

...likely to be reciprocated. I find that when someone is trustworthy, it is way easier to give and receive respect. Even the most ardent opponent can still respect the person that they are competing with; listening to other viewpoints and taking the time for thoughtful consideration. Being respectful is not a sign of weakness, it's a sign of maturity and competency.

- 4. Confidence: A good leader should be confident, not only in themselves, but in other and in the vision or direction they are taking the team. If the leader is confident in their abilities, they will teach others, they will build a team, they will be open to new ideas, and they will empower team members to achieve the goal and objectives.
- 5. Professionalism: In political leadership, from what I've seen over the years, far too many everyday principles have been compromised in the name of politics itself; political theatre and the media have taken away a lot of government professionalism. Carrying out business, communications, and managing the team in a professional manner is no easy task day in and day out. However, when it is done in this manner consistently, the best outcomes are achieved. People can respect a professional leader.
- 6. Competency: It's been said that we can all only rise to the level of our own incompetency. When it comes to elected leaders, well, I'd suggest that there are definite exceptions to the rule, and we all pay dearly for that. Sometimes for generations. I only need to point out a particular black face painting drama

teacher, with little to no real-life experience that has risen into the highest seat of power at the federal level of government. Real world experience and competency counts when it comes to leadership. Having someone tell you what you want to hear rather than what you need to know does not contribute to competency. ...explained it well when it wasn't the best course of action. He has also taken responsibility if things didn't work out, but for him, and thankfully for us, this has been a rare occasion.

His door has always been open, and he has never delayed on an item of importance. He has held his ground on more than one occasion when it would have been easier for him to relent. I trust and respect him not just for what he says but for what he has done, and consistently over the last three years, he has delivered in an extremely challenging environment without any major blowouts. He is a team player and believes

in being less so that others can be more. He believes in empowering his team, expects a high level of performance, and for goals and objectives to be met. I've seen this demonstrated many times.

Ultimately a leadership race is an opportunity for the members to decide who best represents them. As a member I only have one vote as well. As an MLA of the government caucus, I'll need to be able to follow the leader that is chosen and continue to represent my constituency with professionalism and integrity. There is always a matter of compromise required in any organization, as well as a change of direction when "new management" takes control. I believe that the

least amount of churn and disruption to a good organization is optimal, and in the case of a merged organization, the best leaders come from within, not from outside or from the old legacy management

To pick the new leader of the UCP, you need to be an active member before Aug 12. The big vote is on October 2, and party members will be picking the next premier of our province. FAMILIES ACROSS CANADA WILL SEE INCREASE IN CANADA CHILD BENEFIT

The Government of Canada remains committed to supporting families and children as we weather the lasting impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Today, on its 6th anniversary, the Minister of Families, Children and Social Development, Karina Gould, highlighted that the maximum annual Canada Child Benefit will increase to help families cope with the rising cost of living. For the 2022–23 benefit year, families most in need can receive up to \$6,997 per child under the age of six and \$5,903 per child aged six through 17.

The Canada Child Bene-

fit was introduced in 2016 and is a key component of the Government of Canada's Affordability Plan. Since its inception, the benefit has played a key role in reducing the number of children living in poverty and continues to be central to the Government of Canada's efforts to reduce poverty by 50% by 2030, relative to 2015 levels.

The Canada Child Benefit has been indexed since 2018. The amount Canadians receive is based on the adjusted family net income reported on their tax return from the previous year.


Since 2015, the Government of Canada has delivered real improvements to


make life more affordable coast to coast, including making a historic investment of up to \$27 billion over five years to build a Canada-wide early learning and child care system in collaboration with provincial, territorial and Indigenous partners. This investment allows governments to work together toward achieving an average parent fee of \$10-a-day by March 2026 for licensed child care spaces, starting with a 50% fee reduction on average for licensed early learning and child care spaces by the end of 2022.

"Canadian families are worried about the rising costs associated with raising kids, but they are not in this alone. BLUE-GREEN ALGAE (CYANOBACTERIA) BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR LAC STE. ANNE

Submitted by Alberta Health Service

A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in Lac Ste. Anne, located in Lac Ste. Anne County within the North Zone of Alberta Health Services. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

- Avoid all contact with blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.
- Do not swim or wade (or allow your pets to swim or wade) in any areas where blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) is visible.
- Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.
- Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Lac Ste. Anne, at any time. Boiling of

this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock while this advisory is active.

We acknowledge that this lake is of high significance to many people, and we anticipate that it will be visited by large numbers of people next week as part of the Papal visit.

We are working closely with organizers of the visit to ensure that people can reduce their risk if they choose to visit the lake.

Blue-green algae is naturally occurring and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smells musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae or who ingest water containing blue-green algae may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve

in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. Due to this, the advisory will remain in effect for Lac Ste. Anne until further notice.

Please note that areas of Lac Ste. Anne in which the blue-green algae bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this blue-green algae Health Advisory is in place.






