




ELECTRICITY REBATES TO START ARRIVING ON JULY BILLS

Beginning in July, almost two million Albertans will

Submitted by Government receive rebates on their electricity bills to help them manage high electricity costs.

> More than 1.9 million



homes, farms and small businesses will receive monthly credits of \$50 on their July, August and September electricity bills, for a total of \$150 in rebates.

The Alberta government's \$300-million rebate program will help alleviate some of the high utility costs that many families and businesses have faced during recent months.

"We are providing targeted support to help hard-working Albertans deal with the rising cost of living. These rebates, combined with the fuel tax exemption and upcoming natural gas rebate, will help the large majority

of Alberta households pay their bills while we make the long-term changes needed to make energy more affordable in the years ahead."

Electricity rebate

Alberta's government has worked closely with electricity distributors retailers to develop and implement the electricity rebate.

Albertans currently connected to the system that have consumed electricity within the past calendar year, up to a maximum of 250 megawatt hours per year, are automatically eligible for the rebates. Support will reach more than 1.9 million Albertans, which means that most farms, residences and small businesses will receive the rebates.

Eligible Albertans can expect to see an automatic \$50 rebate on their bills. It is being applied directly to eligible utility bills, meaning no application or other action is needed to start receiving the rebate in July.

Unlike the previous government's electricity rate cap, the \$50 rebates will apply to the entire bill, not just the energy portion.

In addition, the \$50 rebates will be on all eligible bills – protecting consumers on the variable regulated rate option as well as those on competitive contracts.

Consumers wishing to protect themselves from price volatility may enter into a competitive fixed-rate contract and still be eligible for the \$50 rebates. Albertans can visit the Utility Consumer Advocate to see what products are available in their area.

The rebate will be listed on each bill as a line item titled "GOA Utility Commodity Rebate," and \$50 rebates will follow in August and

September, for a total of \$150. Exact timing will vary depending on the billing cycle of one's utility provider.

Consumers who believe they meet the eligibility criteria but have not received the rebates by the end of July should contact the Utility Consumer Advocate.

Upcoming natural gas rebate

Alberta's government is

implementing two programs to ensure utilities remain affordable while providing stability for millions of Albertans through the next nine months.

Along with the electricity rebate, a natural gas rebate will provide cost certainty and protect eligible Alberta customers from European-style price spikes starting in October. More details on the natural gas rebate will be announced soon.

With the electricity rebate reaching bills in July, August and September, and the natural gas rebate starting in October, Alberta's government will be providing support on utility bills for millions of Albertans until March 31, 2023 if prices remain high.

EXTENDING FUEL TAX RELIEF FOR ALBERTANS

Albertans will continue to save the 13-cent provincial fuel tax on every litre of gasoline or diesel they purchase for at least another three months.

"We're helping Albertans save money through the fuel tax relief program at a time of need. While fuel prices have continued to increase nationwide, Albertans still pay considerably less than their provincial neighbours. We're pleased to extend this important relief measure until the end of September."

With the fuel tax relief program in place, Albertans save money with every fill-up. With the corresponding reduction in GST, this amounts to total savings of about \$6.80 per tank for a compact car (50 litres), \$7.21 for a small SUV (53 litres), \$12.65 for a mid-size SUV (93 litres), \$18.50 for a large pick-up truck (136 litres) and \$185.50 for a semi-trailer (1,364 litres).

The government committed to evaluating the program quarterly and reinstating it in stages only if the average price of West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude oil fell below \$90

per barrel. For the four-week period ending June 15, WTI averaged \$115.88 per barrel.

The government will re-evaluate the program in September.

"Countless Albertans have told us how much the program has helped them during these challenging economic times. With the program's extension, Alberta's government is continuing to support Albertans and their ability to afford everyday goods."

Alberta's government continues to call on Ot-

tawa to consider similar consumer relief measures. If the Government of Canada paused the collection of both the federal carbon tax and the federal fuel tax while the price of WTI oil remained above \$90 per barrel, drivers would save almost \$22 more on every 100 litres of gasoline.







Not the twangy, old "my dog ran away, I'm wallowing in self-pity, and I stubbed my toe" kind of song, but the other kind.

