RCMP WARN PUBLIC OF HIGH RISK OFFENDER

Submitted by Alberta RCMP

In the interest of public safety, Alberta RCMP are issuing the following information and warning in regard to the release of Lorne Wallace Papastesis on the completion of his sentence, and plans to reside in Edmonton.

Lorne Papastesis, 41, is described as an:

- · Indigenous male;
- 178 cm (5'10");
- 66 kg (145 lbs);
- brown hair with brown eyes; and
- has a prosthetic leg.

Papastesis has been convicted of multiple offences including: assault causing bodily harm, assault with a weapon, aggravated assault, forcible confinement, carrying a concealed weap-

on, and possessing a weapon dangerous to the public peace.

Papastesis has severe mental health concerns and often appears in a delusional state. He has been known to conceal weapons in his prosthetic leg and exhibit unpredictable violence towards strangers.

The RCMP is issuing this information and warning after careful deliberation and consideration of all related issues, including privacy concerns, in the belief that it is clearly in the public interest to inform the members of the community of the release of Papastesis. The RCMP believes that there is a risk of significant harm to the health and safety of the public.

The RCMP has made an application to the Courts



to have Lorne Papastesis bound by conditions upon his release. These conditions are to assist with his reintegration back into the community and for public safety.

Members of the public are advised that the intent of the process is to enable members of the public to take suitable precautionary measures and not to embark on any form of vigilante action. Anyone believing that a crime has been or is about to be committed is encouraged to call police. If the matter is felt to be of an urgent nature, please call 911 immediately.

Sheriffs Enhance RAPID Enforcement On Highways

This includes impaired driving and criminal offences they encounter in the course of their duties.

Giving highway patrol sheriffs the authority to handle more incidents on provincial highways means the RCMP has more officers on patrol and available to respond to higher-priority criminal matters.

"We are taking action to address the very real issue of crime in rural Alberta. We know Albertans have been frustrated with response times in rural areas, and we are committed to making sure they feel safe and protected in their communities. More boots on the ground means authorities can respond more quickly when Albertans need them. It will also deter crime and make our highways and communities safer." - Kaycee Madu, Minister of Justice and Solicitor General

In rural areas police can be stretched across large distances, which can lead to longer response times. RAPID Response helps reduce response times by expanding the roles and authorities of 400 peace officers in Sheriff Highway Patrol and Fish and Wildlife Enforcement Services.

Earlier this year, fish and wildlife officers' roles were also expanded so they can respond to requests from the RCMP to be first at the scene of an emergency in cases where they are closer than police. Fish and

wildlife officers will also respond to RCMP requests for backup, which could involve helping the police locate suspects or preserve a crime scene.

RAPID Response currently covers most areas of rural Alberta policed by the RCMP. The government is holding a series of meetings with First Nations and Métis leaders to determine their interest and earn their support before expanding RAPID Response to their communities.

KEY MESSAGES FROM GYPSD'S PUBLIC BOARD MEETING

District Priority 1: Student Learning

Board Chair Rosadiuk praised the GYPSD's BEST Team -Bringing Empowered Students Together-for the Division-wide range of summer activities they are providing for students in all age groups during July and August. BEST coaches strive to keep students connected and engaged during

the summer break. This is in addition to virtual Summer School 2021 –which gives high school students the chance to work ahead and create spaces in their timetables for courses needed for post-secondary or industry training programs.

The Trustees received a report on GYPSD's Junior Kindergarten (JK) Programming from Inclusive Education Director, Kim McConnell. JK is an early childhood education program for children aged 3

and 4 years, licensed and registered with Alberta Child and Family Services. JK offers an intentional program for children, supporting diversity and inclusion, geared to stimulate and develop their intellectual, physical, and emotional growth. GYPSD's JK teachers plan and organize play-based learning opportunities that help prepare children to transition successfully into kindergarten!

District Priority 2: Teaching

and Leadership Excellence

Chair Rosadiuk voiced the Board's support for MLA Getson, along with Minister Wilson and Minister Glubish, in their commitment to lead the province in locating missing Indigenous children from Alberta's former Residential Schools and shared the Division's commitment to ensuring all schools provide safe, respectful, caring, and welcoming environments that celebrate Indigenous Peoples and History, and inform foundational knowledge in Indigenous language and culture.

