FIRE BAN ISSUED FOR THE TOWN OF WHITECOURT

JUNE 29, 2021

In consideration of current and forecasted extreme weather conditions, effective at 12:01 a.m. on June 30, 2021, all burning will be suspended within the Town of Whitecourt. No fire permits will be issued, and all existing fire permits will be suspended until conditions improve in the Town and

Whitecourt Forest Area.

The fire ban includes the following but is not limited to:

- Backyard firepits,
- Campground firepits,
- All open burning,
- Consumer fireworks,
- Flame propelled floating lanterns,
- Charcoal briquettes, including meat smokers,
- Turkey fryers,
- Tiki torches.

Allowed for use during the

fire ban:

- CSA approved or ULC certified gas or propane barbecues used for cooking,
- Propane and natural gas fire pits,
- Catalytic or infrared-style heaters,
- Electric or propane meat smokers.

The fire ban will remain in effect until conditions improve.

IS IT TIME FOR YOUR MAMMOGRAM? SCREEN TEST IS COMING TO WHITECOURT JULY 10 TO 27, 2021

Screen Test is a free service provided by Alberta Health Services that offers screening mammograms. Our mobile screening units travel to 120 communities throughout Alberta to provide convenient access to breast cancer screening.

Having regular screening mammograms is the best way to find breast cancer early, before symptoms appear and when treatment may work better.

Who should have a screening mammogram?

If you're 50 to 74, you don't need a referral to have a mammogram. Make screening part of your regular health routine. Plan to have a mammogram every 2 years or as decided by you and your

healthcare provider.

If you're 40 to 49 or over 75, discuss the risks and benefits of screening with your healthcare provider. You will need a referral if you're 40 to 49 and it's your first mammogram, or if you're over 75.

Breast density scores are now included in your Screen Test result letter

Breast density is the amount of dense tissue compared to the amount of fat in a person's breasts. It can be harder to find cancer in dense breasts because this tissue appears white on a mammogram, the same colour as many kinds of breast cancer. It's common to have dense breast tissue.

Dense breasts are only one of many risk factors for breast cancer. Other factors, such as

age and genetics, have a bigger impact on your overall risk. You can't tell how dense your breasts are by size, look or feel. The only way to find out is by having a mammogram.

ST. ALBERT RCMP CRIME REDUCTION UNIT EXECUTE SEARCH WARRANT

Submitted by St. Albert RCMP

St. Albert, Alta - The St Albert RCMP Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) has been monitoring a Federal Parolee residing in St Albert since October of 2020. The parolee was on statutory release for a drug trafficking conviction. St Albert CRU learned that the parolee began selling illegal drugs again, which lead to a new investigation.

On June 17, 2021, St Albert CRU with the assistance of St Albert Drug Unit and St. Albert Traffic Services executed a Controlled Drugs and Substance search warrant at an apartment in St Albert. During the search, police located and seized the follow-

ing items:

- Approximately 381 grams of methamphetamine
- Approximately 284 grams of cocaine
- Approximately 65 grams of fentanyl
- Approximately 1.5l of GHB.
- Approximately 1.72 kilograms of a buffing agent
- A loaded stolen sawed off shotgun
- A loaded Kel Tec 9mm folding carbine

The approximate street value of the drugs seized was over \$40,000 Canadian dollars.

As a result of the investigation and search, Jesse Louie (41) of St. Albert was arrested and charged with the following:

- Possession of Controlled



Substance for Purpose of Trafficking

- Numerous Weapon Offences

Jesse Louie's parole has been suspend, he was remanded into custody and his next court appearance is June 28, 2021 in St Albert for his new charges.

Fire Ban Issued For The Town Of Whitecourt

The operation of Off Highway Vehicles (OHV) within the Town of Whitecourt is prohibited under Off Highway Vehicle Bylaw 1138 which prohibits OHV use within Town boundaries between April 1 and November 30 annually. Penalties for contravening Bylaw 1138 range from monetary fines

to OHV seizure. OHVs can start wildfires so operators are encouraged to check OHVs frequently to ensure hotspots are free of debris, to make sure mufflers and spark arrestors are working properly, and be familiar with any OHV restrictions in the Whitecourt Forest Area where the operation of any OHV, for recreational purposes, is prohibited.

