EVANSBURG INVESTIGATE FATAL COLLISION

On July 24, 2022 at 1:45 p.m., Evansburg RCMP and Alberta RCMP Traffic Services responded to a complaint of a single vehicle motor vehicle

collision at Township Road 533a and Range Road 75a near Evansburg.

Upon arrival, Fire and Emergency Services were extricating the male driver from an automobile that had left the roadway.

The 31-year-old male driver and lone occupant of the vehicle unfortunately succumbed to his injuries on scene.

The collision remains under investigation.

Initial investigation has revealed that a Toyota Corolla which was travelling on Range Road 33 failed to stop at a stop sign and collided with a Honda Civic which was travelling westbound on Highway 16. The two occupants of the Toyota, an 89-year-old female from Wabamum and a 26-year-old male from Spruce Grove, were declared deceased at the scene. Two female occupants in the Honda were transported to hospital with unknown injuries.







Submitted by Alberta Health Service

Lac Ste. Anne County and Parkland County – A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Isle Lake. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

• Avoid all contact with blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

• Do not swim or wade (or allow your pets to swim or wade) in any areas where blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) is visible.

• Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

• Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Isle Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by bluegreen algae. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae is naturally occurring, and

often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, ...


...blue-green algae can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/ or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae or who ingest water containing blue-green algae may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Isle Lake, until further notice. Please note that areas of Isle Lake in which the blue-green algae bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this blue-green algae Health Advisory is in place.

If you suspect a problem related to blue-green algae or if you require further information on health concerns and blue-green algae, please call Health Link at 811. Additional information is also available online, at www.ahs.ca/bga.
