When the Pope returns to Edmonton, eastbound Highway 633 to southbound Highway 43 and eastbound Highway 16 to Edmonton will be closed.

To accommodate the movement of guests to

the event, closures and restricted access to Highways 16 and 633 can be expected on all range roads and township roads west of Highway 43 and east of Highway 765 south of Lac Ste. Anne.

Highway 633 between Highways 757 and 43 will be closed except for buses and local traffic.

Due to the high volume of traffic expected in the area on July 26, travellers can expect delays on Highway 16 west of the City of Edmonton to Highway 757 and should plan ahead and consider alternate routes if possible.

Parkland Respond To Fatal Collision With Pedestrian



The organization can make up with training of other key items, to cover lack of experience or competencies, but you simply cannot sacrifice trustworthiness. ...though it is sometimes the painful thing, and knowing you will take a beating for it...well that takes someone who not only has leadership abilities, but who also has a full helping of integrity.

3. Respect: It is often said that respect is earned not demanded, and when given it is more likely to be reciprocated. I find that when someone is trustworthy, it is way easier to give and receive respect. Even the most ardent opponent can still respect the person that they are competing with; listening to other viewpoints and taking the time for thoughtful consideration. Being respectful is not a sign of weakness, it's a sign of maturity and

competency.

Confidence: 4. А good leader should be confident, not only in themselves, but in other and in the vision or direction they are taking the team. If the leader is confident in their abilities, they will teach others, they will build a team, they will be open to new ideas, and they will empower team members to achieve the goal and objectives.

5. Professionalism: In political leadership, from what I've seen over the years, far too many everyday principles have been compromised in the name of politics itself; political theatre and the media have taken away a lot of government professionalism. Carrying out business, communications, and managing the team in a professional manner is no easy task day in and day out. However, when it is done in this manner consistently, the best outcomes are achieved. People can respect a professional leader.

Competency: It's 6. been said that we can all only rise to the level of our own incompetency. When it comes to elected leaders, well, I'd suggest that there are definite exceptions to the rule, and we all pay dearly for that. Sometimes for generations. I only need to point out a particular black face painting drama teacher, with little to no real-life experience that has risen into the highest seat of power at the federal level of government. Real world experience and competency counts when it comes to leadership. Having someone tell you what you want to hear rather than what you need to know does not contribute to competency. ers can be more. He believes in empowering his team, expects a high level of performance, and for goals and objectives to be met. I've seen this demonstrated many times.

Ultimately a leadership race is an opportunity for the members to decide who best represents them. As a member I only have one vote as well. As an MLA of the government caucus, I'll need to be able to follow the leader that is chosen and continue to represent my constituency with professionalism and integrity. There is always a matter of compromise required in any organization, as well as a change of direction when "new management" takes control. I believe that the least amount of churn and disruption to a good organization is optimal, and in the case of a merged organization, the best leaders come from within, not from outside or from the old legacy management teams.

Warmer weather sends scores of golfers to their favorite courses each and every day. Golf is a challenging pastime, but a few pointers can help golfers hone their short games, long games and everything in between.

Choose the right clubs. There is more to selecting clubs than pulling any old iron out of your golf bag and whacking away. Wind, hazards and obstructions in landing areas should influence your decision of which club to use. Novice golfers may want to rely on their caddies to make club recommendations, and as they become more confident in their abilities they can start to make their own choices.

• Anchor your feet. Anchor your foot behind the ball to drive the ball further. Right-handed players will keep the right foot anchored, and lefties will do the opposite. Do not lift your foot prematurely; otherwise, you can lose power and distance.

• Identify your weaknesses. As with any hobby, identifying those areas that need the most

work can help you become a better golfer. Keep track of each shot you take, and then look at the results to see which areas of your game need the most work.

• Fix your alignment. Align your shots by assessing the target from behind the ball. Then set the clubface behind the golf ball and align it with the target before you enter your stance.

• Use your torso for power. The torso is essential to a solid swing. Prac-

tice rotating from your core to control your backswing and then maintain the same spine angle and posture on the downswing.

• Use the wind. Not every golf game will be played in perfect weather. A good player knows how to make adjustments for the wind depending on the shot. Use the wind to your advantage when you can, and adjust your swing when hitting into the wind.

Become a better

chipper. Many players put so much emphasis on their backswings and putt shots that they fail to devote any practice to chips. All shots are important for golfers trying to shed strokes off of their scores.

• Keep fit. Maintaining or improving your physical strength and overall health can help your golf game. Exercise and eat right, and you will have more endurance on the links.

Job numbers are continuing to soar in Alberta.

According to Statistics Canada's latest labour force survey, Alberta created 2,000 new jobs this past June, marking eight consecutive months of provincial job gains. In total, Alberta has now created over 200,000 jobs since 2021, meaning we have officially undone the damage caused by the Notley NDP's job-killing policies.