Due to extreme weather

conditions, the Town of Whitecourt's Canada Day fireworks display will be postponed.

"While we are disappointed about rescheduling, the extreme heat and dry conditions are not conducive to a fireworks display," stated Whitecourt Mayor Maryann Chichak. "I know many of us were looking forward to this celebration as a kick off to summer and an eas-

ing of public health restrictions – but it's just not safe. The current fire conditions are equivalent to those experienced in 1998, when the Virginia Hills fire occurred west of Whitecourt, and conditions are expected to exceed the 1998 levels over the next two days."

All other activities planned as part of local Canada Day celebrations will continue, such as the Community Art Project Display and Canada Day decorating contest. For information please visit the event page on Facebook. The Town intends to reschedule the display to a later date this summer, and will inform the community of the new date when it is determined.

WHITCOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

JUNE 29, 2021

Whitecourt's Temporary Mandatory Face Coverings Bylaw 1560 has been repealed effective Thursday, July 1 to coincide with the Province's Stage 3 reopening. As announced by the Government of Alberta, the province has hit the vaccination threshold and all mandatory restrictions will be lifted effective July 1, including the ban on indoor social gatherings and mandatory mask wearing in all indoor public spaces. (Isolation requirements for confirmed cases and protective measures in continuing care settings may remain.) Mandatory mask wearing continues to be in effect throughout Alberta until July 1; and, the Province has stated that masks

may continue to be required in limited and specific settings beyond that date, and that further information in this regard will be provided prior to July 1. The wearing of face coverings on public transit within Whitecourt is still recommended.

With the move to Stage 3, Council and Council Committees meetings will revert to the regular format and times, with meetings to be hosted in a public forum effective July 1, 2021. Council meetings during the summer will be held on July 19 and August 24 at 7:00 p.m. at the Forest Interpretive Centre.

The COVID-19 Impact Assessment and Recovery Project is complete. The project, a partnership endeavour between Whitecourt, Community Future Yellowhead East, Whitecourt & District Chamber

of Commerce, and Alberta Labour and Immigration, analyzed the impacts of the pandemic, and explored potential recommendations for recovery strategies, and business and labour force retention and attraction. The Whitecourt Economic Development Committee will be using the information gathered during the project to assist with supporting the local business community, and will be undertaking a number of project as a result of the findings.

Whitecourt has awarded the project for the 50 Year Comprehensive Growth Study to ISL Engineering and Land Services in partnership with Nichols Applied Management for \$75,979, plus GST. The growth study will help to guide future infrastructure, servicing and other long term plans for our community, and to ensure adequate land availability to meet future growth.

Whitecourt was recently recognized provincially at the 2021 Alberta Urban Municipalities Association for its 2020 Red Tape Reduction Report. The report was a requirement for funding the Town received from the Municipal Stimulus Program (MSP) which helped fund the Dahl Drive Improvement Project which is scheduled to start in July 2021. The report outlined how the municipality has worked to attract new investment by having simple, expedited business permitting and approval processes.

A development permit for an 18-hole Mini Golf Course and 54-unit campground has been approved at 5115 Highway 43. The campground (formerly known as Camp-In Town) and new mini golf course will be open seasonally from May

to October annually.

The annual review of Off-Site Levies is complete and, based on the study, rates will be changing as of January 1, 2022. Off-Site Levies are a cost recovery tool that help pay for infrastructure projects that allow the community to grow, including roads, and water and sewage treatment.

Council has entered a contract with BR2 Architectural Services to complete Phase 2 of the Arts and Culture Centre schematic design, and Phase 3 of the Town Office, Public Library, and Arts and Culture Centre design development. In October 2020, it was announced that the Town would receive \$15,612,137 in grant funding for the Arts and Culture Centre and Library project. Completing the design development will provide better costing for the proposed facility so that an education campaign can be developed in the fall, and will allow the Town to achieve the timelines required by the grant program.

The Anthony Gordon Memorial Golf Classic, hosted by Eagle Tower Victim Services, is scheduled for Monday, August 23.

Council has recognized July 18 to 24, 2021 as National Drowning Prevention Week.

Councillor Schlosser has been appointed as Deputy Mayor from July 1 to October 25, 2021.

