2021 TRACTOR PULL

Last August 7th and 8th, we had our first tractor pull in over a year. It was very nice to see all the drivers that have coming all the time, some new drivers and guys that don't drive anymore. We had a very good weekend as the weather cooperated with us for a change. The feature tractor for this pull was a John Deere 830 owned by Ron Prokipchuk from Whitecourt. I grew up in Hyas, Saskatchewan on the family

farm. We had a John Deere and Massey Harris 55, neither one having power steering. A John Deere 830 was a tractor that I had my eye on back then, and it certainly would have made our farming operations easier. Just over 12 years ago I had noticed a John Deere 830 sitting in a field a few miles south of my residence. So one day I stopped in to inquire if the tractor may be for sale. On April 3,2009, I purchased the 1959 John Deere 830 tractor from the Estate of Glenn Johnson. I went with the



COAL POLICY ENGAGEMENT Coal Policy Committee Guest Column For Your Consideration

Submitted by Coal Policy Committee

Over the last few months, it's been made clear to the Coal Policy Committee that the topic of coal development is important for Albertans, who hold many views and opinions on the subject. That's why the committee has been tasked by Alberta's Energy Minister Sonya Savage with leading a widespread public engagement to inform a modern coal policy.

The independent committee

is comprised of five members who represent a wide-range of backgrounds and perspectives on policy development. We are working to gather Albertans' thoughts about coal development. These views will help shape and inform the province's long-term approach to the subject.

Since our appointment in March, mindful of past COVID restrictions, we have been meeting virtually with interested parties and technical experts from across the province. The committee is continuing to meet with individuals and groups that we hope will include expanded engagements with Indigenous interests. We recently undertook informative tours of communities in southwest and central Alberta.

The conversations we've had are wide-ranging. The topics span the ecological impacts of coal mining, responsible resource development, effective regulatory regimes, water quality, fish and wildlife conservation, jobs, economic activity and spe-





