As a result of continued investigation, Charmaine Bear now faces additional charges of:

1 count, aggravated assault, section 268(2) of the Criminal Code

2 counts, assault, section 266 of the Criminal Code

2 counts, uttering threats, section 264.1(1)(a) of the Criminal Code

This investigation began in December, 2020 when North Battleford RCMP and North Battleford RCMP General Investigation Services received a report of alleged child abuse.

Warrant for arrest extended to Alberta

The warrant for her arrest has been extended Alberta-wide as investigation has determined Charmaine has been seen in the City of Edmonton, Alberta. She is also known to frequent the Lloydminster, North Battleford, Mosquito First Nation and Saskatoon areas.

ALBERTA RCMP ENFORCE ROADWAY SAFETY THROUGHOUT THE HOLIDAY SEASON

Submitted by Alberta RCMP

Over the course of the holidays, the Alberta RCMP were helping to make the season safe, merry, and bright for all road users. Between Dec. 24, 2021 and Jan. 3, 2022, RCMP carried out enforcement initiatives focussed on promoting traffic safety and issued a total of

Alberta 1,812 traffic tickets across the province.

Overall, 506 individuals were ticketed for speeding, 55 motorists were caught distracted driving, and 125 impaired drivers were removed from the roads by way of provincial Immediate Roadside Sanctions. Due to a variety of aggravating factors, of the 125 impaired drivers, 15 were

also charged with Criminal Code Impaired Driving by Alcohol. Another 1,251 motorists received tickets for traffic safety violations including careless driving, driving with a prohibited or suspended license, moving offences, and more.

In total, Alberta RCMP recorded 1,952 roadway offences compared to last year's 2,578.

The holidays are a time spent creating memories and #UnwrappingMoments with loved ones. This season, through traffic education and enforcement initiatives, the Alberta RCMP worked to help you and yours arrive home safely.

CANADA-ALBERTA LIVESTOCK FEED ASSISTANCE AGRIRECOVERY

Gerald Soroka Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise that the Canada-Alberta Livestock Feed Assistance AgriRecovery initiative's second phase opened on January 5, 2022 will provides continued assistance to eligible Alberta producers, who were hit hard by the 2021 drought. If you applied for phase one, you need to complete the application for phase two under the same business name.

In phase two, producers can apply for additional compensation (a secondary payment) to help cover costs over and above the phase one initial payment. Due to prolonged dry weather and extreme high temperatures, many producers experienced reduced grazing capacity causing a severe economic hit.

The secondary payment will be calculated using a feed-need calculation, supplemented by proof of eligible expenses, for all livestock with the exception of bees. Eligible beekeepers

can be compensated for up to 70 per cent of the extraordinary costs associated with feed (pollen patties or syrup) required to prepare eligible hives for winter to a maximum of \$7.50 per hive/colony.

Application deadline is January 31, 2022.

CANADA SUMMER JOBS 2022 EMPLOYER APPLICATION



or fewer full-time employees can apply for funding now until January 25, 2022, to hire young Canadians next summer. Full-time job placements will take place during the summer of 2022.

Employers interested in applying for CSJ 2022 funding can submit their applications electronically via either the online fillable application or the Grants and Contributions Online Service. The online fillable application is the fastest way for employers to complete an application online without having to create an account.





TAX TIP - HOW TO VERIFY THE CRA HAS **CONTACTED YOU**

With the holidays just around the corner, scammers could contact you pretending to be from the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). Scammers are trying to trick individuals

· Crush Cravings

· Increase Energy

· Metabolize fat to Energy

into making payments, and we're doing everything we can to put a stop to this. That includes letting you know when and how we might contact you.

How to make sure the caller is a CRA employee and not a scammer

A legitimate CRA employ-

ee will identify themselves when they contact you. The employee will give you their name and a phone number. Make sure the caller is a CRA employee before you give any information over the phone. This will protect you from giving money or personal information to a scammer.

