LAKEMERE 4-H BEEF CLUB

Did you know that 4-H Alberta was founded in 1917? The Lakemere 4-H Beef Club was founded in 1939 and is one of the oldest clubs in Alberta. 4-H is open to members from age nine to twenty one and age six to eight for cleavers. 4-H is a youth organization focused on development of life skills and project related skills. Members must attend seventy percent of club activities, complete a community service and a communication activity (presentation or speech).

On October 6, 2021 Lakemere had our club reorganizational meeting. Topics we discussed included what projects we are going to offer this year, how we are going to proceed with the upcoming year, our tire recycling fundraiser and we welcomed new members.

Every year at least once, sometimes two to three times, we have a tire recycling fundraiser. Anyone who has tires they want to donate to the club can call us, we will come pick up the tires, and take them to the Parkland County Transfer Station. We are very thankful for the community's support in our club.

This year Lakemere has the following projects; vet sciences, beef (calendar year calf, market steer, carcass steer, yearling heifer, second and third year old cow/calf), cleavers (for ages 6-8), woodworking, and new this year horticulture and foods. Vet sciences is run by Dr. Tammy Nay from the Onoway Veterinary Clinic and the meetings include information on small, large, and exotic animals. The perfect project for the aspiring vet-

erinarian! The beef project has many projects within itself. Beef Weigh In day is on November 6 at the Bowman farm and anyone wanting to participate in the market beef, yearling heifer or carcass steer projects need to have their animals there.

Cleavers is for the budding 4-H members and is only for kids age six to eight. Activities include crafts, bak-

ing, and agriculture related topics. Cleavers are also invited to participate in other projects to discover what they would like to pursue when they are old enough to be in a 4-H project. Woodworking members in previous years have made cutting boards, christmas decorations, and tool boxes. Woodworking meetings are held on weekends at NAIT

or another workshop. New this year we are offering horticulture and foods, as there has been an interest from the membership to learn more about gardening and cooking.

Our next meeting will be on November 3 at the Onoway Heritage Centre and start time will be at 7pm. Hope to see some new faces!

COVID-19 SUPPORT MEASURES

Gerald Soroka Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise that the Government of Canada has announced the Canada Recovery Benefit (CRB) will end on October 23, 2021. It will be replaced by a Canadian Worker Lockdown Benefit that will provide \$300 per week to workers whose work interruption is caused by a government-imposed public health lockdown.

Also, the Emergency Wage Subsidy and the Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy will be modified and re-named into new programs, the Tourism and Hospitality Recovery Program and the Hardest-Hit Business Recovery Program, under existing authority until November 20, 2021. The government will introduce legislation to extend those programs until May 7, 2022.

GOVERNMENT OF ALBERTA, EDUCATION MINISTER, NOT RESPONDING AS ALBERTA SCHOOL BUS CONTRACTORS ARE FORCED TO SHUT DOWN OPERATIONS

146,000 Alberta Children affected, now with no one to take them to school

More than 146,000 Alberta children rely on buses for their transportation to and from school each day. Over the course of the past year, changes to insurance premiums have put bus contractors in an impossible situation, many being forced to park their buses and close their businesses. Without some form of assistance from the Alberta government, bus contractors will continue to shut down their operations.

Keeping buses on the road for safe delivery of children should be a high priority across Alberta, but repeat-

ed attempts to contact the Alberta government and, in particular, Minister of Education Adriana LaGrange, have resulted in little to no action.

"Alberta School Bus Contractors are facing a major crisis," said Mark Critch, President of the Alberta School Bus Contractors' Association, "There are immediate and urgent issues that must be addressed for school bus contractors to continue with their mandate of carrying students to their schools. Without the continued flow of adequate funding, carriers will have no choice but to lay off drivers, maintenance staff and administrative staff and in turn shut their operations down."

At issue is a 358% increase in insurance rates for small

contracted bus operators, which was implemented in November 2020. The increase in rates is out of the bus contractors' control, as it occurred mid-year in the contracts. The cost of the insurance jumped from \$1,300 per bus to \$4,300 per bus. Obviously, a high percentage of contractors conducting this highly important but low-paid work do not have the funds to cover this increase.

An increase of this magnitude is affecting all contractors in the province, especially the small to medium size operators. They are in dire need of a solution to this issue, immediately. Without support, children will not have reliable transportation to and from school.

Other issues at hand exac-

erbate the crisis:

- School divisions do not cover all pandemic-related costs. Drivers required to be in isolation due to close contact with a COVID-19-positive student must have their immediate wages covered. Otherwise, it is unlikely that they will return to the job.

- Due to the pandemic, there are no field or charter trips as an additional revenue source, which previously helped offset indirect costs.

Up to this point, nothing has been done to assist the bus contractors. This must change immediately in order to preserve this vital transportation service for Alberta's children.

ENJOY A FRUGAL FALL ROAD TRIP

Road trips are a staple of autumn for many motorists. Fall foliage and moderate temperatures make the months of September and October ideal months to hit the open road for weekend getaways.

· Plot your route. Spontaneity may make fall road trips more fun, but drivers looking to save money should plot their routes in advance so they can avoid potentially costly problems like detours or road work that can waste fuel and lead to hours sitting in traffic.
