REEVE'S REPORT ON THE UPCOMING PAPAL VISIT **AND PILGRIMAGE**

The Lac Ste Anne Pilgrimage is a one-of-a-kind gathering that has drawn hundreds of thousands of visitors to our sacred lake each summer for the past 123 years.

With the presence of His Holiness Pope Francis, attendance at this year's event is certain to be on an entirely different scale. While this is a truly historic occurrence — both for the devout and the County at large — it does require focused and coordinated effort from multiple stakeholders. Here are some highlights on how things are taking shape.

STAKEHOLDERS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

To be clear: Council and Administration had no prior knowledge of the papal visit, nor the authority to say no to its occurrence. Further, an event of this magnitude takes about two years to properly plan (rather than the two months we were given). Regardless, the County is committed to making this event as safe and memorable as possible while minimizing any negative impacts on our communities.

To help achieve these outcomes, the County is part of a larger group that includes:

- Alberta Transportation
- Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation
- Alberta Health Services and EMS
 Catholic Archdiocese of Edmonton
 Metis Association of Alberta
 - Government of Alberta
 - Lac Ste. Anne Pilgrimage
- Provincial Office of the Papal Visit
- Royal Canadian Mounted Police

In addition to working closely with these organizations, the County has reached out to adjacent municipalities for their support with policing, signage, emergency services and logistics. I am grateful for their camaraderie and willingness to help.

PILGRIMAGE AND PAPAL VISIT SCHEDULE

The Lac Ste. Anne Pilgrimage is scheduled to place July 26-29. Pope Francis has been confirmed to attend the Lac Ste. Anne Pilgrimage for one hour on July 26 after hosting an open-air mass at Edmonton's Commonwealth Stadium that same day.

Further updates on the Pope's pilgrimage visit, free tickets to attend the stadium event, volunteer opportunities and other details can be found at papalvisit.ca.

LAC STE. ANNE COUNTY

ROUTES, TRAFFIC AND ROAD CLOSURES

The County is primarily taking direction from Alberta Transportation and the RCMP regarding approved routes for traffic, park-and-rides to the pilgrimage site, road closures and other logistical details.

Residents should factor in considerable traffic congestion on provincial highways and County roadways before, during and after the pilgrimage. It goes without saying that pedestrian traffic will be unusually high at the pilgrimage site and in surrounding communities. Throughout this timeframe the County will prioritize public safety, and will work to mitigate any harm to property or our environment.

For anyone planning to circumvent traffic via back roads or summer villages: **this will not happen.** There will be no access to the pilgrimage grounds via Val Quentin, Sunset Point, Alberta Beach or any other non-approved route. These roadways will be reserved for local traffic only.

MAPS, SCHEDULES AND UPDATES

The County has created a dedicated information page at <u>LSAC.ca/pilgrimage</u>. Here you'll find approved routes, road closures, boat launch closures, bus shuttle schedules and other important event details. Most of this information will be County-generated, but we will also share any relevant information provided by other stakeholders.

To find out what's taking place in other communities, I encourage you to contact the administration offices of Alberta Beach, Sunset Point, West Cove and Val Quentin — or visit their respective websites.

FINAL THOUGHTS

Lac Ste. Anne County and its neighbouring municipalities recognize the importance of reconciliation. The wisdom, tradition and pride of Indigenous communities are woven into the social fabric of our communities, adding to the rich history of the Lac Ste. Anne region. Because of these influences, we are keenly aware of the importance of this visit. We understand what it means to our communities going forward, and the legacy it will leave behind.

Speaking on behalf of Lac Ste. Anne County Council and Administration as well as neighbouring municipal leaders, I sincerely thank local families and business owners in advance for their patience and understanding during this important — yet impactful — historic spiritual gathering. I also want to commend all staff involved for going above and beyond to provide for the safety and security of visitors and community members alike.

WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt

Whitecourt Town Council has adopted the 2022 Strategic Plan. The Plan provides Council and staff with a common focus to be pursued over its term to achieve the municipality's vision. The Town will use the Strategic Plan to define its priorities, activities, short and long-term plans; and, to prioritize budget and resource allocations. A copy of the 2022 Strategic Plan Report is available for viewing at www.whitecourt.ca/your-municipal-

The 2022 20-Year Capital and Major Maintenance Plan has been adopted. The Plan, which includes 130 projects, provides a vision for the long-term development of Whitecourt's infrastructure; land development; parks and trails; and building and recreational/cultural facilities to meet the needs of our

growing community. The Plan incorporates projects and timelines identified through engineering studies, planning sessions, workshops, budget deliberations, and public engagement activities. The Plan is available to view at www.whitecourt.ca/your-municipality.

The Whitecourt Economic Development Committee provided a semi-annual update on its activities and current projects at the June 27 Regular Meeting of Council. Activities have been focused on encouraging investment attraction across key sectors and implementing business retention and expansion strategies in support of local businesses.

The annual review of Off-Site Levies is complete and, based on the study, rates will be changing as of January 1, 2023.

Off-Site Levies are a cost recovery tool that help pay for infrastructure projects

that allow the community to grow, including roads, and water and sewage treatment.

The Collision Report is prepared annually, and the 2021 report shows an overall increase in collisions from the previous year; however, the number of collisions is still under the 5-year average. The report identifies areas of concern so that measures can be undertaken to assist with decreasing collisions and injuries on local roadways. A copy of the report will be provided to the Whitecourt Protective

Services Committee and Alberta Transportation for review.

Whitecourt is partnering with other regional municipalities to apply for funding to develop an electric vehicle charging network in northwest Alberta.

Whitecourt has approved requests from the Whitecourt Golf & Country Club and Whitecourt Curling Club to join the Municipalities Alberta Energy Program. By joining through Whitecourt's energy agreement, the Clubs will benefit from the wholesale and aggregate pricing that Whitecourt receives.

Updates have been made to the Fees, Rates and Charges Bylaw.

- Water meter costs have been amended to align with the Town's third party billing policy.
- Concrete disposal fees have been updated to reflect current crushing and disposal costs.

WHITECOURT RECEIVES \$100,000 TO SUPPORT CLIMATE RESILIENCY PROJECT

Whitecourt has received a \$100,000 grant for the purchase of a sprinkler trailer and the development of the FireSmart Homeowner Incentive Program from Intact Public Entities (IPE) and Intact Financial Corporation. The FireSmart Homeowner Incentive Program encourages homeowners to sign up for a FireSmart Home Assessment, and to conduct recommended FireSmart practices to mitigate wildfire risks on their property.

Whitecourt's FireSmart Homeowner Incentive

Submitted by Town Of Program was one of 10 recipients selected from a competitive pool of applicants to receive a grant in support of local solutions that reduce the impacts of floods and wildfires on communities and keep people safe.


