PARKLAND RCMP LAY CHARGES IN FIREARM AND DRUGS INVESTIGATION

On Jan. 16, 2022, at approximately 6:50 a.m., Parkland RCMP received a firearms complaint regarding 22-year-old Brett Louis David Boulbria of Spruce Grove. When Park-

land RCMP members located him at a hotel in Stony Plain, he was allegedly in possession of a stolen rifle, a sawed off shotgun, methamphetamine, cocaine, and fentanyl. He was arrested and held for a bail hearing.

Brett Louis David Boulbria is charged with the follow-


ing offences:

- Unauthorized possession of a firearm/prohibited weapon or restricted weapon (x 3)
- Possession of a firearm/prohibited weapon when knowing possession unauthorized (x 2)

KNOW THE RISKS INVOLVED IN VAPING

What is a vape?
A vape is an electronic smoking device that contains a cartridge of liquid (e-juice) or other forms of nicotine (or cannabis) that are heated into a vapor and inhaled by the user. Vaping is not harmless. Vaping can increase your exposure to harmful chemicals

and lead to nicotine addiction. The short and long term health effects are unknown, but recent reports are showing significant respiratory and health effects such as lung failure, seizures and even death.

Although rare, some vaping devices may catch fire or explode, leading to burns or injuries.

What should parents look for?

Parents should pay attention to an unusual attachment to a USB stick, sharpie, pen, lip-stick, key fob, etc. These items may be electronic cigarettes “disguised” as everyday items.

Talk to your teen about vaping

Alberta Health Services recommends talking to your teen about electronic cigarettes (vape) early, even as young as age 10.

ALBERTA'S ECONOMY IS HEATING UP, EVEN AS THE TEMPERATURES GROW COLD.

Despite the chilly season, our caucus has been hard at work. We continue to prioritize Alberta's Recovery Plan, which is our action-focused plan to get Albertans back to work and usher in a new era of prosperity. Last year, we added hundreds of thousands of new jobs to our economy, and the numbers indicate high levels of growth across all sectors. Things are looking up for everyone, including our dynamic agriculture sector.

Albertans rely on the hard work of our farmers and livestock producers. Unfortunately, last year, Alberta experienced severe drought conditions across the province. Our government worked with Alberta's agriculture pro-

ducers to ensure their needs were being met through these challenging circumstances. Now, we're seeing the positive results of these efforts.

On November 24, Statistics Canada released its third quarter (January to September 2021) farm cash receipts and finalized 2020 farm income estimates. I'm proud to report that for the first three quarters of 2021, farm cash receipts increased on a year-over-year basis to a new record and ranked first among all Canadian provinces.

To be specific, Alberta's total third quarter farm cash receipts increased 15.8 per cent from the same period in 2020, to a record \$13.3 billion. But not only did we rank first in total farm cash receipts - we also ranked first in livestock market receipts, cattle and calf re-

ceipts and program payments.

Alberta's Recovery Plan is focused on growing our agriculture sector and supporting Alberta's farmers and farm families. Our United Conservative government greatly values the role of farmers and agriculture producers across our province, and we will always be there to support them.

Our government recently announced a major investment of \$117 million to improve irrigation infrastructure across 10 Alberta irrigation districts. I am also pleased to announce that agriculture producers now have another opportunity to apply for financial aid. Our next phase of support for Alberta livestock producers has now opened. Now, livestock producers and beekeepers can apply for phase two of the 2021 Canada-Alberta Livestock

Feed Assistance AgriRecovery initiative. Through this program, we have been rapidly deploying assistance to thousands of producers to cover the costs incurred by last year's drought conditions. We have committed up to \$340 million in compensation to help members of this vital industry get back on their feet. Proposed Bylaw 2021-27: Springbank Park Estates Redistricting (Amendment to Land Use Bylaw 2017-18)

Parkland County Administration has received an application to amend the Land Use Map of Land Use Bylaw (2017-18) to redistrict the two (2) parcels of land legally described as Lot 1, Plan 962 4168 and Lot 1, Block 2, Plan 982 0548 both within SW-16-53-26-W4 from the CR-Country Residential District to the CRE-Country Residential Estate District. The purpose of the redistricting is to allow for additional subdivision opportunities (parcel size) within the subject lands than is currently permitted under the CR-Country Residential District. The Bylaw received First Reading on January 11th, 2022.

