Do not wait to 1. make a call! The sooner police are aware or notified of a missing person, the sooner a search can begin.

2. You can report a missing person from

anywhere. You do not have to wait to get back home - call the police from wherever you are, report what you know, and ask for help.

3. Provide as much detail as you can.

A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Wabamun Lake, located within the Edmonton Zone of Alberta Health

Submitted by Alberta Services. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

> Avoid all contact with blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) blooms.

If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

It is helpful for the investigation to have as much detail as possible, including recent photos and description and activity of the person.

4. Photos are imperative. Provide investigators with recent photos that are ideally straight-on profile, without filters that could obscure or alter appearance. Alternatively, provide links to social media accounts where photos can be found.

To report a missing person, call 911, walk into your closest police station or call a complaint line.

If you have travel plans, ensure that you provide your written itinerary including destination, mode of transportation and contact information to a loved one, friend or neighbor. It is an important safety practice that someone is aware of your location and plans when you are away from your regular routines. The safety of citizens is a priority for the Alberta RCMP.

Blue-Green Algae (Cyanobacteria) Bloom Advisory Issued For Wabamun Lake

...is visible.

• Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

• Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Wabamun Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae is naturally occurring and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smells musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae or who ingest water containing blue-green algae may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. Due to this, the advisory will remain in effect for Wabamun Lake until further notice. Please note that areas of Wabamun Lake in which the blue-green algae bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even

while this blue-green algae Health Advisory is in place.

ALBERTA OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING IN SMOKY LAKE

Alberta RCMP have laid charges following an investigation into the events on Aug. 8, 2022. On Aug. 7, 2022, Saddle Lake RCMP received a report of a domestic disturbance between two unknown individuals. After an investigation, RCMP were able to identify the possible involved parties who were also persons of interest in recent criminal investigations.

On Aug. 20, 2022, a 21-yearold male, a resident of Enoch Cree Nation, was charged with:

- Flight from police
- Dangerous driving Possession of a

weapon contrary to order (x3) • Unauthorized possession of firearm

- Robbery with a firearm
 - Theft over \$5000
 - Pointing a firearm

(x2) Following a judicial hearing,

the 21-year-old-male was re-

manded into custody to speak to bail and is scheduled to attend St. Paul Provincial Court on Sept. 1, 2022.

As this matter is now before the courts, the Alberta RCMP are not able to provide further details.



Alberta's government has asked leaders of Indigenous


organizations to be on a consultation panel, create an expression of interest, review submissions and choose one or more artists to design the memorial.

Submitted by Government of Alberta

The upcoming natural gas rebate will support more than 1.6 million homes, farms and businesses facing high heating bills next winter.

In Budget 2022, Alberta's government committed to ensuring natural gas consumers are protected from European-style price spikes next fall and winter. Now, the government is providing additional information on the rebates, including clarity for natural gas customers who are not connected to the distribution system and customers who use other heating fuels, such as propane, kerosene or heating oils, all of which will also be eligible for rebates.

The rebates will provide critical support and cost certainty to at least 1.6 million homes, farms and businesses, including those in rural and remote areas, from Oct. 1, 2022, through March 31, 2023.

"We are stepping up to provide more and more relief for Albertans as prices remain high. This rebate will provide price protection for millions of Albertans using natural gas, kerosene, propane and other fuels next winter. It will help families, farms and businesses manage high heating costs in the upcoming winter to keep life affordable in Alberta."

Dale Nally, Associate Minister of Natural Gas and Electricity

Natural gas rebate program Starting Oct. 1, all consumers connected to the natural gas distribution system and paying a bill directly to a natural gas retailer with less than 2,500 gigajoules (GJ) of annual natural gas consumption will be eligible for government-provided rebates, which will appear directly on bills. No application will be necessary to receive the rebates if you are connected to the natural gas distribution system.

Under this rebate program, if the monthly default natural gas rate from the regulated utility providers (ATCO Gas North, ATCO Gas South and Apex Utilities) goes above \$6.50 per GJ, the government will provide rebates to all consumers covering the difference between \$6.50 and the regulated rate, on a consumption basis. For example, if any of the regulated rates go to \$7.50 per GJ for the month of November, then all consumers would receive a...





....rebate on their bill covering \$1 for every GJ used during the month of November.

These rebates will appear directly on eligible bills – protecting consumers on both regulated and competitive plans like fixed rate contracts.

Other heating fuels also

qualify for rebates

Eligible consumers not on the natural gas distribution system or consumers using the annual equivalent of 2,500 GJ or less in other heating fuels (such as propane, kerosene and heating oil), will also be eligible and can apply directly for their rebates through a separate application system.

For example, if one of the default regulated rates goes to \$7.50 for the month of November and an eligible consumer with a natural gas storage tank on their property purchases the equivalent of 200 GJ, that consumer can apply for a \$1 per GJ rebate for that amount

of fuel. Specific eligibility limits for each fuel type are listed on alberta.ca.

The rebate for these heating fuels will be calculated in the same method, using a standardized equation to determine the consumption equivalency for the alternative fuel. Information on how to apply will be released before the Oct. 1 start date.

To keep Albertans informed about when they can expect rebates to be paid, regular updates on the default rate will be posted on alberta.ca for the duration of the rebate program. In Alberta, the default regulated rates are set for the entire month and do not fluctuate throughout the month. If a regulated rate in Alberta is set above \$6.50 per GJ, the rebates will go into effect for all eligible consumers.

Delivering relief for Albertans

This rebate is another component of the Alberta government's work to help support consumers dealing with high costs of living. It follows an electricity rebate program implemented this summer and a gas tax repeal that will be in place until at least September.

With the electricity rebate reaching bills in July, August and September, and the natural gas rebate starting in October, the Government of Alberta will provide continuous monthly relief for millions of Albertans until March 31, 2023.

Many club manufacturers now offer adjustable drivers and other clubs. According to an informal poll on Golf.com, 34 percent of the 2,337 respondents owned an adjustable driver by the end of 2011. The ability to upgrade shafts has also become popular as golfers respond to what the pros are doing.
