HINTON RCMP CHARGE SUSPECT IN ATTEMPTED CATALYTIC CONVERTER THEFT

On December 6, 2021 at 5:59 a.m. Hinton RCMP received reports of a break and enter in progress at a business on Felaber Road. Police attended and located a male being restrained by witnesses who discovered him attempting to steal catalytic converters. The catalytic converters were recovered with numerous other items of property including tools, saws, cable cutters and blades. Also recovered were weapons which included bear spray and a knife. The value to repair the damaged catalytic converters is estimated to be approximately \$11,000.

Lyle Alan Wilson (30) of no fixed address is charged with the following offences from this incident:

- Assault with a Weapon
- Mischief Over \$5000
- Possession of Break In Instruments
- Carry a Concealed Weapon
- Possession of Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose
- Theft Under \$5000
- Fail to Comply with Condition of Release Order
- The investigation determined Wilson also had outstanding warrants for arrest from Morinville for:
 - Identity Fraud
 - Obstruct Peace Officer
 - Fail to Attend Court

Following a judicial hearing, Alan was released on conditions and is next scheduled to appear in Hinton Provincial Court on December 15, 2021. As these matters are now before the courts, no further details can be released.

THIS WEEK'S MID-YEAR FISCAL UPDATE SHOWED THAT ALBERTA'S ECONOMY IS CONTINUING TO SOAR.

According to the update, the deficit for 2021-22 is now forecast at \$5.8 billion. This is \$12.4 billion lower than the budget estimate and \$1.9 billion lower than the first quarter fiscal update. Total revenue in 2021-22, meanwhile, is forecast at \$57.9 billion, \$14.2 billion higher than the budget estimate and \$2.9 billion higher than the first quarter fiscal update.

Alberta's updated forecasts show that real gross domestic product is expected to grow by 6.1 per cent this year, which is significantly higher than the 4.8 per cent forecast released at the start of the year.

Job numbers are way up, with Statistics Canada's latest report showing that Alberta

created 15,000 new jobs in November and has created 105,400 new jobs over the past 12 months. These jobs are in addition to the hundreds of thousands of jobs that were lost and restored since the start of the pandemic. At 64 per cent, Alberta now has the highest employment rate in the nation!

Further, evidence now shows that the Job Creation Tax Cut and continued efforts to make Alberta the most competitive business environment in North America are working. Corporate income tax revenue of \$2.9 billion is forecast for 2021-22, \$1 billion more than what was forecast in February's budget. This revenue is now forecast to increase by an average of 19 per cent over the next two years to reach \$4.1 billion in

2023-24 as growth in investment and profits continue.

In true Alberta fashion, we are leading Canada's economy recovery. This is an astounding turnaround from the challenging times we saw under the NDP's terrible policies, low oil prices and the heights of the pandemic. According to economist Trevor Tombe, "This week's fiscal update represents the largest improvement in provincial finances ever recorded."

Various factors are supporting this strong economic comeback, including improved commodity prices, but our government's persistent focus on attracting new investment and improving competitiveness for our key sectors is making a major difference at this challenging economic time.

Thanks to our policy efforts, our province is seeing billions of dollars in new investment and capital being deployed across the province right now. This is happening in hydrogen, tech, aerospace, petrochemicals, and many other areas.

Alberta's Recovery Plan is working, and Albertans are going back to work. This is great news for our families and businesses who have endured so much over the past year. According to Minister of Jobs, Economy and Innovation Doug Schweitzer, Alberta is getting its "swagger back" and I couldn't agree more.

EDSON RCMP LAY CHARGES IN OIL LEASE SITE BREAK AND ENTER

In late November 2021, Edson RCMP arrested a male and laid charges in relation to an investigation into a break and enter at an oil lease site which had occurred in May 2021, as well as other incidents.

On June 3, 2021, Edson RCMP responded to a report of a break and enter that had occurred just after midnight on May 31, 2021, at an oil lease site in the rural area of Edson in Yellowhead County, Alta.

At that time, two field cameras each containing SIM cards and SD cards as well as a solar charger were stolen.

On Oct. 29, 2021, Edson RCMP were advised that one of the SIM cards stolen in the May 2021 incident was active and being used.

Edson RCMP's investigation led to obtaining tracking warrants for the stolen SIM cards. As a result, on Nov. 25, 2021 the Edson RCMP General Investigation Section (GIS) and the Western Alberta District

Crime Reduction Unit, arrested an adult male in possession of a stolen pick-up truck in Edson. A search warrant was subsequently obtained which was executed at a residence in Edson on Nov. 27, 2021, and additional stolen property was recovered in relation to other incidents. Copper wire casings that had been stripped were located in the garage.

Multiple items of stolen property were recovered during the investigation including a GMC pick up which had been reported stolen from Whitecourt on Nov.25, 2021 and two oil-field batteries that had been stolen on Nov. 13, 2021, in Yellowhead County. The Edson RCMP were able to return some of the items to their rightful owners.

Scot Waddell (33) of Ed-

son was arrested and has been charged with:

- Possession of stolen property over \$5000
- Break and enter
- Possess stolen property under (x7)
- Possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine)
- Drive while suspended (TSA)

After a judicial hearing, Waddell was released on a \$1500 no-cash release order and will next be appearing in Edson Provincial Court on Jan. 4, 2022.

