings

which present a higher risk;

- a three-year extension for all remaining public and all private grade crossings; and
- an exclusion from the construction and maintenance requirements for very low-risk grade crossings (such as fieldto-field crossings with minimal train traffic).

These proposed amendments

will ensure that the Grade Crossings Regulations are more effective in focusing the efforts of railway companies, public road authorities and private crossing owners on grade crossings that present the greatest risks to community safety.