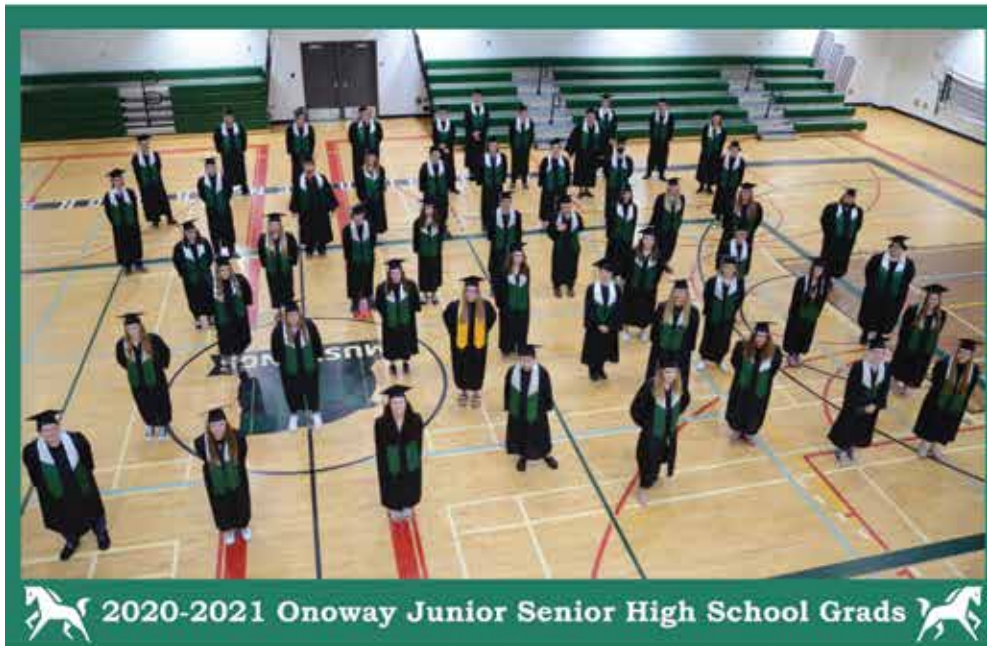

1.8 minutes. Most volunteer and Paid-On-Call services average around 10 minutes.

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE THE FIRE DEPARTMENT TO GET TO MY HOUSE AFTER BEING NOTIFIED? 2020 AVERAGE:

6.8 minutes combined average for all Onoway Regional areas and 5.4 minutes for urban areas (Onoway, Alberta Beach, Sunset Point, Val Quentin). Edmonton Fire Rescue posts an average of 4 minutes.

I HEARD ONOWAY REGIONAL FIRE SERVICES NOW RESPONDS TO HIGHWAY CALLS, DOES IT MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

In 2020, 67% of highway emergencies experienced reduced response times. Onoway Regional Fire Services responded to 33 emergencies on Alberta Highways in 2020.

DO FIREFIGHTERS STILL VOLUNTEER?

In 2020, firefighters volunteered over 6,281 hours of their free time. This time was spent training, responding to medical calls, and taking part in community events.

CANADA RECOVERY HIRING PROGRAM

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise the launching of an online calculator to help eligible employers prepare their CRHP applications. This calculator integrates the new CRHP with the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS), automatically showing applicants which subsidy will provide them with more support, based on the information they

enter. The CRHP and the CEWS are both based on four-week claim periods. From June 6, 2021 to September 25, 2021 (claim periods 17 to 20), the subsidies overlap so that, as CEWS rates gradually decline, eligible employers would still be able to receive support through the CRHP if they hire more workers or increase workers' hours or wages.