Hearing Procedure

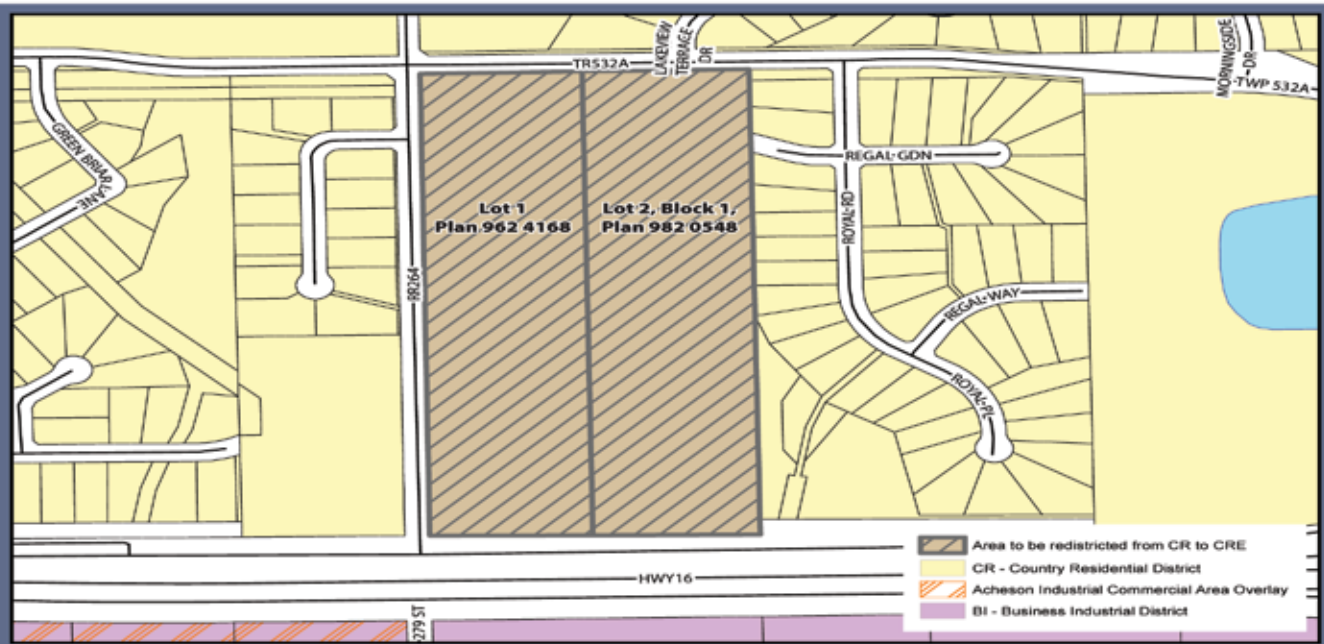
This is a formal Public Hearing and Council is prepared to hear and receive formal submissions and presentations (verbal or written) from those who wish to speak to the proposed Bylaw. Written submissions or presentations may either be submitted in advance to Planning & Development by 4:00 p.m. on January 27, 2022, or submitted at the commencement of the Public Hearing on February 8, 2022.

Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation to Council must notify Planning & Development Services in advance of the Public Hearing by 4:00 p.m., on January 27, 2022. Verbal presentations at the Public Hearing will be limited to a maximum of 10 minutes. Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation who has not made prior arrangements may be allocated a time at the commencement of the Public Hearing. Council advises that this is your last opportunity to comment on the proposed Bylaw as Council is unable to receive further submissions after the Public Hearing is closed.

They have us outnumbered.

