50 NEW CONTINUING CARE SPACES OPEN IN DRAYTON VALLEY

Seniors and local residents who require additional supports with daily living now have more options for continuing care in their community with the opening of Points West Living (PWL) Drayton Valley. Residents begin moving in over the weekend.

Located in the town's northwest, the former hotel now provides a range of community-based services under one roof. This includes 50 new designated supportive living spaces, 18 of which are specially designed for supporting individuals with dementia. There are also six independent living spaces at the facility, providing options for residents to age in place and receive more care as they need it.







The suspect fled the area and was last seen heading east on Hawthorne Gate in the stolen vehicle.

Traffic is being re-routed as the investigation takes place with the assistance of the RCMP Collision Analyst.

As a result of a complex investigation, Parkland RCMP have laid charges in relation to this investigation.

Cody Marcel Young (30) of Edmonton, Alta. is charged with:

•Dangerous driving causing bodily harm

•Failure to stop after accident resulting in bodily harm

•Theft of motor vehicle

•Operate motor vehicle

while prohibited

Following a Judicial Interim Hearing, Young was held in custody to appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court on October 27, 2021.

On Sept. 25, 2021, the 25-year-old male victim from Spruce Grove, Alta died in hospital as a result of injuries sustained from this incident.

Our thoughts are with the victim's family at this difficult time.

Parkland RCMP in consultation with the office of the Crown counsel will review the charges in this matter.

Police are no longer looking for the red Ford Edge. It was located on Sept. 24, 2021 in Spruce Grove, Alta.

ALBERTA RCMP LAUNCHES ONLINE CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS IN SELECT DETACHMENTS ACROSS THE PROVINCE

In an effort to provide simpler, more efficient public service, a pilot of an online criminal record check tool begins Sept. 22, 2021 in select Alberta RCMP detachments. Criminal record check information typically obtained from RCMP detachments can now be accessed online. If this online service option is successful, it will be expanded to other locations. A criminal record check is obtained to determine if a person has been charged or convicted of a crime. Vulnerable sector checks (VSC) are included in the service provision for criminal record checks. A VSC is a police information check which is done to protect children and other vulnerable people from physical, sexual, mental, and financial abuse. A VSC is the most thorough of all background checks available. Online criminal record checks will be processed within the same timeframe as they are typically done in person and will be mailed to the applicant, unless arrangements have been made for collection at the detachment. The timing of this tool is important and beneficial, as physical distancing measures have encouraged people to minimize gathering and proximity with others. only available to the following detachments: Bashaw, Cochrane, Consort, Drayton Valley, Drumheller, Grande Prairie, Provost, St. Albert, St. Paul, Sundre, and Sylvan Lake. Criminal record checks will continue to be available in person at all detachment locations and will be the only option for any location area not covered for the pilot program.

Page 10 Community VOICE September 28, 2021 ALBERTA RCMP MAJOR CRIMES UNIT INVESTIGATING DOUBLE HOMICIDE IN HINTON

On Sept. 16, 2021, at approximately 6 p.m., Hinton RCMP responded to a report of a missing 24-year-old female and her 16-month-old toddler who were last seen in Hinton.

Hinton RCMP, along with the assistance of Alberta RCMP Major Crimes, have been investigating this occurrence. The investigation is ongoing in the Hinton area and RCMP can now confirm that both the mother and her child have since been located deceased.

On Sept. 17, 2021, Alberta RCMP Major Crimes arrested a 53-year-old male in Hinton, in relation to this investigation. He remains in custody at this time.

Robert Keith Major (age 53) from Hinton, has been charged with two counts of 2nd degree murder and 1 count of indignity to human remains. He has been remanded into custody and is scheduled to make his first court appearance on Tuesday, September 21, 2021 at 10:00 am in Edson Provincial Court.

Investigators have learned that Robert Major lived in the same apartment complex as the 24-year-old female victim and her 16-month-old child. No other connection has been identified by between the victims and the perpetrator and police are not seeking any other suspects in this case.

