

The Pen Pal Program is a writing experience for both school students and seniors to build relationships through a cross cultural (intergenerational) understanding. It prevents loneliness and isolation for seniors and it has the ability for seniors and school students to stay connected in our communities. Students

have the ability to make close connections outside of the classroom.

Seniors and students can learn from one another about a range of interesting topics by sending letters to each other. This program will have seniors and students form new connections through an informal partnership between the supportive living and independent living seniors in our communities and the

schools that would like to participate in Yellowhead County.

The goal is to provide more social connections for both the seniors and the students, preventing social isolation and loneliness that are linked to poor physical and mental health in seniors.

This Pen Pal Program will enable seniors to interact with young people in a meaningful way while also encouraging seniors to contribute to the "future of our community". Handwritten letters are a way to share old memories and create new friendships that will hopefully continue when things return to "normal".

The children in the participating schools will be asked to write a letter:

- introducing themselves to a senior
- telling them about themselves and what is happening in their life
- what they like to do for fun
- what school is like, and if they participate in any sports
- tell about a personal hobby
- what their favorite color is
- · share a favorite story
- share fun facts

The Community Outreach Coordinator, Yellowhead County FCSS, will review and connect the student with a match (senior) in supportive living/independent living. The letters will be on a first name basis.

The Community Outreach Coordinator will draft a letter for the teachers in the schools explaining the program and will also draft a letter for the Managers of the Supportive living facility (Sunshine Lodge) and Independent Living facility (Evergreen Foundations, formerly Pembina Housing Authority) which seniors would be willing to participate in this program.



## \$340 MILLION FOR ALBERTA RANCHERS DUE TO DROUGHT

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta ranchers can apply for up to \$200 per head through a \$340-million support program.

Producers can apply for an initial AgriRecovery payment through the 2021 Canada-Alberta Livestock Feed Assistance Initiative to help cover feed and water access costs for breeding female livestock across the province.

"Alberta's livestock producers have experienced exceedingly dry conditions for months, putting

additional stress on the very Albertans who feed Canadian families. Alberta's government is proud to support the delivery of up to \$340 million in much-needed relief to help our livestock producers make it through this difficult season." Devin

Dreeshen, Minister of Agriculture and Forestry

"We're here to support producers in times like these. This funding helps Alberta's livestock producers and beekeepers sustain their operations during challenging times." Darryl Kay, CEO, Agriculture Financial Services Corporation

Payments will flow soon after applications are received. Once applications are approved and processed, those who sign up for the direct deposit option will see payments toward the end of the month.

Taking a feed-need approach, supplemented by receipts, a secondary payment of up to \$106 per head will be available to producers who have experienced extraordinary costs as a result of the drought, in addition to the initial payment.

Cattle and bison will be eligible for an initial payment of \$94 per head and a secondary payment of \$106 per head, for a total of \$200 per head. Other livestock will be subject to a different per head payment

The program will be administered through Agriculture Financial Services Corporation (AFSC). Program terms and conditions are posted on AFSC's website.

An AFSC Connect account is required to receive payments. Directions on how to sign up for AFSC Connect are available on AFSC's website.

#### HOW TO ADDRESS CEILING STAINS

Many stains are instantly noticeable. But while a wine stain on a light-colored carpet or a gravy stain on a white shirt tend to jump out right away, other stains sneak past our radars every day. Ceiling stains are one type of stain that tend to go unnoticed for long periods of time. But ceiling stains can be unsightly, and some are even indicative of a larger problem, so it pays for homeowners to address stains on their ceilings as soon as possible.


· Start with the source. Low kitchen ceilings tend to fall victim to oil stains, which are an unfortunate side effect of cooking. But not all stains can be so easily traced to their origins. Some ceiling stains, such as those in bathrooms, may be a byproduct of mold, while others may be indicative of plumbing problems. Identifying the source of a stain is often the first step toward eradicating it.

· Fix the problem. Once you have identified what's causing the stain, fix the problem as soon as possible. Ceiling stains are often indicative of much larger problems, and the longer those problems are allowed to fester, the bigger they become. Some water

stains on ceilings result from cracks or joints that have not been adequately sealed or caulked. Reseal or recaulk any cracks you suspect are leading to ceiling stains.