Edson RCMP continue their investigation. As these matters are now before the courts, no further details can be provided.

One of my mentors told me that when it comes to the pipeline industry, remember the ROW (right of way) is only so wide. Chances are, you will pass the same person more than once in your career. So, you may as well try to get along with them, or they might block you in the next time you need to get by. I've heard another similar analogy about climbing a ladder with many on different rungs, and how the view differs between those looking up at the person ahead of them and the person looking down at the person behind them. The perspective and culture leadership

brings to and organization or community can make all the difference. Personally, I like better the way Doug put it using the ROW analogy.

I've heard the phrase 'in the good old days' a number of times growing up and throughout my career path. Again, I believe it's a matter of perspective. Are the changes happening in a workplace when we 'progress' good or bad? When it comes to freedom and self-reliance, I'm envious when I reflect back on 'the good old days.' When it comes to creature comforts, such as the ability to connect with others around the world, or transportation, well, we are ahead of the curve to be sure.

At times, I have said to my mentors "It's because you guys got to do EVERYTHING that I can hardly do ANYTHING". I do believe that some of the standards we have today, through learned experience, are a good thing. But we are also quickly diminishing self-reliance. If the safety net were taken away for a moment, I wonder how much we would see actually being taken. If people were accountable and responsible for their own actions, imagine how their behaviors might change. There is something to be said for life's bumps and bruises as we grow.

On those old jobs, Doug was right. I ran across several people like him on projects or in other companies throughout my career. The 'usual suspects' always seemed to show up in leadership roles, at all levels, and when you get enough of them together, that is when real good things happen. Morale goes up, safety and culture improve, quality improves, productivity goes up; the environment is taken care of, and the 'silly bugger' factor goes way down; the tribal knowledge is passed onto another generation. Like attracts like, and success breeds success. I've also observed this from town to town, and sometimes from province to province or state.

In my new role as MLA, the 'usual suspects' often show up in the form of community leaders, volunteers, and other elected officials. The folks that are engaged in their community tend to shape it, and

many of us take for granted the amount of time they give up trying to make things better. The best communities allow for new ideas, and new people to join and contribute. These are the areas that flourish and seem to have generational success. What I'd encourage people to do is to join a club, help when you can, get to know your neighbors a little better, and when you can, also try to connect with similar clubs in another community just down the road. Grow your network, grow the local businesses, pitch in a little, and help each other a little more. Basic stuff, but you would be amazed of the results! To the 'usual suspects' in Lac Ste. Anne-Parkland, we truly appreciate all that you do.

Please recruit and mentor others. You will find that when you do this, you will ultimately enjoy yourself more, your families will be happier as well because you won't be taking up so much of their time for your next project. The end results of the project may not be entirely what you envisioned but could be something way better when you have those fresh ideas, bright eyes, and bellies full of enthusiasm to lean on. Why not make tomorrow the 'good old days' for the next person below you on the ladder?

Things change, and in my lifetime I've seen the unfortunate diminishing of the little towns and small roadside services. Change is hard, but I do believe there is a silver lining of all the calamity over the ...

ALBERTA RCMP WANTS ROAD USERS TO ARRIVE HOME SAFELY THIS HOLIDAY SEASON

The holidays are a time spent creating memories with loved ones. This December, through traffic education and enforcement initiatives, the Alberta RCMP is working to ensure you and yours arrive home safely. The Alberta RCMP

is promoting sober driving through National Impaired Driving Enforcement Day on Saturday, Dec. 4. As part of the annual, Canada-wide initiative, Alberta RCMP will be patrolling our provincial highways and conducting check stops, removing impaired drivers from the roadways.

The Alberta RCMP asks motorists to remember the

following:

- Driving while under the influence of drugs or alcohol impairs your judgment and reaction time.
- Impaired driving is criminal and dangerous.
- Mandatory Alcohol Screening is used by Alberta RCMP to deter and detect impaired drivers. If you are pulled over or at a check stop, you can expect to pro-

vide a breath sample.

•Individuals with a Graduated Driver's Licence must abide by the zero tolerance law (Government of Alberta, 2021).

•Impaired driving is always preventable and can always be avoided. Call a taxi or rideshare service, use a designated driver, or stay the night.

•Call 911 if you witness or suspect impaired driving.

"In December 2020, a total of 560 impaired drivers were removed from the roads," says Supt. Gary Graham, Alberta RCMP Traffic Services. "Every time you get behind the wheel under the influence of drugs or alcohol, you not only risk your own safety, but also the safety of others. Don't be the reason someone doesn't make it home for the holidays."

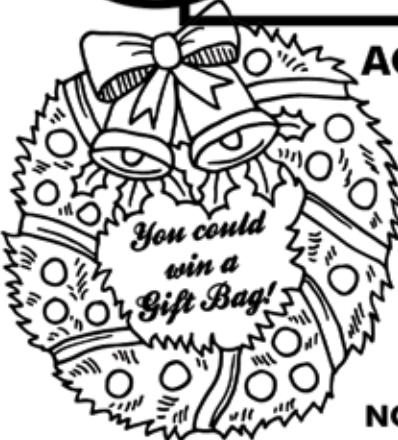