Alberta is embarking on another economic boom, one that is more diverse and resilient than any boom we have ever seen before. Despite this, we know families are still struggling with high costs due to inflation right now. That is why your United Conservative government is taking immediate action to fight inflation and make life more affordable for everyday people. Just this past week, we announced that we are extending the electricity rebate for an additional three months. The program will now provide \$50 rebates for a total of six months, starting in July, to over 1.9 million homes, farms, and small businesses. In total, we will provide nearly \$600 million in relief that will be applied directly onto bills, meaning there is no need to apply.

Our government also recently announced that we are extending the fuel tax cut on gasoline, diesel, and marked farm fuel until at least the end of September. We are also reinstating the Fuel Price Contingency Program for school authorities, providing \$8.2 million in fuel cost relief to school boards for the current school year, and additional relief next school year if required.

More will need to be done to help working families cope with rising costs, but these are three immediate actions we are taking to make life more affordable at this important time in our economic recovery.

Alberta is in a strong position to help Alberta families fight inflation because our budget and our economy are in great shape. Alberta ended the 2021-22 fiscal year with a budget surplus of \$3.9 billion, the first surplus our province has seen in seven years. Further, the Alberta Heritage Savings Trust Fund grew to its highest net value in Alberta history earning \$1.95 billion in investments to bring the total value of the fund's investments to \$20 billion.

Unlike the disastrous Notely NDP, who lost hundreds of thousands of jobs and billions of investment dollars, we are maintaining fiscal balance, paying down the debt, investing in the future, and getting Albertans back to work.

We know it is important that all Albertans share in this economic recovery. In addition to leading the country in labour participation rates, Alberta's unemployment rate for women has dropped to 3.5 per cent, the lowest it has been since 2014, when conservatives were last in government. This is great news for our province. Further, several government initiatives are working very well to spur job creation. The Alberta Jobs Now program, for instance, has already helped 12,440 Albertans get back to work.

In every corner of the province and in all sectors of the economy, optimism is growing for the future – and our government is working tirelessly to make sure Albertans are going back to work and participating in this newfound prosperity.

Thank you for supporting Screen Test over the past 30 years. It has been our pleasure bringing screening mammography to you. Together we are saving lives, one community at a time.

Screen Test is a free service provided by Alberta Health Services that offers screening mammograms. Our mobile screening units travel to 120 communities throughout Alberta to provide convenient access to breast cancer screening.

Having regular screening mammograms is the best way to find breast cancer early, before symptoms appear and when treatment may work better.

Who should have a screening mammogram?

If you're 50 to 74, you don't need a referral to have a mammogram. Make screening part of your regular health routine. Plan to have a mammogram every 2 years or as decided by you and your healthcare provider.

If you're 40 to 49 or over 75, discuss the risks and benefits of screening with your healthcare provider. You will need a referral if you're 40 to 49 and it's your first mammogram, or if you're over 75.

Breast density scores are now included in your Screen Test result letter

Breast density is the amount of dense tissue compared to the amount of fat in a person's breasts. It can be harder to find cancer in dense breasts because this tissue appears white on a mammogram, the same colour as many kinds of breast cancer. It's common to have dense breast tissue.

Dense breasts are only one of many risk factors for breast cancer. Other factors, such as age and genetics, have a bigger impact on your overall risk. You can't tell how dense your breasts are by size, look or feel. The only way to find out is by having a mammogram.

INCREASE IN THE OLD AGE SECURITY PENSION FOR SENIORS AGED 75 AND OLDER BEGINS NEXT WEEK

Submitted by Government taken historic measures to of Canada

The Government of Canada is committed to supporting seniors after a lifetime of hard work. That's why the Government of Canada has improve financial security for the oldest seniors.

Today, the Honourable Kamal Khera, Minister of Seniors, and the Honourable Pablo Rodriguez, Minister of Canadian Heritage

and Quebec Lieutenant, announced that the Old Age Security (OAS) pension has permanently increased by 10% for seniors aged 75 and over. This means that full pensioners will get more than \$800 extra over the

first year.

This will be the first permanent increase to the OAS pension since 1973, other than adjustments due to inflation. It will strengthen the financial security of 3.3 million seniors. Eligible seniors will not have to take any action to receive this increase-their payments will be automatically increased.

This increase follows a one-time payment of \$500 that the Government of Canada provided in August 2021 to seniors who were eligible for the OAS pension in June 2021 and born on or before June 30, 1947. The one-time payment was provided to help address the immediate needs of this group of seniors. Both measures were announced in Budget 2021.

These measures are part of broader work to support the financial security of seniors of all ages, including the following:

restoring the age of eligibility for the OAS pension and the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) to 65 from 67;

enhancing the Canada Pension Plan for future retirees;

increasing the GIS for single seniors;

raising the GIS earnings exemption; and

amending the Old Age Security Act to exclude federal pandemic benefits from the calculation of income for GIS/Allowance purposes.


