PARKLAND RCMP RESPOND TO HIT-AND-RUN INVOLVING MOTORCYCLE

On May 30, 2022, at approximately 6:50 a.m., Parkland RCMP received a report of a hit-and-run collision between a truck and a motorcycle on Highway 44 on the overpass at Highway 16 in Parkland Coun-

The motorcyclist suffered life-threatening injuries and has been transported to hospital. His identity will not be released. The driver of the truck fled the scene.

Traffic is blocked on Highway 44 at Highway 16 while the investigation continues. Parkland RCMP are asking drivers to find an alternate route. Traffic is expected to be affected for several hours. Traffic on Highway 16 is unaffected.

The truck is described by witnesses as a grey Dodge Ram 1500 . Parkland RCMP are asking for anyone with information to come forward to help identify the driver of the truck.

On Feb. 9, 2022, Parkland RCMP initiated an investigation into 26-year- old Chanelle Vandal-Lauman of Edmonton, after receiving information that she was trafficking methamphetamine.

...multiple instances consistent with drug trafficking. During the investigation, police were also able to identify a male who had an outstanding Canada-wide warrant for being unlawfully at large. 30-year-old Sidney Goossens of Edmonton was apprehended in cooperation with Edmonton Police Service.

On May 10, 2022, Parkland RCMP's Crime Reduction

Unit and Drug Unit conducted a search warrant on Chanelle Vandal-Lauman's residence in Edmonton. The search resulted in the successful recovery of illicit drugs believed to be methamphetamine, cocaine, and fentanyl, as well as tools used in the drug trafficking trade.

During the search police also located a loaded handgun, ammunition, firearm parts, a machete,...

...throwing knives, hard body armour, a security guard uniform, face coverings, zip ties, and break in tools.

At the time of her arrest, Chanelle Vandal-Lauman was bound by a Conditional Sentence Order stemming from a previous drug-related conviction. The order included conditions not to possess any intoxicating substances and not to possess any weapons.

Chanelle Vandal-Lauman is facing the following charges:

- Possession for the purposes of trafficking x3
- Possession of property obtained by crime
 - Unauthorized pos-

session of a firearm

- Possession of a restricted firearm with ammunition without a licence
- Careless use of a firearm
- Tampering with serial number of a firearm
- Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose
 - Unlawful posses-

sion of body armour without a valid permit

- Possession of counterfeit money
- Breach of Conditional Sentence Order

Chanelle Vandal-Lauman remains in custody. She is set to appear in court on June 1, 2022, at Stony Plain Courthouse via CCTV.

MAJOR CRIMES UNIT INVESTIGATES HOMICIDE IN PARKLAND COUNTY

On May 25, 2022, an autopsy was performed by the Edmonton Office of the Chief Medical Examiner and the manner of death has been deemed as a homicide.

Charges have yet to be

This past week, your United Conservative government wrapped up the spring sitting of the Legislature. This session saw the passage of several important pieces of legislation and many long hours of work. It also saw several new measures adopted to get Albertans back to work, diversify the economy, and make life more affordable for families. Here are some of the highlights!

We began the spring sitting

by passing the first balanced budget Alberta has seen in nearly a decade. With this, we delivered on a key commitment to inspire investor confidence, control spending, and get our province's finances back on track.

We passed the Utility Commodity Rebate Act, which provides \$150 in electricity rebates for two million households, farms, and small businesses – amounting to nearly \$300 million in relief on high electricity bills. We also cut the provincial fuel tax for gasoline, diesel, and

marked farm fuel. This has resulted in Albertans paying the lowest prices in the country for fuel.

We passed the Traffic Safety Amendment Act, which protects roadside workers by requiring all motorists travelling in the same direction to slow down to 60 kilometres per hour when vehicles with flashing lights – an important safety initiative.

And we passed the Continuing Care Act, which expands and modernizes continuing care at the same time as we provide funding for more

than 1,500 new continuing care beds in the province.

Further, we continued making strategic investments in high-demand education programs to meet labour needs through the Alberta at Work initiative, ensuring post-secondary students have more opportunities to train close to home in the programs they choose, and supplying industry with the highly skilled and talented workforce they need for the future.

And we passed a critical private members' bill from Highwood MLA RJ Sigurdson - Bill 205, the Human Organ and Tissue Donation (Mandatory Referral) Amendment Act. The passage of this bill is incredibly important as organ failure and organ donation impacts the lives of so many Albertans. Organ donation is truly the ultimate gift of life, but changes were needed to improve the process. With this bill passing, there will be several amendments to the organ and tissue donation process, including the implementation of a mandatory referral process, improving agency guidelines, and improving education and awareness surrounding the process and importance of organ and tissue donation. Bill 205 will

literally be a life saver. The 2022 highway struction season is underway with nearly \$1.4 billion being invested in 300 capital and highway improvement projects employing 12,000 Albertans. Budget 2022 invests \$789.4 million in this year's Capital Plan for roads and bridges. Several major capital projects will be completed this year, including Highway 19 twinning, west segment, Highway 15 twinning and new bridge, and the Peace River bridge deck replacement project. We are building and maintaining the important infrastructure that makes Alberta a strong and vibrant place to live, raise a family and grow a business.

As we move into the summer season, our United Conservative team will remain laser focused on the priorities that matter to you and your family. I hope you have a great summer, and I look forward to reporting more good news soon.