When it comes to countries that don't have a democracy as their form of governance, they outnumber those that believe in democracy. It could be further argued that there are even less pure democratic states, if you take into context which democratic countries still have an attachment to a monarchy in one way shape or form. So, is it any wonder that there are continued pressures chipping away at our democratic values and principles? Further compounding the issue now is also the rise of socialist

ideology. It could be argued that our predominantly capitalistic free enterprise systems are what gave folks the ability for a couple of generations sitting on relative wealth and lack of strife to pontificate on how bad our system might be. civil war over it. Fighting for your freedom, overthrowing an oppressor - it all tends to have a generational effect, something that can be very long lasting, imbedded in culture. They pledge allegiance to the flag - to their country - not to a leader, or a monarch. They are one nation under God. Just about every position of authority is voted in, and the most critical positions have an expiry date, such as their Presidential terms. They sure didn't want another pseudo king or queen reigning over them. They needed to have a term limit for that kind of power, if their citizens were to be truly free.

The US constitution is old compared to the Canadian constitution. Heck, I'm older than the Canadian constitution at the ripe old age of 48. Recently I had a chance to hear from the last surviving person who helped write our constitution, and to sign off on it. Let that sink in for a bit. We as Canadians ran for a long while without a constitution, and in effect, the mother country as it were, being Great Britain, still itself does not have a succinct constitution. The UK is based on common law, bits and pieces of legislation, and precedence set over the long history of that great country, but they do not have a constitution as a standalone document like the USA, or Canada. We are very fortunate to be able to have someone who is still with us to help us clarify the intent of our constitution, and how it came to be, as well as the challenges that they had with a very headstrong "knows better than the rest" Prime Minister at the time. It feels a little like *deja vu* all over again, hearing from a former premier who had to deal with Pierre back in the day, compared to what we have been dealing with the last six years. Something that is left out of the history books, it would seem, were the struggles for the provinces to deal with an overreaching Prime Minister. When they were formalizing the rights of the citizens, hearing from a man who was there up to his elbows in crafting our constitution provides unparalleled insight into what is taking place in present day, and how our constitution isn't being respected as it should.

Unlike the US, we have not had the numerous constitutional challenges, courts ruling on it, or the constitution to be put into full effect during challenging times, real times of turmoil and strife. We as Canadians simply do not have the same experience in these waters. The US had external and internal wars, real big events that could put the country at peril or risk of falling to enemies both foreign and domestic. We, however, find ourselves in an area now, where many policies put into effect have yet to be tested in a court of law, under the real scrutiny of that document that sits above all others - the one document that the law, and the law makers are beholden too. That document was written to be permanent, not to be tampered with.

Times may change, politics may change, but the constitution was written to be unmoving and unfaltering - the thing that holds us together when things could start to come apart. So, when I hear from a person who was at the table, who helped negotiate the words that were to bind us together as a nation and ensure the rights and freedoms of all citizens of this country, I sure as heck listen to what he has to say. When that person is raising the alarm that governments are stepping out of line with their policy, and that interpretations are being made loosely on what freedoms we have, I take that seriously.

When I hear statements made that the constitution can be suspended by the current government in times of strife, war, etc. yes, I believe that as well. So does our constitution. It has four

tests however, that the event would have to meet the applicable criteria. When those same tests are made against several of the current policies that are in place to manage covid...well, they fall short in layman's terms, and massively short by a man who quite literally was an author of that highest law in our country. We had better pay attention. It was my sincere belief that given the data we had at the time, and the impending challenges that our healthcare system was about to face, and for a very short time frame, extraordinary measures were needed to deal with the covid. We are no longer in that state, and we as a country need to put that pandemic genie back in the bottle. Omicron will be the last wave we should be managing. It will infect those who have a vaccine for the initial strain of covid, or those who have not. We are very near to the end of this. As we have seen in recent days, the UK Prime Minister made the declaration in the mother parliament - it's over.

As some may be aware, I was asked before Christmas to be a guest on a podcast hosted by a gentleman named Shaun Newman out of Lloydminster. It was a great experience, and I had a chance to talk about many of the items that I've been working on over the last few years, including the Economic corridors. To many, the concept of defining and formalizing these corridors is our way of building our future in North West Canada. We also spoke about how being an MLA works, how we came to many decisions in the House to vote on certain bills, and how I became an MLA in the first place. I

also spoke about how if people are frustrated, they need to be part of the solution, to flex their democratic muscles as it were, and that begins with being a member of a political party, participating in a community, and being part of that grass roots voice. Shaun liked what he heard and told me a number of the things I said gave him hope, and apparently many of his listeners across our country and in the US felt the same way.

