# NEW DOWNTOWN FOSTERS ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND COMMUNITY

Submitted by Stony Plain

Stony Plain's new downtown signifies a major milestone for the community and primes Stony Plain for a future of growth. The community was joined by Knowledge Keeper Phillip Campioui, government partners, and stakeholders to celebrate the grand opening of its new downtown core on May 19.

The event marked the completion of the Downtown Redevelopment project, a five-year, \$15.8 million project aimed at revitalizing the downtown area and positioning Stony Plain as a prime locale for entrepreneurial growth. Construction involved an overhaul of the downtown core, encompassing underground infrastructure replacements and upgrades, re-paving of road-

ways and sidewalks, pedestrian safety upgrades, and landscaping. The project is a significant milestone for Stony Plain and marks a key step in achieving the community's strategic vision to transition from a small town to a more self-sustaining urban municipality.

"Stony Plain is one of the fastest growing communities in the Edmonton Metropolitan Region, our population growing over 50 percent in the last 20 years," says Mayor William Choy. "The grand opening of the new downtown signifies Stony Plain's commitment to growing into a more connected and competitive centre that fosters innovation, cooperation and entrepreneurship."

The development project was supported by multiple levels of investment, including \$5.8 million from the

Government of Alberta's Municipal Sustainability Initiative and \$4.2 million from the Canada Community-Building Fund.

"The Government of Alberta is pleased to have supported the downtown redevelopment in Stony Plain with funding from the Municipal Sustainability Initiative. Also, through the use of the federal Canada Community-Building Fund, our government delivers support for projects of local significance, like this one, across Alberta. The long-term vision of this revitalization will spark local economic development that contributes to a more vibrant community and Alberta's economic recovery plan," says Ric McIver, Minister of Municipal Affairs.

"I am pleased with the Town of Stony Plain's vision for our downtown to be a vibrant community and business hub.

I commend them for their commitment to its redevelopment. More than ever, and especially as we recover from COVID-19, our communities need the stable, predictable, and long-term support provided by the Canada Community-Building Fund, which became a permanent Government of Canada funding program in 2011. I know residents of Stony Plain will benefit from this investment and redevelopment for decades to come," says Dane Lloyd, MP for Sturgeon River-Parkland.

# BOARD BRIEF

## Student Learning

Board Chair Karpluk welcomed the grandchildren of former GYPSD trustee, George Monsma, the founder of the Monsma Scholarship. Greg and Gayle shared the impact of their grandfather's value for education in how their own father, Bud Monsma, became a successful businessman. To honour their father and extend their grandfather's legacy to

support education, the Family Foundation has increased the scholarship amount to \$500 per year for one student from each of the Division's five high schools. All student awards are located on the GYPSD website under Administrative Procedure 370.

Board Chair Kapluk acknowledged June as Indigenous History Month and reminded attendees that this upcoming September 30th will be a non-instructional day

within GYPSD to honour the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Additionally, the Hinton Friendship Centre and Crescent Valley Elementary have received the Public School Boards' Association of Alberta's Award for a Special Contribution to Promoting and Advancing TRC Calls to Action.

GYPSD's Summer School program will be running out of Parkland Composite High School. And families are encouraged to check out the

BEST summer programs that will be running within the Division's five communities in July and August.

Teaching And Leadership Excellence

The Board shared their pride in the recent announcement that Grande Cache Community High School first-year teacher Aimee Allers was one of six provincial winners of this year's Edwin Parr Award.

Superintendent Lewis shared highlights from her report which included:

Principals' Annual Planning Retreat;

Planning and Professional Learning for the Central Office and Leadership Teams;

Extensive meetings across all departments to prepare for the upcoming school year.

Assistant Superintendent of Learning Services presented GYPSD's Three Year Education Plan submission to Alberta Education. The Board shared their appreciation for input from stakeholders and to the Administration team for their work on the 2022-2025 plan. Once submitted, the plan will be posted to the GYPSD website.

Board Representatives Fowler and Caputo reminded Board members of the upcoming PS-BAA and ASBA Spring General Meetings and Professional Development Events, and the Rural Caucus of Alberta School Boards' Spring Meeting taking place in Red Deer from June 2-7.

Trustees Pettitt and Bobilek of the Employee Recognition Committee are meeting with Special Projects Manager Nikki Gilks to review preparations for the Retirement Celebration taking place June 17th and 18th.

The Board received a report on repairs done to the roof of the Grande Cache Community High School following a wind storm in February.

Anne (LILSA) Water Quality Management Society, we are seeking applications from outgoing and energetic candidates seeking a rewarding summer job in the local community.

Working under the supervision of the Project Manager/Technical Advisor, the successful candidate(s) must be hardworking, punctual, comfortable in and near open waterways, exercise conscientious ecological awareness and cultural sensitivity. As part of the project team, all members must be engaging and respectful when dealing with other stakeholders, volunteers and residents/visitors both in the field and during training activities.

