OLD AGE SECURITY UPDATE

Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise that in July 2021, OAS benefits will automatically increase 1.3%, bringing the maximum monthly OAS pension amount to \$626.49, up from \$618.45. The Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) and the Allowances will also be adjusted for inflation. Also, the \$500 onetime payment to older seniors, will be delivered during the week of August 16, 2021.

A permanent increase of 10% to the OAS pension, will be implemented in July 2022 for seniors aged 75 and over. This will provide an additional \$766 to full pensioners over the first year. It builds on measures to support all seniors, which include restoring the age of eligibility for the OAS pension and the GIS to 65 from 67, strengthening the Canada Pension Plan for future retirees, increasing the GIS for single seniors, raising the GIS earnings exemption and reducing income taxes for all Canadians.

July 7, 2021 - The Old Age Security (OAS) pension provides retirement income security for seniors because it maintains its value over time, even as prices increase.

Today, Canada's Minister of Seniors, Deb Schulte, announced the highest quarterly adjustment to existing OAS payments since July 2014. She also confirmed that the Government of Canada will deliver the \$500 one-time payment to older seniors, announced in Budget 2021, during the week of August 16, 2021.

This summer's one-time payment of \$500 will support older seniors' higher expenses, and will apply to 3.3 million seniors who are eligible for the OAS pension in June 2021 and were born on or before June 30, 1947. No action is required by seniors, who will automatically receive the payment if

they are eligible.

In July 2021, OAS benefits will automatically increase 1.3%, bringing the maximum monthly OAS pension amount to \$626.49, up from \$618.45. Over the coming year, the increase is worth up to \$96.48. The Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) and the Allowances will also be adjusted for inflation

Budget 2021 also included a permanent increase of 10% to the OAS pension, to be implemented in July 2022 for seniors aged 75 and over. This will provide an additional \$766 to full pensioners over the first year, and will be the first permanent increase to the OAS pension since 1973, other than adjustments due to inflation. It builds on measures to support all seniors, which include restoring the age of eligibility for the OAS pension and the GIS to 65 from 67, strengthening the Canada Pension Plan for future retirees, increasing the GIS for single seniors, raising

the GIS earnings exemption and reducing income taxes for all Canadians.

•In 2020 and 2021, the Government is providing \$5.5 billion in additional direct financial support to seniors, through a \$1.3 billion one-time GST credit in April 2020, \$2.5 billion for a one-time OAS/ GIS payment in July 2020 and \$1.7 billion for the one-time payment to older seniors in August 2021.

TOWN OF MAYERTHORPE SEEKS FAIRNESS IN COST SHARING FOR RECREATION SERVICES

Submitted by Town of Mayerthorpe

The Town of Mayerthorpe (the Town) has reviewed Lac Ste. Anne County (the County)'s most recent public statements regarding the ongoing Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework (ICF) process with disappointment and a measure of concern.

Town Council believes that, in speaking for our community, we must always seek to represent our ratepayers in a professional and even-handed manner. It is our sincere hope that the County will strive to adopt a tone more appropriate for a process ultimately intended to foster intermunicipal co-operation and future productive communications.

The Town has complied with all requirements of the Municipal Government Act regarding ICFs and will continue to do so. It will also continue to seek a fair approach to sharing costs for the services it provides to both its residents and its county neighbors.

In the interests of ensuring the ICF arbitration proceeds in a professional and civil manner, the Town will reserve its responses to the County's recent misleading statements for the arbitrator.

The Town has every confidence in the abilities of the Minister of Municipal Affairs and his team to appoint an appropriate, unbiased arbitrator. With that appointment, the Town looks forward to the opportunity to move the ICF process forward in a more positive and productive manner.

While the Town will not dignify the recent statements from the County with specific responses, it is important for all ratepayers to have accurate information. See the following:

• The ICF mediation process was not "stalled". The County

pulled out of mediation without notice or explanation to the Town.

• The Town was invested in negotiating the ICF through the mediation process. The County terminated that process.

• The County has not been "dragged into an arbitration process" nor is it something the Town triggered. The County's own actions created the need for binding arbitration to finalize the ICF thus ensuring compliance with the MGA.

• The Town has always been open to reasonable, fair solutions. It remains open to negotiations based on facts and figures rather than unsubstantiated, arbitrary positions.

• County ratepayers will, indeed, bear more than 95% of the cost for arbitration. The Town's portion of the costs will be lower, but the Town is not eager to expend public funds on the ICF arbitration process and is at a loss to explain why the County would rather assume an aggressive, argumentative posture than engage in constructive, factbased discussions about the equitable sharing of costs for shared services.

• There is no basis for the County's statements suggesting the Town has not handled public funds responsibly. The statements are, at best, selectively misleading. At worst, they are false, and the Town will disprove these allegations in the course of the arbitration process.

• For over a decade, the Town has shouldered an inequitable portion of the costs for shared recreation services. Despite bearing this burden for years, the Town continues to fair well according to the metrics utilized by Alberta Municipal Affairs and has never been flagged as a municipality in need of a viability review.

• Since the Minister has yet to appoint an arbitrator, the County's recent statements suggesting bias or potential bias in the arbitration process are unjustified.

• The County's statement that the arbitration process "normally results in a matter being split down the middle to appear equitable" is inaccurate and confuses mediation with arbitration.