If you have determined a leaky roof is behind your stained ceilings, then have the roof inspected for damage, and prepare yourself to finance a new roof if the inspector determines that's the best solution.

· Cover nearby furniture. If you find ceiling stains above living areas, then be sure to cover the furniture below such ceilings with a tarp. Even if your stain solution will be made primarily of water, you don't want to risk compounding your ceiling stain problem by staining your furniture

as well.


· Remove the stains. Different stains require different treatments. A solution made of water and bleach may be effective at removing ceiling stains, but only apply such solutions on days when you can open the windows and air out your home. Larger stains may require the application of a stain blocker, which may need to be applied with a roller and brush. No matter the stain, you need to leave time for the ceiling to dry before you can move on. Opening the windows can prevent your home from being overcome by

the smell of bleach and also speed up the time it takes the ceiling to dry.

- · Cover the ceiling with primer. Once the ceiling has completely dried, you can apply a stain-blocking primer to prevent future stains. Allow the primer ample time to dry.
- · Apply a fresh coat of paint. After the primer has dried completely, you can then repaint the ceiling. Some paints may blend in even if you only paint the affected areas of the ceiling, but others will require a complete repainting of the ceiling. The eye test will help you determine how

much work you have to do in that regard.

## HOW TO PREPARE A HOME FOR ELDERLY RESIDENTS

Upon reaching retirement age, new retirees may face decisions regarding their living arrangements. Some seniors may opt to stay put, while others may want to downsize their homes to save money and relieve themselves of the burdens of maintaining larger homes.

But those are not the only situations seniors find themselves in. Some seniors realize they can no longer care for themselves without assistance. In such instances, seniors may opt for assisted liv-

ing facilities or choose to move in with a relative, such as a grown son or daughter. While assisted living facilities are designed to meet the needs of the elderly, young men and women welcoming seniors into their homes may need to take on some home improvement projects to ensure their homes are as safe as possible for elderly residents.

· Convert a room on the first floor into a bedroom. While this may not apply to all seniors, some men and women struggle with stairs as they age, and that can make it difficult for them to fully participate in a household. Homeowners with an extra room to spare can convert a room on the first floor of their homes into a bedroom so seniors won't have to climb up and down stairs throughout the day. That ease of accessibility to the primary floor of the house encourages seniors to be active participants in a household. If possible, choose an area that is close to a first-floor bathroom.

· Take steps to make

bathrooms safer. The National Institute on Aging says that more than one in three seniors over age 65 fall each year, and 80 percent of those falls take place in the bathroom. Slippery tile floors can make it difficult for seniors to navigate bathrooms safely, and bathtubs and shower stalls present additional challenges. Install grab bars on bathroom walls and next to toilets to provide support.

In addition, consider installing a shower chair or bench and removable shower nozzle in the shower or tub so seniors can sit down while they bathe and rinse without having to stand up on slippery surfaces. Make sure any mats around bathtubs and sinks are nonskid to reduce the risk of falls even further.

· Install an extra phone line or two. While kids and adults between the ages of 18 and 50 may never

use the landlines in their homes, many seniors still rely on traditional telephones as their primary means of communicating with the outside world. Install extra landlines in your home, including in seniors' bedrooms, so they can more readily access the phone should they fall and need to call for emergency help. Phones in seniors' bedrooms may also provide some additional privacy to seniors who don't want to carry on phone conversations in busy areas of the home, such as the kitchen or living room. Such lines may also reduce feelings of isolation.

· Prioritize accessibility when storing items. When storing groceries, books, magazines, or other items seniors are likely to use, choose locations that are accessible to seniors. Avoid storing items on the top shelf of pantries, bookcases or entertainment centers, as seniors with limited mobility may not be able to reach them.

Many seniors move in with their adult children to make their golden

years safer and more enjoyable and manageable. Such a change in living arrangements may necessitate some changes on the part of homeowners so they can ensure their homes are safe for seniors.

Shredding is a secure way to dispose of confidential documents including, but not limited to, financial documents, personal information, account details such as passwords and login information, and mail.

Disposing of personal information safely and securely reduces the chances of fraud and helps keep your information safe," says Mayor William Choy. "I encourage residents to take advantage of the free shredding service!"