Highlights from Superintendent Lewis' Report include:

•GYPSD is only one of two provincial school jurisdictions offering specialized courses unique to the National Parks

•Planning for Kick-Off 2021, featuring Key Note addresses from Dr. Greg Wells, and VTRA protocol founder, Kevin Cameron

•Joined the Trustees in attending the PSBAA and ASBA Spring General Meetings, as well as the Edwin Parr Award Ceremony

•Development of the Central Strategic Plan

ALBERTA IS OFFICIALLY OPEN FOR SUMMER

Virtually all COVID-19 restrictions are now lifted as Alberta leads Canada by entering Stage 3 of the Open for Summer Plan.

As of July 1, Albertans are now free to gather indoors and outdoors, places of worship and businesses can operate at full capacity, the provincial mask mandate is repealed, and people can safely get back to doing all of the activities they enjoy.

To date, 72.8 per cent of eligible Albertans have received their first dose of vaccine, and 42.4 per cent have received both doses, offering a strong level of community protection in the province. Alberta Health estimates that 50 per cent of eligible Albertans will be fully immunized by July 6.

Mandatory isolation and quarantine rules remain in place, and masking is still re-

quired in hospitals, continuing care, mass transit, ride shares, and taxis.

"This is a fantastic day for Alberta. We have crushed COVID-19 and with cases plummeting and vaccine uptake climbing, we are Open for Summer. With vaccines on our side, businesses can once again thrive, and Albertans can get back to their normal lives. Together, thanks to the sacrifices made by Albertans, we have made it through this terrible time. Now, a new day dawns and the future looks bright." - Jason Kenney, Premier

"Thanks to the tremendous efforts of Albertans and the power of modern medicine, now is the time to safely pivot from strict restrictions to vaccine protection to keep people safe. As we lift restrictions, I urge Albertans to continue to do their part by getting fully vaccinated." - Tyler Shandro, Minister of Health

"We are entering a new phase in our fight against this virus. As we gather and celebrate with our loved ones, I encourage every Albertan to continue to get their vaccines, make safe choices and support each other with compassion through this time of transition." - Dr. Deena Hinshaw, chief medical officer of health

All COVID-19 restrictions are now lifted unless otherwise indicated. Health officials have created a general guidance document (General guidance for COVID-19 and other respiratory illnesses) for all sectors to help Albertans safely transition into Stage 3.

Limited measures will remain in effect to protect continuing care and acute care settings, and to offer additional safeguards until all Albertans have had the opportunity to receive their second dose of vaccine.

- Confirmed cases of COVID-19 are still required to isolate for 10 days.
- Close contacts of confirmed cases are still required to quarantine. Quarantine length continues to be based on vaccination status.
 - Protective measures

in continuing care settings remain in effect.

Masking will continue to be required in limited and specific settings:

- Continuing care and acute care settings.
- Public transit, taxis and ride sharing.

Albertans may wish to consider individual risk factors and choose to wear masks in other public indoor settings.

Get fully vaccinated

Albertans are encouraged to continue booking appointments for first and second doses to ensure full effectiveness and long-lasting protection.

Anyone who has not yet booked their vaccine can do so by visiting alberta.ca/vaccine to find available appointments with AHS or participating pharmacies across the province. Select locations are offering walk-in clinics for first doses.

Alberta is providing an extra incentive to Albertans who are vaccinated through its Open for Summer Lottery. To register and for complete details, visit alberta.ca/lottery.

CANADA RECOVERY HIRING PROGRAM

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise the launching of an online calculator to help eligible employers prepare their CRHP applications. This calculator integrates the new CRHP with the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS), automatically showing applicants which subsidy will provide them with more support, based on the information they

The CRHP and the CEWS are both based on four-week claim periods. From June 6, 2021 to September 25, 2021 (claim periods 17 to 20), the subsidies overlap so that, as CEWS rates gradually decline, eligible employers would still be able to receive support through the CRHP if they hire more workers or increase workers' hours

or wages.

For the four overlapping claim periods, eligible employers can apply for either subsidy, based on whichever subsidy provides the higher amount of support. An eligible employer must claim the greater of the CRHP and the CEWS for a particular claim period, but not both.

Eligible employers will be able to apply for the CRHP as of July 7, 2021, when the Cana-

da Revenue Agency (CRA) will open applications through My Business Account and Represent a Client. The CRA will begin to issue CRHP payments to eligible employers during the week of July 12, 2021.






