PARKLAND RCMP INVESTIGATE A SERIES OF SUSPICIOUS FIRES

In April 2021, Parkland RCMP started an investigation into a series of suspicious fires in the Parkland County and Sturgeon County Regions.

Over the course of the investigation, it was determined that the wildland fires were intentionally set.

On Sept. 15, 2021, a 31-year-old male from Spruce Grove, Alta. was charged with six counts of Arson. He is scheduled to appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court on Nov. 3, 2021.

Wildland fires are a major concern and affect many people long after the fire is extinguished. The costs associated with fighting such fires and the resources used further affect residents of the County overall, which can delay other projects. Parkland RCMP worked in partnership with Parkland County Fire Department, Sturgeon County Fire Department, Alberta Forestry crimes and Morinville RCMP in this multi-jurisdiction investigation.









ALBERTA RCMP MAJOR CRIMES UNIT INVESTIGATE THE DISCOVERY OF HUMAN REMAINS

On Nov. 3, 2021 at 11:10 a.m., Parkland RCMP with the assistance of Parkland RCMP General Investigation Section and Devon RCMP, responded to found human remains in the area of Highway 60 below the Devon bridge.

Parkland RCMP's investigation into the circumstances surrounding the found human remains are believed to be suspicious. As such, the Alberta RCMP Major Crime Unit attended and took over carriage of the investigation. The Alberta RCMP Major Crime Unit, along with the assistance of Parkland RCMP

General Investigation Section and the RCMP Forensic Identification Services, continue to investigate the suspicious death.

An autopsy is scheduled to be completed on Nov. 4, 2021 by the Edmonton Office of the Chief Medical Examiner.



HOW DRIVERS CAN MAKE CITY DRIVING SAFER

Many drivers will never find themselves behind the wheel of a car or truck within city limits. But when the occasion calls for driving in crowded cities where conditions are more hectic than in the suburbs or rural areas, drivers can take steps to make themselves more comfortable.

• Drive a vehicle with an automatic transmission. City driving features lots of stopand-go traffic, which can make driving cars with manual transmissions more stressful. When possible, drive vehicles with automatic transmissions in crowded cities. Doing so may even help drivers be more aware of their surroundings.

• Drive small cars. Small cars are easier to maneuver within city limits than large vehicles. Mid-size sedans, trucks and SUVs can be more difficult to parallel park, and even when


spaces are available, such vehicles might not fit. City dwellers tend to rely more on public transportation than their own vehicles, so drivers moving to cities might find small cars align better with their new lifestyles than large automobiles.

Use parking assist technology. Drivers who are somewhat rusty with regard to parallel parking may find parking assist

technology makes it considerably easier to squeeze into tight city spots. Rear-mounted cameras that project onto the vehicle's dashboard navigation screen can help drivers avoid bumping other cars when backing in, while sensors can notify drivers when they're getting too close to other cars.



The Green Certificate Program was developed by Alberta Agriculture and Forestry