Based on the feedback from that initial interview, I've now been invited to be part of a panel on the 5th of February down in Kitscoty, Alberta to talk just about some of these items. Solutions for the future. I will be the only sitting MLA on the panel, but will be joined by Danielle Smith, Dr. Eric Payne, a lawyer by the name of Andre Memauri, and another Doctor yet to be announced. Tickets are currently on sale for the event and can be found at the Shaun Newman Podcast site (SNP), on my Facebook page, as well as my web page. I look forward to having fulsome discussions and sharing ideas with fellow panel members, as well as those in the audience who will be in attendance. There are several folks out there who still believe in our constitution, and really want to work on solutions that pull us together, not drive us apart. I hope that you can be part of that. Your voice does matter, so flex your democratic muscle and be part of the group that is working hard to put the genie back in the bottle and implementing solutions for the future.

GOOD NEWS STORY - DIVISION-WIDE NUMERACY FOCUS

Alberta Education defines numeracy as “the ability, confidence and willingness to engage with quantitative and spatial information to make informed decisions in all aspects of daily living”. In young children, this competency looks like the ability to recognize patterns; in older children, this includes the ability to estimate

amounts.

Numeracy consultant and mathematics instruction specialist Geri Lorway provides one-on-one, grade-level, and Professional Learning Community coaching to GYPSD teachers to support the development of strong numeracy skills in students.

With her guidance and model teaching of visual-spatial frameworks, she demonstrates

with students how - with the recall of facts alongside the ability to think, to reason, and when and how to apply thinking strategies - GYPSD teachers can develop and strengthen students’ number sense.

Geri began her work with GYPSD in the second half of the 2020-2021 school year and is working with every school in the Division.



POLICE TO PLAY KEY ROLE IN OFFERING ADDICTION TREATMENT

A first in Canada, police officers will now be able to offer immediate access to addiction treatment upon an individual’s arrest.

Albertans who are taken into police custody and who have an opioid addiction will now have the ability to immediately start evidence-based medication treatments voluntarily, such as the newly announced Sublocade injection, right in

municipal jails.

To support this innovative program, Alberta’s government is providing \$1.4 million to expand and create a low-barrier/harm reduction division of the virtual opioid dependency program (VODP). This division

will do rapid assessment and treatment initiations for those struggling with addiction and opioid use, and will also provide enhanced case management for clients after their release from custody.

Police To Play Key Role In Offering Addiction Treatment

Total provincial funding for the VODP is \$6.4 million annually.

The implementation of addiction treatment in municipal jails will begin with the Edmonton Police Service, the Calgary Police Service and at some rural locations with the RCMP. The voluntary service is available to Albertans who have been arrested for any offence starting immediately, with some treatment initiations having already taken place.

All Albertans now have access to the newly funded drug Sublocade, which lasts in a person's system for 30 days providing stabilization, reduced craving and significantly enhanced protection against overdose. This has the potential to greatly reduce the rate of opioid-related fatalities after discharge from municipal jails.

In addition, the Edmonton Police Service received \$600,000 in provincial funding to hire more social navigators to its Human-centred Engagement and Liaison Partnership (HELP) teams. The HELP teams, which pair police constables and social navigators, work closely with local community organizations and focus their efforts on assuring people struggling with mental health and addiction are able to access recovery-oriented health care and social supports so they do not become entrenched in the judicial system.

Alberta's government is helping Albertans access life-saving addiction and mental health-related prevention, intervention, treatment and recovery resources. A \$140-million investment over four years is supporting the addition of more than 8,000 new publicly funded treatment spaces; the elimination of daily user fees

for publicly funded residential addiction treatment; a new patient matching tool, Recovery Access Alberta; and services to reduce harm, such as the Digital Overdose Prevention System (DORS) app, the introduction of a nasal naloxone pilot, expansion of opioid agonist therapy and fully covering

the cost of the injectable opioid treatment drug Sublocade.