Some specific tasks which may be required of the successful candidate will include:

- Being on site from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. during workdays
- Operating a class 5 motor vehicle
- Operating a motorized watercraft
- Engaging with communities, including door knocking awareness campaigns
- Participation in invasive species identification and abatement training
- Participation in cultural awareness/sensitivity training
- Manual labour as required, including mechanical abatement (hand-pulling) of weeds
- Light administrative support, including recording data and records maintenance

The proposed term of this position is June 1st, 2022 through August 31st, 2021, with workdays running Tuesday through Saturday, inclusive. Compensation will be between \$16/hr and \$24/hr based on previous experience and demonstrated work ethic. The project is entering the final year of its mandate, however pending project extension or expansion there may be an opportunity for successful candidates to return next season as well. Pending availability and funding there may be an opportunity to begin the 2022 season earlier than, or extend the season longer than, the stated term above.

To maintain the current grade configurations at the Hinton elementary schools

Board Chair Karpluk (Jasper) and Superintendent Lewis will be hosting an information meeting on June 9th at the Jasper Junior/Senior High School

for families living at the Jasper Park Lodge to discuss the Parent-Provided Agreement contract.

Board Chair Karpluk encouraged families to take advantage of supports for children and youth experiencing mental health challenges made available through Alberta Health Services and The Mental Health Foundation.

## UPDATED FURTHER VEHICLE INFORMATION TO HIT-AND-RUN INVOLVING MOTORCYCLE

Parkland RCMP have laid charges in the investigation into a hit-and-run collision between a motorcycle and a truck on May 30, 2022.

The driver of the truck was identified and has turned himself in to the Parkland RCMP. 21-year-old Cameron Leslie Jones of Spruce Grove has been charged with the following:

- Dangerous operation of a vehicle causing bodily harm

- Failing to remain at a collision where a person was injured and required assistance

Cameron Leslie Jones was held for a judicial interim release hearing and was released by the presiding Justice. He is next set to appear in court in Stony Plain on June 29, 2022.

The victim remains in hospital in serious condition.

# THE SILLY SEASON

I was told several times by folks who have been in politics for longer than I have that during election periods it's often called "The Silly Season". 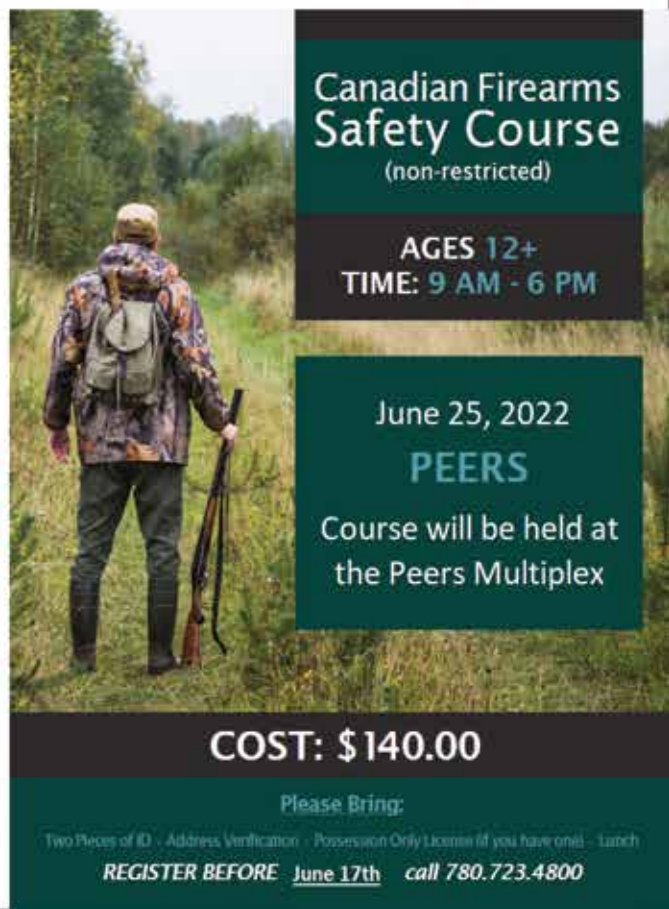

...for 2022-23 and 2023-24 to support pilot projects focused on improving delivery of mental health supports and services for students, and tools, training and resources for the school community. Understanding and promoting positive mental health in schools is a shared responsibility of parents, educators and community partners.

"A comprehensive and coordinated approach is the best way to promote positive mental health. Current research clearly identifies

the importance of mental health to learning, as well as to students' social and emotional development. Students and staff who experience positive mental health are resilient and better able to learn, achieve success and build healthy relationships."

Specialized assessments Alberta's government is also investing up to \$10 million per year for 2022-23 and 2023-24 to support

increased access to specialized assessments. This includes funding to ensure children and students, who may not have had access to specialized assessments during the pandemic, can be assessed by qualified professionals including speech language pathologists, physical therapists, occupational therapists or psychologists.

"Alberta School Boards Association appreciates government's announcement of supports to address challenges due to the pandemic, including mental health and the long-term

effects of learning loss. These assessments are critical for student success and targeted supports will assist school boards as they continue to make informed decisions based on the needs of their local school communities."

Learning loss supports Assessing students in the critical early years of their education is key for ensuring long-term learning success and ensuring early interventions are in place to prevent future learning challenges. Up to \$10 million for the 2022-23 school year, as a one-time extension of the 2021-22 funding, will support additional interventions for students in grades 2-4 to continue getting back on track.

School authorities must have participated in the 2021-22 learning loss funding program and filed their required year-end report with Alberta Education by June 15 to qualify for the extension funding. They will be required to administer literacy and numeracy screening assessments selected from the approved list.
