## LOCAL ELECTIONS, COUNCILLOR ACCOUNTABILITY: HAVE YOUR SAY

Submitted by Government of Alberta

A new online survey is asking Albertans about how to improve election processes and accountability for locally elected officials.

Input from the survey, open until July 22, will help inform potential changes to the Municipal Government Act (MGA) and the Local

Authorities Election Act (LAEA).

Alberta Municipal Affairs is seeking feedback from Albertans related to candidate eligibility, codes of conduct for elected officials, privacy of voter information and third-party advertising rules. Any changes would apply to Alberta municipalities, school divisions and Metis Settlements.

"As is always the case, we continually work to improve our local elections so that Albertans can feel confident when entering a polling station. I encourage all eligible Albertans to complete this short survey and have their say on how we can strengthen local democracy in Alberta."



## GOLF COURSES MANAGE PESTS TO PROTECT THEIR TURF

Golf courses are valuable green spaces in many communities, and the sport is enjoyed by Canadians of all ages.

We want our favourite course to be healthy, but this requires a lot of attention. Despite best efforts, sometimes golf courses are affected by pests. These can include turf diseases like dollar spot and snow mould, affect which normal growth of grass and can cause significant turf loss, according to experts. Turf insects feed on the grass and can inflict severe damage. Weeds are also a threat, because they compete with grass for moisture and affect the playability of a course.

To control pests, golf courses practice inte-

grated pest management, using the right tool at the right time to treat an infestation. This includes pesticides, which are regulated by Health Canada to ensure they are safe and effective in controlling the pests they are designed to target. They help maintain

healthy vegetation and playing surfaces, and also offer many environmental benefits.

Golf courses are often located in urbanized areas and can be valuable green spaces that help preserve habitats for wildlife and waterfowl. Data show that healthy

turf and trees act as natural air conditioners by producing large amounts of oxygen, while removing carbon dioxide. Did you know that healthy turf grass can sequester almost 900 kilograms of carbon per hectare each year?

This healing and education memorial will be open to anyone visiting the Alberta legislature grounds."
