WHAT MATTERS TO YOU

The fall weather has been cooperating in our area fairly warm, not too windy, and touch wood, no white stuff on the ground yet. The leaves are lingering as well, which makes for some amazing photographs around the area that I've been seeing posted up on social media. With that, I'd like to put out a call to those who would be interested in sharing with me some of those photos of our area, so that we can put them up on our web site, and shamelessly promote Lac Ste. Anne - Parkland. I'd like to hear about your harvest stories, your upcoming hunting stories, or any fond fall memories.

This past week I was able to christen my newly opened Mayerthorpe satellite office by meeting with several local farmers who shared some great ideas on how to improve the pasture crop insurance program. It's all too easy just to say it's bad, and that someone needs to fix it - it's much more difficult, and rewarding, to work as a team and come up with real proposals on how to fix it. I've noted down all the ideas and input I received and will be able to apply some of my previous job experience to formulate a method and model for the proposed changes to compare how the two-day rain events in August would have been mitigated with a new model if the rain periods were not monthly, if soil moisture is considered, and taking into account lengthy sustained temperatures combined with wind. Again, hats off to the local folks who rolled

up their shirt sleeves so we could work on this together.

If you read the news, you know there was a bad accident on highway 37, east of highway 779 near Callaloo, which is becoming unacceptably too common. A local Sturgeon County Councilor (Wayne Bokenfohr) has been working on a practical solution - lowering the speeds through that section of road and increasing the size of the school bus signs. Unfortunately, the most recent accident further enforced the need for a speed reduction. I, and other local representatives, will continue to work with Transportation, and the minister's office to accelerate a review, and hopefully have the changes made in short order. I would also like to put out a humble request for those that use that section of road to slow down and keep vigilant so that no one else gets hurt until the changes are made.



ALBERTA RCMP WARNS CONSUMERS OF ONLINE HAY SALE SCAM

Alberta RCMP are warning rural and farming communities to be aware of fraud that affects consumers looking to purchase hay. Due to extreme drought conditions this past summer, there is now a high demand for hay which is being sold at increased costs. This may cause farmers and agricultural workers to make purchases without taking time to properly verify or research production sources.

Across various RCMP jurisdictions this year, various groups have scammed victims of approximately \$64,000. With many cases potentially not being reported, this figure could be higher.

Recently, fraudsters have been placing listings for

hay on social media and buy-and-sell platforms, requesting immediate payment before buvers have the opportunity to research the producer, see the product, or receive delivery. This summer, both Evansburg RCMP and Grande Prairie RCMP received similar reports of transactions on Facebook Marketplace for a purchase of hay where a quantity of money was sent through an e-transfer, but no hay was delivered, and the funds were

In all reported cases of hay fraud, the maximum individual deposit sent to scammers was over \$5,000, and the minimum was \$1,000. For consumers, it is valuable to note that those who avoided being scammed had refused to give deposits in advance,

insisted upon speaking on the phone, and had paid cash upon delivery of goods.

The following key indicators can help you to identify a potential scam across online selling platforms:

•Typically, sellers will only communicate through text messaging and avoid phone conversations.

•Sellers can be located anywhere in the world and will get the attention of buyers by having a specific or specialized knowledge of hay products

•Pricing will be attractively low and will be consistent with the previous year's market price.

•Often, there will be an insistence of a 50% deposit but once the deposit is received, there may be excuses about delayed delivery and then

communication stops.



PROTECT YOUR VEHICLE FROM SNOW, ICE AND DAMAGE FROM THE COLD

Winter can be an unforgiving season. Freezing temperatures coupled with snow and ice can take its toll on people who live in climates where cold weather is a fact of winter life.

While winter can test people's patience, it also can be harsh on cars and trucks. Understanding what components of a vehicle can be compromised by dropping temperatures and snowy roads can help drivers take action to safeguard their automotive investments.

While the Canadian Automobile Association notes that winter can wreak havoc on just about every part

of a vehicle, there are some parts that seem to bear the brunt of Old Man Winter's abuse. Properly servicing and caring for a car or truck can help.

Drivers should take their vehicles for a tuneup and inspection before wintry weather arrives. A mechanic will examine the car battery and check antifreeze levels and make sure that the thermostat, defroster, brakes, and even wiper blades are working effectively. Have the tires inspected for adequate tread, which can make navigating roads safer. If the treads are worn, replace the tires.

In addition to visiting their mechanics, drivers can perform some inspections and fixes themselves.



Check that all of the vehicle's lights are operational so your car can be easily seen during inclement weather. Exchange your existing windshield washer fluid with one that will not freeze in cold conditions. Check the nozzles on the windshield-washer

system routinely and clear out any blockages of ice or debris. While addressing windshield washer fluid, also replace worn out windshield wiper blades with ones that can withstand snow and icy weather.

A new coating of wax can serve as a shield against road salt, snow, sleet, and rain. Try a poly-

> mer wax to protect the paint. Whenever possible, rinse off salt and grime so it does not dry on the car and gradually wear away at the paint. Some drivers mistakenly believe that salt stops being a problem

once it dries simply because moisture is the active ingredient for a corrosive reaction. But humidity in the air is enough to keep the salt eating away at the car's paint, and that can contribute to rust. Be sure to rinse off the undercarriage of the vehicle as well.

Have your tires' alignment checked toward the end of winter or early spring. A season of traveling over pothole-ridden roads or hitting curbs buried under snow drifts can affect the alignment. Get everything back on track. Similarly, inspect tires routinely, as weather changes can affect tire pressure and strength.