The kind of song where yes, things were good, then there was trouble, and that was tough. The kind of song where the friend, the neighbor, or even the good Lord above opened the clouds a little, to give us a sign, that if we hung in there, the struggle would be worth it. The kind of song where it talks about the love lost, but the lasting one that instead was found. The one where you don't envy the material things but appreciate the morals and the real things that matter at the end of the day. And yes, a few songs with those unanswered prayers.

The kind where you know the folks that work hard, but still make time to have fun. The kind where you have friends in low places, and, on occasion when it's called for, you end up fighting down in the mud, the blood, and the beer. The kind where afterwards, you could appreciate the person you did have the duster with, coming away with a dif-

ferent point of view, and appreciation for the one you fought with; at times becoming the best of friends.

The kind of song where you remember your past: the good, the bad, and yes, the ugly. You don't shy away from what went wrong, so you can make sure that next time you get it right. The song where good conquers over evil, even if it wasn't easy. When sometimes the most unlikely characters step forward from our midst and become the people that we rally behind. The song where we do the right things because it's the right thing to do.

Although I had to say goodbye to a great friend and mentor last weekend, I did get a chance to catch up with a great many more that came together for that celebration of life. I was asked by my friend's wife to say a few words, and it was not as an MLA, but just plain old me. I had the chance to talk about how this gent and I became friends on a job site above the tree line in the middle of nowhere on a project site constructing what would become Canada's first Diamond Mine. I shared stories about him that were unique to my interactions, but at the same time had a common theme with others who knew him as well. DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN BE PAR FOR THE COURSE

A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries:

Side bending stretch


- 1. Stand with feet shoulder-width apart.
- 2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.
- 3. Slowly bend to one side, without rotating, until you feel a stretch in the side of your back.
- 4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

Shoulder stretch

- 1. Hold the shaft of a golf club vertically behind your back.
- 2. Gently pull the club up with your top hand until you feel a slight stretch in the shoulder of your lower arm. Hold for 15 seconds.
- 3. Gently pull the club down with your bottom

hand until you feel a stretch in the top shoulder and arm.

- 4. Hold for 15 seconds.
- 5. Reverse hand positions and repeat.

MLA SMITH ARTICLE

Alberta's farmers and ranchers produce some of the highest quality food products in the world. So why is Ottawa now trying to put warning labels on the ground meat Canadians buy at the grocery store, including beef and pork from Alberta?

This is a question a lot of Canadians are asking right now. Ground beef and pork, especially from Alberta, is healthy and affordable for families across Canada and the world. Labelling ground meat not only sends a negative message about the quality of our food, but it hurts our industry and our overall economy at a very precarious time.

This attack on ground meat is groundless. Ottawa did not consult with the provinces and it has provided no compelling evidence for its decision, which unfairly harms Alberta's world-class producers. As you may know, Alberta livestock producer associations have requested an exemption from the proposed federal labelling requirements for ground meat, like exemptions being offered for other nutritious, single-ingredient foods such as milk, eggs, vegetables, and other meats. Our Alberta government supports this exemption.

"The federal government made this decision without consulting the provinces even though we have equivalent expertise in food science and nutrition," said Alberta Health Minister Jason Copping.

The Alberta government is currently working closely with the Alberta Beef Producers, the Alberta Cattle Feeders Association, and Alberta Pork to support their industries. We have also expressed our concerns to our federal counterparts in Ottawa.

This decision is especially troubling because it comes at a time when food prices are soaring due to inflation and other factors. Ground beef and pork are whole foods, rich in nutrients and still relatively affordable. At a time when the Alberta government is working tirelessly to make life more affordable for families, the Trudeau-NDP alliance in Ottawa is working to making life more expensive and difficult.

"While we can all support the federal Healthy Eating Strategy in principle, Ottawa's scientifically baseless labelling proposal for ground meat will unfairly impact families struggling with the high cost of living and add an extra burden to producers struggling to get back on their feet," said Alberta Agriculture Minister Nate Horner.

This decision should be reversed, full stop, and the Alberta government will be fighting for that. Every Canadian should take pride in the fact that Alberta's livestock producers drive economic growth by feeding the world with high-quality meat. Imposing these warning labels sends a negative message to customers and makes our producers less competitive in the global economy.

The entire Alberta government is proud of and stands with Alberta's livestock producers. We will continue fighting this unfair attack on our producers and our world-class Canadian agriculture products. I look forward to providing you with an update on this soon.