• The Town of Mayerthorpe does anticipate a successful result in the arbitration process not due to any unfairness in the process, but simply because the inequities in the current arrangements with Lac Ste. Anne County for recreation services are glaringly obvious. "My Council colleagues

"My Council colleagues and I remain steadfast in our commitment to secure an equitable outcome in the arbitration process for Mayerthorpe's ratepayers. We're confident in our facts and data and eager to present our position to the arbitrator appointed by Minister McIver." – Mayor Janet Jabush.



ON THE HIGHWAY

Here at Onoway Regional Fire Services, we like to be as transparent as possible with the citizens of whom we serve. We would like to tell you how our highway emergency response has gone so far in cooperation with Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services. This arrangement is called the Dual Callout Agreement.

FACTS

ORFS responded to 33 emergency highway incidents with Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services in 2020.

Of the 33 emergency calls ORFS responded to in 2020, Dual Callout was able to improve the response time for 22 of the emergencies.


IMPROVEMENT


Dual Callout shaves off on-average 5-minutes from the previous response time on highway incidents. In 12 cases, Dual Callout was able to reduce the response time by over 5 minutes. In 6 incidents, Dual Callout was able to save over 10 minutes.

In one specific instance, ORFS was able to save 18 minutes when responding to a motor vehicle fire. The ORFS crews were able to completely extinguish the fire prior to the arrival of the next erriving unit. When LSACFS arrived on scene, they worked closely with ORFS to re-open the highway.

RESULTS

In 2020, 67% of highway emergencies experienced reduced response times. Sometimes arriving on scene up to 18 minutes faster. When you are badly hurt and trapped in a vehicle, 5 minutes can mean a lot, and 18 can mean deeth.





CONCLUSION

Onoway Regional Fire Services is proud of the improvements the Dual Callout agreement has made to emergency response on Alberta's provincial highways. Without the cooperation between Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services, Lac Ste. Anne County Council, and the Onoway Regional Fire Services member community councils, these improvements would not be possible. Thank you!

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise a top-up of \$10 million for the Local Food Infrastructure Fund, which will re-open for applications starting Monday, July 12, 2021 until August 13, 2021. The fund supports community-based, not-for-profit organizations to improve their food systems through investments in infrastructure that are directly related to addressing food insecurities and increasing the accessibility of healthy, nutritious, and ideally, local foods within their community.

The new application intake will provide rapid-response grants valued between \$15,000 and \$100,000 to help prevent hunger through investments in infrastructure needs.

About 84% of OAS pensioners have individual incomes below \$50,000.

•The objective of the Old Age Security program is to ensure a minimum income for seniors and help reduce the incidence of low income among Canada's seniors. The OAS benefits include: the OAS pension; which is paid to all individuals aged 65 and older who meet the residence requirements; the GIS for low-income seniors; and the Allowances for low-income Canadians aged 60 to 64 who are the spouses or common-law partners of GIS recipients, or who are widowed or widowers.

• The maximum OAS pension is payable to seniors aged 65 and over who lived in Canada for at least 40 years after age 18. Partial pensions are payable if they lived in Canada for at least 10 years or qualified under International Social Security Agreements.

• All OAS benefits (the OAS pension, the GIS and the Allowances) are indexed on a quarterly basis in January, April, July and October so benefits don't lose value over time. Increases to OAS benefits are calculated using the Consumer Price Index, which measures changes in prices paid by Canadian consumers for goods and services, and is the most widely used indicator

of price changes in Canada. If the cost of goods and services goes down, OAS benefits do not decrease. OAS payment amounts will only increase or stay the same. Historical values are available on the Open Data portal.

• As a result of automatic indexation, the annual value of the monthly OAS pension has increased to \$7,516 per year from \$6,404 per year over the past decade.





POPULAR GOLF COURSES AROUND THE WORLD

The Masters Tournament is the first of golf's four major championships in the calendar year. Competitors tee off at the Augusta National Golf Club in Augusta, GA, in April 2020. Americans Tiger Woods and Patrick Reed are the two most recent Masters champions, and fans are already eager to see who earns the fabled green jacket this year.

Televised golf competitions often inspire people to hit the links. People with a passion for golf may want to check out some of the top courses in the world, as ranked by leading golf resources and experts.

Ballybunion: This Irish course was touted as "nothing less than the finest seaside course" by famed golf writer Herbert Warren Wind. The course hosted the 2000 Irish Open, but lack of other tournaments can be attributed to its remote, albeit beautiful, location

Cypress Point: This club sits at the foothills of the Santa Lucia Mountains at the tip of the Monterey Peninsula in California. Located in coastal dunes and on rocky coastlines, Cypress Point is often noted for its dramatic holes along the Pacific Ocean.

• Pine Valley: Located in Pine Valley, NJ, this course, which is more than 100 years old, boasts some formidable hazards with sophisticated green expanses.

• St. Andrew's: This historic course in Scotland has hosted the Open Championship (once known as The British Open) a record 29 times. Historians believe golf originated in Scotland, and people have been playing on this course since the 15th century. Massive greens, cavernous bunkers and a brilliant layout contribute to its distinguished history.

• Shinnecock Hills: This course in Southampton, NY, is a very old club built in the tradition of Scottish courses. This was likely the inaugural American golf course design, and the Shinnecock Hills Golf Club was one of the five founding members of the United States Golf Association.

Augusta National: Home to the Masters, Augusta is considered a golf paradise by many. The sheer beauty of Augusta has made it a staple on many golfers' bucket lists, even if only a few may get to walk its fairways with club in hand.

Golf has a storied history, and that history is on display at various jaw-dropping courses across the globe.

•53 litres of Gamma-Hydroxybutyric Acid (GHB)


•27 kilograms of a substance believed to be a buffing agent
