June 26, 2021 Lobstick Fire (EWF-075) EWF075 - BEING HELD -UPDATE 1:30 P.M

Wildfire EWF075 was detected on June 22 is now BEING HELD. This means that under current weather conditions and resources, the wildfire is not anticipated to grow past expected

boundaries. The wildfire is located 9 km west of Evansburg, north of highway 16 and west of highway 22. The wildfire is 180 hectares in size.

No new growth has been reported since the evening of June 22. There is some open flame in the inside of the perimeter of the fire and an increase in fire activity is observed due to the wind and hot temperatures. The

fire is mostly smoldering on the ground but at times flares in unburnt tree stands that remain in the interior.

The temperature at the fire is currently 31 C and the relative humidity is 30%. Winds are from the west, ranging 7 - 12km/h. The fire did not receive any precipitation.
