Only grains subject to variety registration will require a declaration. These declarations provide a means to assure the dependability



The Community Facility Enhancement Program provides matching funding to help non-profits leverage other


sources of funding to upgrade, redevelop, acquire or build public-use facilities.

The program's small grant stream provides funding to projects that support thriving communities and economic recovery. The grants support the vital work of non-profits with up to \$125,000 for their public-use facilities, including community halls, parks and

playgrounds, natural areas, campsites, sports fields or outdoor pools and rinks.

Qualifying projects for Community Facility Enhancement Program grants demonstrate positive community impact, economic benefits, community need, project readiness and organizational sustainability.







# ECONOMIC UPDATE: MINISTER SCHWEITZER

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Minister of Jobs, Economy and Innovation Doug Schweitzer issued the following statement on Alberta's economy:

"The first three months of 2022 have shown that Alberta's economy is not only recovering, it is growing. Key economic indicators over the first three months of 2022 show that the province continues on a path to growth.

"There is always a strong focus on jobs, because those are what are closest to Albertans. We cannot talk about economic recovery until it is reaching the kitchen tables of Albertans, and that is what we're now experiencing. Alberta has not just recovered all of the jobs that were lost during the pandemic, but we have gained jobs. Despite a pandemic and energy price crash, Alberta's unemployment rate is the lowest it has been since December 2018 and I am confident that the coming months will see a continued drop in unemployment.

"This is thanks to the increased private sector investment our province is seeing. On a per capita basis, Alberta leads all provinces with private sector capital expenditures. Companies are choosing to grow and expand in

our province. In the first three months of 2022, we've seen companies like Walmart, De Havilland, Hibiki-Seiki, PACE, Neo Financial, EY, Binance, HCL Technologies, Brane and Unity grow into Alberta and create jobs. In the first three months of this year, Alberta added 22,400 jobs and employment is 4.3 per cent higher than last March.

"The jobs we are seeing created in our province across sectors also show that Alberta continues to lead the country in good-paying jobs. More than 13,000 businesses have incorporated over the past three months, an increase of 4.8 per cent

compared with the same period last year. Alberta's average weekly earnings increased by 2.0 per cent in January 2022 compared with January 2021, to \$1,254. Nationally, average weekly earnings were \$1,162.

"New jobs also demonstrate the diversification of our economy. Companies growing into Alberta – in addition to local businesses – are coming in every sector from logistics to aerospace to renewable energy, finance and technology. Diversification is not just a buzzword, it is happening.

"Alberta's reputation in the technology and innovation sector continues to grow. We have incredible talent here and, when paired with Albertans' entrepreneurial it, success is born. In the first quarter alone, Alberta-based startups including Wyvern, PainWorth, Syantra, Avanti, Summit Nanotech, Drink Partake, Virtual Gurus, Validere, Reach, Helcim, Athennian and Arcus Power

announced successful financing rounds. In addition, new Alberta-based startups including Entos Pharmaceuticals, Intelliwave Technologies, Stellaralgo, Interface Fluidics, and Tetra Trust announced new partnerships. The real strength of Alberta's tech sector is in its early-stage deals, which bodes well for the future. All this momentum is helping to make Calgary the top city for tech talent growth in North America, with Edmonton not far behind.

"Our manufacturing sector is seeing growth across sectors. Alberta is one of the top provinces for manufacturing sales growth, with sales totalling \$16.1 billion in the first two months of the year - up 30.2 per cent from this time last year. Energy products and fabricated metal product sales grew by 63.7 per cent and 44.3 per cent respectively. Over the same period, Alberta's wholesale trade increased 23.4 per cent from last year, with growth in every product category.

"Alberta is also leading the country in growth in merchandise exports. Alberta exported more than \$28.6 billion in goods during the first two months of this year, up 54.4 per cent from last year. This was led by growth in energy products, which was up by 72.8 per cent year to date.

"Our work to create a business-friendly envi-

ronment by lowering taxes on job creators and reducing red tape is helping to restore business and investor confidence and attract significant job-creating investment to the province.

"In turn, this is attracting more people to move to Alberta. Edmonton and Calgary are the two most affordable cities in the country, according to a recent report. Globally, that puts Edmonton at No. 4 and Calgary at No. 10 for affordable cities. The most recent net migration numbers, released last month, show positive growth. Alberta's housing markets are booming and overall building permits are up 7.7 per cent, comparing the first two months of this year with January and February 2021.

"The province's economy is expected to fully recover to 2014 levels this year, expanding by 5.4 per cent, and be among the nation's growth leaders. I'm confident that Alberta's future is bright and we're just at the beginning of what will be Alberta's decade."





Beetle Block Verbenone is a synthetically produced antiaggregating pheromone that works by repelling newly arriving beetles that gives homeowners an option to combat Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB).