Autopsies are taking place at the Edmonton Medical Examiners office today, September 18 and tomorrow, September 19, 2021.

This tragic loss of life is incredibly difficult for all involved, especially the family of the victims. The family has asked for privacy to grieve at this time and of respect for the wishes of the family, the names of the deceased will not be released by the RCMP.

Autopsies were completed at the Edmonton Office of the Chief Medical Examiner and the manner of death was deemed to be homicide in both autopsies.

Robert Major's next scheduled court appearance in Hinton Provincial Court is Oct. 20, 2021.

Due to inquiries from the public and the media, the Alberta RCMP would like to clarify that Robert Major had not been subject to any Recognizance conditions since July of 2020.

MP SOROKA EXPRESSES HIS GRIEF OVER THE TRAGIC LOSS OF MCHALE BUSCH AND NOAH MCCONNELL

As the Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, I am completely heartbroken over the heinous crimes that took place in our community of Hinton. I would like to extend my sincere condolences to the family and friends of Mchale Busch and Noah McConnell.

Knowing that a convicted sex offender had the freedom to commit two counts of second-degree murder and take two innocent lives is a complete failure of our justice system. This tragedy has highlighted the need for stricter laws surrounding the parole of sex offenders.

Cody Lee McConnell (spouse/father) started a petition on Change.org that will call on the government to: Amend the Criminal Code of Canada sentencing provisions for repeat sexual offenders by requiring mandatory minimum sentences for offenders with multiple sexual assault convictions who are designated to be at high risk to reoffend and lifelong parole.

Further, require registered offenders to update their personal information, including address and contact information every month or face jail time.

I strongly support this petition and encourage everyone to take the time to sign it. These are reasonable amendments to the Criminal Code, and I promise to take these much-needed changes to Parliament.

I will be consulting with the Parliamentary Law Clerk and our Conservative Shadow Ministers for Justice and Public Safety and with their support I plan on introducing a Private Member's Bill entitled 'Noah's Law'. I will work towards all party support so that the law is changed once and for all.

Until then, I hope the family and friends of Mchale, and Noah can take solace as our community rallies around them offering our comfort and support in this agonizing times



Lighting is another factor remote workers must consider when they're planning their home offices. 

AHS POSTPONES SOME NON-URGENT SURGERIES TO CREATE ADDITIONAL HOSPITAL CAPACITY

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

With the rise in COVID-19 cases in the community and the increasing demand on hospital resources, Alberta Health Services (AHS) is taking steps to create additional acute and ICU capacity.

This will result in the postponement of some non-urgent surgeries and procedures to ensure we have the beds and staff required to take care of all patients needing hospital care, including those with COVID-19 as well as other Albertans who are sick or injured.

This proactive approach mirrors similar surgical reductions during previous waves. AHS will maintain emergent, urgent procedures, as well as prioritized cancer surgeries.

These measures will help free up space in our hospitals for patients who need a higher level of care, and allow us to redeploy frontline staff and resources to areas of greatest need.

Any patient whose surgery or procedure is being postponed due to this temporary reduction will be contacted directly by AHS. To date, service adjustments are being planned in two zones.

In the North Zone, approximately 45 elective surgical procedures per week at the Queen Elizabeth II Hospital in Grande Prairie will be postponed starting August 30. This will allow the site to increase bed capacity and create a dedicated COVID-19 unit.

In the Edmonton zone, up to 30 per cent of non-urgent surgeries and procedures will be postponed starting August 30.


AHS is currently working through the province's surgical backlog brought on by the pandemic. For the last two months we have been operating at 100 per cent of pre-COVID-19 surgical levels, and have been performing more non-urgent scheduled surgeries.

All backlogged surgeries in wave one have been rebooked and 96 per cent of all delayed surgeries from wave one, two and three have been completed.

We strongly urge all eligible Albertans to get immunized as quickly as possible, and to continue following preventative measures such as staying home when sick.

Its mission is to provide a patient-focused, quality health system that is accessible and sustainable for all Albertans.
