# CANADA EMERGENCY BUSINESS ACCOUNT LOAN FORGIVENESS REPAYMENT DEADLINE EXTENDED

Gerald Soroka Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise that the – Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) Loan Forgiveness Repayment Deadline has been extended. The repayment deadline for CEBA loans to qualify

for partial loan forgiveness is being extended from December 31, 2022, to December 31, 2023, for all eligible borrowers in good standing.

This extension will support short-term economic recovery and offer greater repayment flexibility to small businesses and not-for-profit organizations, many of which are facing

continued challenges due to the pandemic. Repayment on or before the new deadline of December 31, 2023, will result in loan forgiveness of up to a third of the value of the loans (meaning up to \$20,000).

Outstanding loans would subsequently convert to two-year term loans with interest of 5 per cent per an-

num commencing on January 1, 2024, with the loans fully due by December 31, 2025.

The repayment deadline to qualify for partial forgiveness for CEBA-equivalent lending through the Regional Relief and Recovery Fund is also extended to December 31, 2023.

# COMMUNITY REPORTING IS NOW AVAILABLE AT LEDUC RESIDENTS' FINGERTIPS

The SeeClickFix app allows residents to easily submit and track city maintenance concerns.

Reporting community concerns is now just a click away for Leduc residents with the City's launch of a partnership with the SeeClickFix app.

The app allows residents to

quickly and easily submit a report directly to Public Services staff when they see a problem in the community such as:

- potholes,
- broken playground equipment,
- vandalism, or
- downed or damaged traffic signals.

When an issue is reported through the app, residents can

opt to also submit a photo of the problem and can choose to be notified of progress as City staff respond to and fix the issue. All reports that are submitted are directed straight to Public Services staff for an efficient and expedited follow-up.

The app is available on Apple and Android devices through a free download. A digital form to submit concerns to Public

Services is also available on the City's 'Report It' page, and residents are still encouraged to use this page to submit issues other than city maintenance concerns (e.g. illegally parked vehicles, Community Standards Bylaw complaints, missed garbage pickup).

# LEDUC RCMP CHARGE MALE FOR THEFT OF TRUCK

On Jan. 19, 2022 at approximately 3:56 a.m., Leduc RCMP responded to a report of a theft of vehicle in progress in the area of 49 Street in Calmar.

Leduc RCMP attended the area and observed a truck with a broken rear window and an unknown suspect inside attempting to steal the vehicle. During the arrest, the suspect resisted resulting in the deployment of a Conducted Energy Weapon to gain compliance of the male suspect.

Emergency Medical Services attended the scene

to assess the suspect who was released into police custody. Two officers required treatment for their injuries at a medical facility. "This is a clear example of the extent that criminals will undergo to avoid being arrested" says Inspector Jeff McBeth, Officer in Charge of the Leduc RCMP. "Our members will not be deterred from doing their duties in keeping Albertans Safe. And I am grateful they both will recover from their injuries."

As officer's continued their investigation, they located two additional suspects in another truck.

While approaching the suspects, they fled the area in the grey truck with a broken rear window and in the process struck three parked police cars causing extensive damages. No officers were injured as a result.

Morgan Bud Hansen (27) from Winfield, Alta. has been charged with the following:

- Assault police officer (x2)
- Resist arrest
- Mischief over \$5,000
- Theft of truck
- Fail to comply with condition of release (x4)
- Possession of

weapon for dangerous purpose

Hansen was also arrested on six outstanding warrants on unrelated matters out of Camrose, Alta., Winfield, Alta. and Drayton Valley, Alta.

Following a judicial hearing, Hansen was released to appear in Leduc Provincial court on Jan. 26, 2022.

Leduc RCMP continues the search for the two suspects. The vehicle they fled in has been located and seized for further investigation.

# ALBERTA'S ECONOMY IS HEATING UP, EVEN AS THE TEMPERATURES GROW COLD.

Despite the chilly season, our caucus has been hard at work. We continue to prioritize Alberta's Recovery Plan, which is our action-focused plan to get Albertans back to work and usher in a new era of prosperity. Last year, we added hundreds of thousands of new jobs to our economy, and the numbers indicate high levels of growth across all sectors. Things are looking up for everyone, including our dynamic agriculture sector.

Albertans rely on the hard work of our farmers and livestock producers. Unfortunately, last year, Alberta experienced severe drought conditions across the province. Our government worked with Alberta's agriculture producers to ensure their needs were being met

through these challenging circumstances. Now, we're seeing the positive results of these efforts.

On November 24, Statistics Canada released its third quarter (January to September 2021) farm cash receipts and finalized 2020 farm income estimates. I'm proud to report that for the first three quarters of 2021, farm cash receipts increased on a year-over-year basis to a new record and ranked first among all Canadian provinces.

To be specific, Alberta's total third quarter farm cash receipts increased 15.8 per cent from the same period in 2020, to a record \$13.3 billion. But not only did we rank first in total farm cash receipts – we also ranked first in livestock market receipts, cattle and calf receipts and program payments.

Alberta's Recovery Plan is focused on growing our agriculture sector and supporting Alberta's farmers and farm families. Our United Conservative government greatly values the role of farmers and agriculture producers across our province, and we will always be there to support them.

Our government recently announced a major investment of \$117 million to improve irrigation infrastructure across 10 Alberta irrigation districts. I am also pleased to announce that agriculture producers now have another opportunity to apply for financial aid. Our next phase of support for Alberta livestock producers has now opened. Now, livestock producers and beekeepers can apply for phase two of the 2021 Canada-Alberta Livestock Feed Assistance AgriRecov-

ery initiative. Through this program, we have been rapidly deploying assistance to thousands of producers to cover the costs incurred by last year's drought conditions. We have committed up to \$340 million in compensation to help members of this vital industry get back on their feet. ## NAVIGATING AN INTERFAITH WEDDING

Celebrating family histories and traditions is a major component of weddings. During a wedding, two families come together and begin to merge their unique takes on life.

### Communication

### Secular officiant

In instances when it may seem like there are too many obstacles to having faith-guided ceremonies for interfaith weddings, wedding planners may suggest some creative solutions, including working with a secular officiant. Traditions such as lighting a unity candle or blending two different

sands together to signify the blending of two faiths and families can be part of the ceremony, suggests the lifestyle company Sheerluxe.

### Give others tasks

Couples may be unfamiliar with each other's religious traditions. Sharing faith-specific wedding planning tasks can help couples and their families become more familiar with these customs.

Interfaith weddings require extra planning and finesse, but millions of couples get married in such ceremonies every year.

## LEDUC RCMP ON SCENE OF SERIOUS MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION

Traffic flow has resumed in the area of Highway 814 and Township Road 502 in Leduc County following two collisions.

Preliminary investigation revealed a pickup truck was travelling north bound

and collided head on with a south bound SUV one-mile south of the intersection of Highway 814 and Township Road 502 in Leduc County.

The driver of the pickup truck, a 75-year-old male from Beaumont, Alta. was assessed for injuries and released on scene.

The driver of the SUV, a 29-year-old female from Edmonton, Alta. was transported to local area hospital with minor injuries.

A second collision occurred between responding emergency vehicles and three occupants in the ambulance were transported

to a local area hospital as a precaution.


