

During negotiations towards a reconciliation agreement to advance their visions of greater self-determination, support for housing was identified as a priority for the eight Métis settlements of Alberta that comprise the Metis Settlements General Council.

Today, the Honourable Marc Miller, Minister of Crown–Indigenous Relations, joined President Herb Lehr of the Metis Settlements General Council to announce an investment of \$29 million over seven years towards housing priorities for Métis settlements of Alberta.

Access to safe and affordable

housing is critical to improving health and social outcomes for Indigenous Peoples and ensuring a strong future for their communities and children. This investment is part of \$190 million from Budget 2022 for Métis to address urgent housing needs, including specific funds for Métis institutions and governments in Canada.

COUNTY CROP SURVEILLANCE PROGRAM On the lookout for diseases

and pests common to regional crops

Agricultural Services staff will be conducting seasonal crop surveillance activities across the County. Landowners are advised that inspectors are likely to enter fields unannounced due to time constraints and the sheer area of agricultural land that needs to be covered.

Rest assured that County crop survey crews will exercise extreme care when entering fields to minimize any potential spread of crop issues from field to field. Precautions include the use of disposable boots and/or disinfection with a bleach solution prior to entering any field.

BLUE-GREEN ALGAE ADVISORY IN PLACE FOR COUNTY LAKES

Lac La Nonne, Lac Ste. Anne, Isle Lake and Paddle River Dam Reservoir AHS advises to avoid all contact with blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible. Do not swim or wade, or allow your pets to swim or wade in any areas where blue-green algae is visible. Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings to your pets. Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings.

Whitecourt Town Council has adopted the Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework (ICF) with Woodlands County.

The Government of Alberta requires all municipalities that share borders to adopt an ICF to formalize the coordination of service delivery and optimize resources for citizens. In 2021, the municipalities agreed to proceed with voluntary arbitration to reach an agreement on the ICF, and earlier this year the arbitrator's decision was released. Both municipalities are to adopt the agreement by August 4, 2022 to meet provincial legislative requirements.

A Jumbo Jumper will be installed at Rotary Park thanks to sponsorship from Energy Transfer Canada. The Jumbo Jumper, which is filled with air and acts like a trampoline, is a seasonal feature that will provide fun and entertainment for people of all ages.

Preferred Property Management (4603 52 Avenue) and Divine Spa & Wellness Centre (5012 52 Avenue) have been awarded funding through the Vitalization Grant Program. The Vitalization Grant Program offers businesses located in the downtown area and along the Highway 43 corridor up to \$10,000 to enhance their business or property to meet the Town's architectural theme of stone and wood.

Whitecourt Town Council received a quarterly financial report and overview of the impact of COVID-19 at the July 18 Regular Meeting.



HELPING EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATORS SUPPORT KIDS

Submitted by Government of Alberta

The governments of Alberta and Canada are helping more than 3,300 educators sharpen their skills through free early childhood brain science and development training.

Funding of \$5.2 million is being provided to the Association of Early Child-hood Educators of Alberta (AECEA) and the Alberta Resource Centre for Quality Enhancement (ARCQE) that will give early childhood educators opportunities to enhance their understanding of early childhood brain science and childhood development. These organizations will use the funding to train educators and reimburse them for their training time.

"Skilled professionals are essential to supporting kids' learning and development in their early years. Time is often a barrier for educators to access further training, which is why Alberta's government is allocating this funding to help pay these educators while they enhance their skills and knowledge. This will ensure the next generation of kids is equipped with the tools they need to become tomorrow's leaders."



Of the \$5.2 million, \$3.6 million is being used to give about 3.000 educators access to the Brain Story Certification course offered through the Alberta Family Wellness Initiative. Educators will also have an opportunity to participate in theory-to-practice sessions, helping transfer knowledge from the course to daily practice.

"Alberta is a global leader in translating the science of brain development into positive life outcomes for citizens, families and communities. This grant makes

this crucial body of knowledge available to early educators, ensuring they have the tools they need to help children grow into resilient adults with good mental and physical health."



Nancy Mannix, founder, Palix Foundation & Alberta Family Wellness Initiative

"Early childhood educators are essential to the delivery of high-quality learning and child care and they need to be well-educated, supported and remunerated to undertake that work. We are excited to provide educators with an opportunity for continued professional learning on the scientific underpinnings of early brain development and the important role educators play in a child's early years."

"Early child educators/ caregivers who understand the science of brain development and the importance of nurturing relationships are better poised to have a positive impact on children in their care. By developing knowledge, skills and abilities regarding this science, we can optimize outcomes for our children."