HELPFUL AND HARMFUL INSECTS

Although it's virtually impossible to count them, insects are the most diverse group of organisms on the planet. Nine hundred thousand different kinds of insects are known to exist. At any given time, it is estimated that there are around 10 quintillion individual insects living.

Gardeners grow frustrated when seeing their gardens infested with insects. In an effort to restore their gardens, homeowners might be tempted to eradicate any bug that moves in their yards. But gardeners would be wise to first learn which insects are hurting their gardens and which can actually help gardens in the long run. Harmful

Certain insects can be dangerous to animals and plants. The following are a handful of insects that can threaten the vitality of gardens.

Aphids: These insects suck on the juice needed to sustain plants, particularly when they congregate.

Bald-faced hornet: Hornets tend to be an aggressive species that can sting repeatedly. Should you find a nest near an entertaining space or garden, it can cause trouble.

Carpenter ants: These ants will burrow into wood causing damage. They may compromise any wooden structure in and around a home.

Locusts: Various species of locust can damage plants and crops due to their voracious appetites. Treehoppers: These small, green insects mimic the look of leaves, and their appetites can affect crops and gardens.

Red pavement ant: As they feed on all manner of human food, these ants can quickly overtake areas with their staggering numbers and deliver painful bites.

Grasshoppers: Certain grasshoppers, like the red-legged grasshopper, can decimate food crops and transfer parasites to birds when eaten as prev.

Caterpillars: Many caterpillars, the precursor to adult moths, will feed constantly on leaves, stems and other parts of plants. The tobacco hornworm moth caterpillar can damage potato and tomato plants.

Helpful

Plants depend on insects to transfer pollen as they forage, and many insects are quite beneficial to have around. While some pollinate, others are predators of other pests.

Antlion: A foe of ants, they'll help eat and control ant populations and pollinate flowers. They pose no threat to humans, either.

Big dipper firefly: These colorful insects feast on earthworms, slugs and snails during the larval stage. Fireflies add drama to evening gardens with their twinkling lights.

Garden spiders: Although some spiders can be venomous, many are quite handy to have around the garden. They'll help control pest populations that can damage plants and crops.

Dragonflies: These arial artists that zip around the yard are consuming smaller insects that would otherwise pester plants and humans.

Blue-winged wasp: This wasp attacks the larvae of Japanese beetles, helping to control beetle populations.

Bees and butterflies: Butterflies and bees are some of the best pollinators out there, and each can add whimsy to gardens.

GOLF COURSES MANAGE PESTS TO PROTECT THEIR TURF

Golf courses are valuable green spaces in many communities, and the sport is enjoyed by Canadians of all ages.

We want our favourite course to be healthy. but this requires a lot of attention. Despite best efforts, sometimes golf courses are affected by pests. These can include turf diseases like dollar spot and snow mould, which affect normal growth of grass and can cause significant turf loss, according to experts. Turf insects feed on the grass and can inflict severe damage. Weeds are also a threat, because they compete with grass for moisture and affect the playability of a course.

To control pests, golf courses practice inte-

grated pest management, using the right tool at the right time to treat an infestation. This includes pesticides, which are regulated by Health Canada to ensure they are safe and effective in controlling the pests they are designed to target. They help maintain

healthy vegetation and playing surfaces, and also offer many environmental benefits.

Golf courses are often located in urbanized areas and can be valuable green spaces that help preserve habitats for wildlife and waterfowl. Data show that healthy

turf and trees act as natural air conditioners by producing large amounts of oxygen, while removing carbon dioxide. Did you know that healthy turf grass can sequester almost 900 kilograms of carbon per hectare each year?

WARNING BUSINESSES OF BITCOIN SCAM

Submitted by Alberta RCMP

Alberta RCMP have received a number of complaints from businesses who have fallen victim to the Head Office Bitcoin scam. Over the past several months, fraudsters have been targeting businesses throughout the province in a sophisticated scam in order to receive Bitcoin currency, defrauding both employees and businesses out of thousands of dollars.

Staff would receive a call from a person claiming to be a regional or district manager. In many cases the fraudster has researched the names of staff and managers. The fraudster had detailed information about the operations of the businesses, including the names and roles of various staff persons and store policies. This familiarity with the stores convinces the employee that the fraudsters were who they claimed to be. The staff are told that an important shipment is imminent and receiving it is vital.

The staff are then advised that there has been a problem with the payment for the shipment and the only way to not delay it is an immediate payment in bitcoin.

A second caller claiming to be an employee of the shipping company then calls to confirm the shipment and provide a tracking number and advises that payment is required before delivery.

In some of the incidents, employees took money from the store to the bitcoin ATM. In the others incident, the employee took both funds from the store and from their own personal account to the bitcoin ATM to make the payment.

The first caller would stay on the line with each employee until they completed the bitcoin transaction. It was only after completing the transaction that the employee realized they had fallen victim to professional fraudsters.

Alberta RCMP are encouraging businesses to protect themselves by providing in-house fraud awareness training and sharing warnings like this alert with their staff. Institute clear, two-step approval processes, using a code word or id number for financial transactions, and empower your employees to say "no" to potential frauds.

Hon. Karina Gould (Minister of Families, Children


and Social Development, Lib.):

Madam Speaker, as I said last week, that is correct. No Canadian should be paying extra fees if, in fact, they have submitted all the correct documents and everything is in order with their application, and if their application is not processed within the processing times.

If that is in fact the case, there is a refund process. I would be happy to follow up with the member opposite to share with him how he could share that with his constituents, but it is also available on the Government of Canada website.