For the four overlapping claim periods, eligible employers can apply for either subsidy, based on whichever subsidy provides the higher amount of support. An eligible employer must claim the greater of the CRHP and the CEWS for a particular claim period, but not both. Eligible employers will be able to apply for the CRHP as of July 7, 2021, when the Cana-

da Revenue Agency (CRA) will open applications through My Business Account and Represent a Client. The CRA will begin to issue CRHP payments to eligible employers during the week of July 12, 2021. RCMP ADVISE OF CONCERNING TREND OF EXTORTION USING SOCIAL MEDIA

Alberta RCMP have received a number of reports throughout central and southern Alberta where social media platforms were used in an effort to extort money from individuals. In a number of cases, the victims received friend requests from what has been typically a female, or other messages on Facebook, Snapchat, Instagram and/or on a dating

application, that subsequently moved to direct messaging on various platforms. The victims involved have sent a nude image(s) and the suspect(s) subsequently made demands that the victim send them money or their image(s) will be sent out to all of their contacts, friends and/or family. It is common for offenders to follow a victim's friends and family on social media platforms as a way to demonstrate they can follow through on

threats to share the image(s) if the victim does not comply. Beware that offenders are utilizing filters available on certain apps that allow them to appear younger than they are on images and also on live streams. **Prevention Tips:**
 • Do not accept friend from individuals who are unknown to you
 • Do not send nude images
 • Immediately stop all communication if someone is de-

manding money
 • Do not comply with the threat and report to your local police
 • Keep the correspondence

Golfer's **GUIDE**

HOW TO MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR DAY ON THE COURSE

(NC) Most great golf games are filled with sun, competition and camaraderie, but you can enhance the experience with a few tips that have less to do with your swing, and a lot to do with your 18-hole enjoyment:

Dress for success: The right golf apparel can be as important as the clubs you carry. Check the weather in advance to make sure you'll be as comfortable as possible during play. Determine if you're dressing to impress or to elevate your game. Light, non-restrictive clothing will allow you to swing freely and keep you comfortable and cool in the heat, or warm if the temperature drops. If you're a guest, always check out the dress code at the club you'll be visiting to ensure you comply with the rules.

Choose your company carefully: Your playing partners can have a lot to do with how you play and how you socialize on the golf course. If you're out with friends, you can relax and enjoy the day knowing what to expect. But if it's a game with your boss or clients, always make sure to test the waters. Will they play by the rules or is it just a relaxed day? Are your clients there to play golf or do busi-

ness? Understanding the landscape on the first tee will alleviate any awkward moments later on.

Create friendly competition: Sure, there's already a scorecard, but you can add more competitive fun to your game by creating a little friendly rivalry. For example, try a little Bingo Bango Bongo - a points based game that awards a total score based on three kinds of achievement: Bingo - first person on the green gets a point; Bango -

the player whose ball is closest to the pin when all balls are on the green gets a point, Bongo - the player who is first to hole out gets a point. Add up the points and the person with the highest total for the round wins.

Walk it off : Make a small 'healthy' tweak to your game by walking vs. taking a cart. When you choose to walk rather than drive 18 holes, you'll cover approximately six kilometres and burn around 1,500 - 2,000 calories. Golfers

that ride carts will burn only about 1,100 - 1,300 calories.

Say cheers and enjoy: The 19th hole remains one of the best holes on the course. Cap off a great day by enjoying a light meal or a light beer such as Molson Canadian 67, which is brewed to 67 calories per 341ml bottle and 3% ABV. This crisp, refreshing beer can be paired nicely with a protein boost of chicken or fish.

COVID-19 UPDATE FOR WHITECOURT

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

JULY 2, 2021

As of July 1, Albertans are now free to gather indoors and outdoors; places of worship and businesses can operate at full capacity; the provincial mask mandate is repealed; and, people can safely get back to doing all of the activities they enjoy.

Limited measures remain in effect to protect continuing care and acute care settings, and to offer additional safeguards until all Albertans have had the opportunity to receive their second dose of vaccine.

- Masking will continue to be required in limited and specific settings:
- Public transit, taxis and ride sharing.

Continuing care and acute care settings.

Albertans may wish to consider individual risk factors and choose to wear masks in other public indoor settings.

Confirmed cases of COVID-19 are still required to isolate for 10 days.

Close contacts of confirmed cases are still required to quarantine. Quarantine length continues to be based on vaccination status.

Protective measures in continuing care settings remain in effect.

Health officials have created a general guidance document (General guidance for COVID-19 and other respiratory illnesses) for all sectors to help Albertans safely transition into Stage 3.

Albertans are encouraged to continue booking appointments for first and second doses to ensure full effectiveness and long-lasting protection. Select locations are offering walk-in clinics for first doses.
