# COVID-19 UPDATE FOR WHITECOURT

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

As of March 1, 2022, Albertans will be free to gather indoors and outdoors with no restrictions; large and entertainment facilities will be able to operate at full capacity; and the provincial mask mandate will be lifted except in high-risk settings. In addition:

· Any remaining school re-

quirements will be removed (for example: Kindergarten to grade 6 cohorting).

- Youth screening activities for entertainment and sport activities will be removed.
- Mandatory work-fromhome requirements will be lifted.

As announced by the Government of Alberta on February 26, limited measures will remain in effect to pro-

tect continuing care and acute care settings, and to offer additional safeguards.

• The Provincial mask mandate is still in place for high-risk settings, including on public transit, at Alberta Health Services operated and contracted facilities, and all continuing care settings.

# PARKLAND RCMP LAUNCHES NEW VIDEO CAMERA REGISTRY

Submitted by Parkland RCMP

The Parkland RCMP are excited to announce a new voluntary surveillance camera registry program, called Parkland CAPTURE (Community Assisted Policing Through the Use of Recorded Evidence). This program will cover communities within the Parkland RCMP detachment area in Parkland County and Lac Ste Anne County.

Residents and businesses who have video surveillance, and are willing to share video camera footage when requested, can sign up. This initiative won't replace officers from knocking on doors, but it will help officers track down video evidence in an ongoing criminal investigation in the area.

The program aims to reduce the time an officer needs to search for and gather video evidence when conducting an investigation. The Parkland CAPTURE program allows a person or business to upload a portion of the video requested. This allows the officer to evaluate the video footage before deciding to ask for a copy.

To get started, visit the website at www.parklandcapture. ca and create an account. From there you can enter your contact information and video cameras on the secure site. Your information is not available for anyone to see. If an officer needs to contact you, they will do so by the information provided.

Things to know about the program:

•This is completely voluntary and consent can be withdrawn at any time

•You can share your video footage through the website for an officer to view before

they decide if the video will help in their investigation

•An officer can provide you with a USB thumb drive to copy the video onto

•An officer can not download the video, they can only view it •Registering a camera and contact information allows the RCMP to see a list of security cameras so they can contact the owners during an investigation

This strategy is another way the Parkland RCMP are working with our communities to help solve crime faster, together. By providing video footage to police during an investigation, communities increase the chance of a successful prosecution.



# TIRE MAINTENANCE A KEY COMPONENT OF SPRING CHECK-UP

When warm weather arrives, many people enjoy a collective sigh of relief. Just as people welcome the end of the cold, snow and ice, cars and trucks also can benefit from more moderate temperatures.

Salt, grime and pot holes can take a toll on tires over the course of a typical winter. Drivers will not get far this spring and summer without tires in good repair, which is why tire maintenance should be part of any seasonal repair checklist.

Inflation levels

Now is the time to use a tire pressure gauge to see if tires are at the ideal inflation lev-

els. Many tires indicate the recommended PSI (pounds per square inch) on their sidewalls. Cold temperatures may cause tires to deflate a little. Esurance states that winter weather can cause tire pressure reduction at about one PSI for every 10 degrees the temperature drops. Driving on improperly inflated tires can be dangerous, potentially affecting handling and braking distances.

Check tires when they are cold for the most accurate reading. Properly inflated tires also will improve fuel economy, so drivers may even save a little money by inflating their tires.

Tire rotation/realignment

Examine the tires for tread wear. Any uneven or abnormal tread wear could indicate that the tires need to be rotated and the wheels realigned at the very least. Take the vehicle to a qualified mechanic to get their opinion on how to remedy the situation. Mechanics may recommend rotating tires every 6,000 to 8,000 miles, or about every six months for the average driver.

Wheel realignment may be necessary after a season of driving over potholes and other irregularities in the road. Misaligned wheels can cause handling problems,

like the car 'pulling' to one side.

Tire replacement

Drivers may discover extreme tread wear, bulges or even cracks in the sidewall during a tire inspection. These signs indicate that it's time to replace the tires. Failing to replace old, worn down tires can increase the risk of automobile accidents.

Thorough cleaning

Once tires are inspected and possibly serviced or replaced, treat the car or truck to a washing and thorough detailing. This will help tires shine and get the vehicle road-ready for spring trips.