Sales start May 2, 2022 until supplies are gone. \$10 a piece OR \$90 for a 10 pack.

Typically, only one pauch is needed for singular lane standing trees, If you have a stand of multiple trees, you can place pouches on any high object (2.5-3.5meters above ground) every 10 to 15 meters throughout the stand of Pine.

...announced again. I'm hoping that folks can make the time to partake in these local events, get out and meet folks in the community, heck even head over to a community down the road and see


what they have going on. Words of Wisdom from my Grandma started playing over in my mind about just that.

# THREE SUBJECTS OF NEW CURRICULUM READY FOR CLASSROOMS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta students and teachers will benefit from three updated K-6 subjects, with supporting learning and teaching resources, in classrooms this September.

As announced in March, all K-3 students will learn new Mathematics and English Language Arts and Literature curriculums, while all K-6 students will learn from new Physical Education and Wellness curriculum starting this September. This balanced and measured approach to implementing the new K-6 curriculum is based on insight and advice from the Curriculum Implementation Advisory Group.

"These three subjects in Alberta's new K-6 curriculum are critical starting points that will set students on the best path for success. We heard what Albertans and education system partners told us and, with their insight, we updated Mathematics and English Language Arts and Literature to make sure our youngest students have the literacy and numeracy skills essential for early years learning. The Physical Education and Wellness curriculum fulfils our platform commitments of ensuring all elementary school students learn the importance of obtaining and providing consent as well as fundamental financial literacy skills." Content changes in the three final curriculums

Alberta's government has listened to all feedback from classroom piloting and engagement activities to make final updates to the kindergarten to Grade 6 English Language Arts and Literature, Mathematics and Physical Education and Wellness curriculums. The updated curriculums continue to align with top-performing jurisdictions, both within Canada and internationally, and those with knowledge-rich curriculums. Albertans can access the final curriculum and see what has changed at alberta.ca/curriculum.

"Taking part in piloting the draft curriculum has allowed us to have a voice in the process. We thank the government for listening to teachers' feedback and making related changes. I can't thank my teachers enough for all the hard work they put in and for what they have accomplished in the pandemic and during piloting." Stefanie Brown, principal, Florence MacDougall Community School

"It took eight years of advocacy for me to see this. This is a very strong math curriculum. It is clear, concise, age-appropriate and well sequenced. It is a curriculum that sees and realizes our children's fullest potential. They will have the confidence and skills to pursue their dreams and succeed not only in the STEM fields, but also in life." Dr. Nhung Tran-Davies, parent and advocate for strong math curriculum

"The revised K-6 Mathematics curriculum includes strengthened content that fosters core competencies in math. This included reinforcing basic fundamentals in a well-sequenced manner that will promote a student's understanding of math in a real-world context where calculations, measurements, statistical

analyses, problem-solving and an applied knowledge of money and finances are required. This strong foundation in math will also help support the innovation and creativity needed to thrive in an increasingly technological society. I was pleased to see the flow of the curriculum aligns with other educational jurisdictions that have strong international reputations."

English Language Arts and Literature curriculum supported by world-class research

The English Language Arts and Literature curriculum was refined using feedback from Albertans and education system partners, as well as after reviewing world-class research on literacy in young learners. Pandemic-related learning disruptions makes it more important than ever to focus on foundational reading, writing and speaking skills for early learners.

This focus was underscored through a recent pilot project conducted by University of Alberta researchers and funded by Alberta Education. The results showed that 82 per cent of the students who were struggling to read saw significant improvements after small group intervention. Resources supported by this research will also be available for curriculum implementation and the researchers have continued to work closely with Alberta Education to advise on and support curriculum development.

George Georgiou, who led this research and pilot project, was recently invited to participate in a Canadian Commission for UNESCO working group to further examine the impacts of the pandemic on the elementary and secondary school systems in Canada.

"Reading is undoubtedly the foundation of learning. The new English Language Arts and Literature curriculum is grounded in research and allows for explicit and systematic instruction in foundational skills such as phonological awareness, phonics, fluency and vocabulary. These skills set children up for success in comprehension and reading enjoyment." George Georgiou, professor, department of educational psychology, faculty of education, University of Alberta

Supporting a successful curriculum implementation.Alberta's government remains committed to helping ensure elementary teachers are prepared to teach the new curriculum this fall. In 2022-23, \$59 million is being invested in teacher professional learning and learning and teaching resources to make sure teachers and students are equipped for the updated K-6 curriculum in classrooms. This funding is part of a \$191-million investment over three years to support curriculum implementation across the province.

The government is providing teachers across the province with the following supports and resources on new.LearnAlberta.ca so they can continue preparing for the upcoming school year:




### INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT GOLF