If you're suspicious, this is how you can make sure the caller is from the CRA:

- Tell the caller you would like to first verify their identity.
- Request and make a note of their:
- a. name
- phone number b.
- office location
- End the call. Then 3. check that the information provided during the call was legitimate by contacting the CRA. Please do this before you give any information to the caller.

Once you complete those three steps, you may call back the CRA employee to discuss the reason for their call.

Note that our individual tax, benefits and business enquiries lines offer an automated call back service. When wait times reach a certain threshold, you will be given the option of a callback, rather than waiting on hold. If you opt for a callback, we will give you a randomized four-digit confirmation number. This number will be repeated back to you by the call centre agent at the time of the callback. This is to provide you with assurance that the call is from a legitimate CRA employee.

When to be suspicious Red flags that suggest a

caller is a scammer include (but are not limited to):

- The caller does not give you proof of working for the CRA. For example, their name and office location.
- The caller pressures you to act now or uses aggressive language.

- The caller asks you to pay with prepaid credit cards, gift cards, cryptocurrency or some other unusual form of payment.
- The caller asks for information you would not enter on your return or that is not related to money you owe the CRA, for example, a credit card number.
- The caller recommends that you apply for benefits. You can apply for benefits directly on Government of Canada websites or by phone. Do not give information to callers offering to apply for benefits on your behalf!

We may review your re-

One reason we may contact you is if we are reviewing your income tax and benefit return. This could include reviewing you GST/ HST, T4 or T5 information. You may receive a letter or a phone call telling you that the CRA is reviewing your return. If you're registered for email notifications, we will send you an email telling you that your letter is available in My Account. In most cases, our review is a routine check. It's important that you reply and send all of the information requested as soon as possible. This will help us review your file quickly and easily.

It's also important that you call the number in your letter in either of the following situations:

- You can't get the documents we're asking for
- You need more time to reply

By calling, we can give

you more time to respond if you need it. We can also help you if you have any questions. If you don't reply, we may disallow a claim of yours and you could have a balance owing.

If you own a small business or are self-employed, we may call you or send you

a letter to offer free tax help through our Liaison Officer service. This will be the first contact. We will only use email if you provide your email address and consent to the CRA.

WHITECOURT APPROVES 2022 INTERIM BUDGET

Submitted by Town of lights: Whitecourt

Whitecourt Town Council has approved the 2022 Interim Operating and Capital Budget. The Interim Budget includes over \$42 million in capital and operating expenditures, and requires a 2.61% overall tax change.

The budget maintains the \$1.365 million in reductions made in 2019 to 2021, and allows the municipality to maintain service levels and continued investment in local infrastructure. The 2022 Interim Budget Report can be viewed on the Whitecourt website at www. whitecourt.ca/Government. 2022 Capital Budget High-

- The 2022 Street Improvement Program includes street, lighting, and sidewalk repairs at locations throughout the community.
- Construction on the Water System Upgrade Project will be completed. The project includes construction of a dedicated supply main and other system upgrades, including pressure reducing measures to improve the distribution network and fire flows, as well as the extension of the waterline form east of Dahl Drive to the bottom of Eastlink Park.

2022 Operating Budget Highlights:

· Continued collaboration and development of new agreements through voluntary arbitration with Woodlands County for services that benefit residents of both municipalities.

- · Following the receipt of \$15.6 million for the construction of an Arts & Culture Centre and new library from the Investing in Canadian Infrastructure Program, the Town of Whitecourt will be re-engaging community stakeholders and members, and undertaking a public education campaign in early 2022.
- · Complete a review of collection and disposal services for residential waste, recycling and compost services.

· The new Whitecourt

website will launch in early 2022 and will incorporate a new look, improved navigation and interactive tools including a municipal app. Whitecourt will also expand its social media presence to include Instagram.

The 2022 Budget will be finalized in the spring of 2022 once the Provincial budget is adopted, and final assessment figures are established. Specific tax rate impacts will vary by property type depending on the assessed value of a home or business, and will be determined once the final budget is adopted.