As part of a comprehensive recovery-oriented system of care, the health system and justice system are coordinating, providing up to \$20 million over four years to expand drug treatment courts to help stop people stuck in the cy-

cle of addiction-related crime from reoffending. This expansion includes doubling the total combined capacity of the Edmonton and Calgary courts and expanding the courts across Alberta.

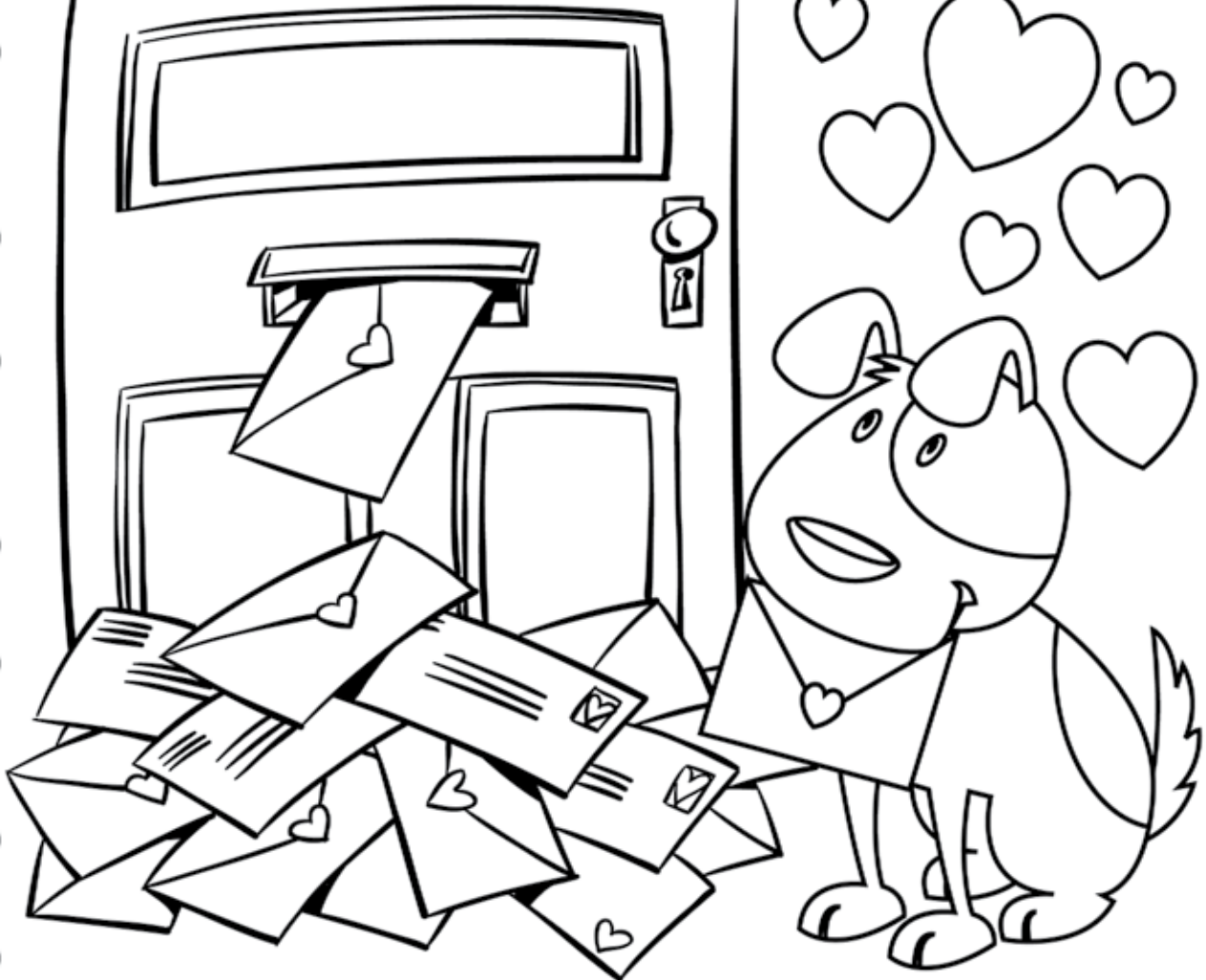
