WINTER BREAK EXTENDED FOR K-12 STUDENTS

To support a successful return to school and provide additional planning time, the kindergarten to Grade 12 winter break will be extended provincewide to January 10. The extended break will give school authorities time to gather additional data to assess staffing implications and the potential operational impacts of the current COVID-19 situation.

To assist with the safe return to classes, Alberta

Health and Municipal Affairs' PPE Task Force will also deliver 8.6 million rapid tests and 16.5 million masks to schools, starting the week of January 10.

With this change, we are responding to concerns from Education stakeholders and aligning Alberta with other provinces in Canada. A pause will also help school authorities plan for changes in testing and contact notification.

The rapid test distribution will offer enough rapid tests to provide two five-test kits to each student and staff member across the entire education system. Distribution is being finalized and more information will be shared next week.

Medical-grade masks will also be distributed through schools to students and school staff through a phased approach. When fully distributed, staff and students will receive an eight week supply. Both pediatric and adult medical grade mask distribution will be coordinated in a phased approach through Municipal Affairs' PPE Task Force and more information will also be shared next week.

More information on next steps related to whether students will learn in class or at home beginning January 10 will be communicated late next week. The decision will be evidence-based using operational information provided by school authorities, case information and other available health data.

January 4, 2022 ALBERTA RCMP MAJOR CRIMES INVESTIGATE HOMICIDE

Submitted by Alberta RCMP

The Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit's investigation into the Nov. 4, 2021, fa-tal shooting of 44-year-old Cordell MacLellan of Edson, has resulted in an arrest and charges.

Further investigation into the fatal shooting led Alberta RCMP Major Crimes to attempt the arrest of a 21-year-old male on Dec. 11, 2021, at 4:00 p.m., with the assistance of Edson RCMP; however, the male fled into a treed area north of Highway 16 and east of Highway 32. The suspect was contained awaiting additional resources from the RCMP Police Dog Service and the Alberta **RCMP** Emergency Response Team. As the Alberta RCMP Air Services was unavailable to assist, Edmonton Police Service Air 1 provided assistance. At approximately 6:40 p.m., the male was taken into

custody by the Alberta RCMP Emergency Response Team.

Brent Michael Dumas (21) of Yellowhead County, Alta., is charged with:

•First degree murder

 Possession of a prohibited firearm

·Possession of a firearm contrary to order

Assault with a weapon

Following a judicial hearing, Dumas was remanded into custody and is scheduled to appear in Edson Provincial Court via CCTV on January 18, 2022.

In relation to the charge of Assault With a Weapon, a second employee, a 32-yearold male from Edson, was assaulted by the suspect during a physical altercation, that occurred after the shooting, while still inside the store.

As this matter is before the courts, no further details can be provided.