The remaining \$1.6 million will help up to 350 early childhood educators access professional development and training on childhood development. This will enhance quality programming in early learning child-care settings, particularly when it comes to assessing a child's development and providing the appropriate supports.

"Recognizing that the first five years of a child's life is the most formative period of development, ARC-QE looks forward to implementing provincewide practice strategies focused on enriching educator capacity and program quality. Through access to specialized training and resources, early childhood educators will be further supported in helping children reach their full potential."

The \$5.2-million funding is provided through the one-time investment of \$56 million in 2021-2022 to support the early childhood workforce under the made-in-Alberta child-care agreement with the federal government. The early childhood workforce funding complements and supports the Canada-wide early learning and child-care vision.

PARKLAND INVESTIGATE SEXUAL ASSAULT INVOLVING MASSAGE THERAPIST

On July 22, 2022, Parkland RCMP received a report of a sexual assault that occurred while the victim was receiving a massage at a massage therapy business in Spruce Grove. As a result of the investigation, Parkland RCMP have charged Jordan Kevin Alex Mcnaughton (26), of Edmonton, with Sexual Assault.

Mcnaughton has been released from police custody with conditions and is set to appear on August 31, 2022, at Stoney Plain Provincial Court. As this matter is now before the courts, no further details surrounding these charges can be provided.

Parkland RCMP believe that there may be additional victims and encourage those individuals to come forward.





DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN BE PAR FOR THE COURSE

A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries:

Side bending stretch

1. Stand with feet shoulder-width apart.

2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.

3. Slowly bend to one

side, without rotating, until you feel a stretch in the side of your back.

4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

Shoulder stretch

1. Hold the shaft of a golf club vertically be-

hind your back.

2. Gently pull the club up with your top hand until you feel a slight stretch in the shoulder of your lower arm. Hold for 15 seconds.

3. Gently pull the club down with your bottom

hand until you feel a stretch in the top shoulder and arm.

4. Hold for 15 seconds.5. Reverse hand positions and repeat.

APPROXIMATELY \$1.4 BILLION IN UNCASHED CHEQUES IS SITTING IN THE CANADA REVENUE AGENCY'S COFFERS

The Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) has approximately \$1.4 billion in cheques that have gone uncashed over the years. As of May 2022, there were an estimated 8.9 million uncashed cheques with the CRA and we want to make sure this money ends up where it belongs. In taxpayers' pockets!

Each year, the (CRA) issues millions of payments in the form of refunds and benefits. These payments are issued by either direct deposit or by cheque. Over time, payments can remain uncashed for various reasons, such as the taxpayer misplacing the cheque or even a change of address which did not allow for delivery.

The CRA will be notifying some recipients of the Canada child benefit and related Provincial/Territorial programs, GST/HST Credit and Alberta Energy Tax Refund (AETR) recipients of any uncashed cheques they may have by email notification. Approximately 25,000 e-notifications will be issued in August and another 25,000 in November 2022, followed by the next 25,000 in May 2023.

Since the CRA launched this initiative in February 2020, approximately two million uncashed cheques valued at \$802 million were redeemed by Canadians between February 10, 2020, and May 31, 2022.

In 2020, the CRA introduced a feature where taxpayers can view their uncashed cheques and collect unclaimed benefit and credit payments that belong to them. Through My Account, Canadians can check to see if they have an uncashed cheque with the CRA, some dating as far back as 1998. As government cheques never expire or stale date, the CRA cannot void the original cheque and re-issue a new one unless requested by the taxpayer. These upcoming e-notifications are to encourage taxpayers to cash any cheques they have in their possession. The average amount per uncashed cheque is \$158. It can pay to

sign up for the CRA's online services!

Any taxpayer, regardless of whether they receive a notification, can check if they have a cheque by logging into My Account. Taxpayers will see an option under "related services" entitled "uncashed cheques." From here, they will be able to easily check if they have a CRA cheque, uncashed for six months or more. Then, all they have to do is complete and securely submit the displayed form online in My Account. Through the Represent a Client Service, representatives can also view uncashed cheques on behalf of their clients.

IS THIS JUST POLITICS?

Instead of targeting gangs and illegally smuggled firearms, Justin Trudeau has introduced a firearm buyback program that punishes lawful firearms owners. The RFI was posted July 14 and amended on July 29 with a closing date of August 17 for those interested in helping with the BBP or buyback program. More than two years after the Trudeau government announced this program, they still don't have the basic structure, despite having already spent more than \$8.8 million on it.

As no buyback program exists, how does this government even put out this price list? Millions have been spent since May 1, 2020, and still nothing has happened.

The RCMP has said they can't oversee this program in terms

of collecting firearms. Canada Post has also reportedly told the government that it can't be the main collection point for hundreds of thousands of firearms, either.


